CCGS Member Family History: Beverly Latham Lenoir

Beverly Latham Lenoir was born in Tyler, Texas on August 18, 1950 and grew up there. She lived in Killeen, Texas from 1972 to 1980 and in Abilene, Texas from 1980 to 2010. In 2010, she and her husband moved to Wylie, Texas, in Collin County. She is a fifth generation Texan and through each of her eight great-grandparent surnames, she is the fifth generation to live at least part of their lives in Collin County (sixth in three lines). Her daughter, Erin Lenoir Morales and granddaughters Evalina and Elena, are sixth and seventh generations to have lived part of their lives in Collin County. Beverly's parents, Sid Latham Jr. and Charlene Rike, were born and grew up in Farmersville, Texas, and her four grandparents, Sid Latham Sr. and Halla V Terry, and Charles J. Rike and Thelma Frazier, were all born and lived their lives in Collin County.

Those great-grandparent surnames are:

Copeland – Ellen Elvira (Bird) Copeland was born in Celeste, Hunt Co, TX, but the 1900 census for Collin Co, TX, Precinct 8, District 23, showed Ellen as a 16 year-old child of James C. Copeland, born in Georgia, and Fannie S. Young, born in Texas.

Frazier – John Jackson Frazier was born to Charles Frazier and Mary J. Guinn in 1877 in Callis, Collin Co, TX. John's parents are buried in Blue Ridge, Collin Co, TX, and Mary Jane's parents, Charles Guinn and Elizabeth Husbands, are also buried in Blue Ridge.

Latham – Leroy Latham was born in Tennessee to Moses Latham and Lovina Gibson in 1870, but Leroy and Aurora Smith married in 1893 in Collin Co, TX. In addition, the 1910 census for Collin Co showed Leroy's mother living with them, and Leroy's father Moses and grandfather John Nathaniel are both buried in Farmersville, Collin Co, TX.

Manning – Bettie Manning Frazier was born to Wiley Manning and Bettie Atkinson in 1879 in Pike, Collin Co, TX.

Odom – Orela Blanche Odom was born in Albany, GA, but her father, G.W. Odom, was shown in the 1880 census in Collin Co, Precinct 2 and was teaching school. Orela Blanche moved to Collin Co and married George W. Rike in 1885.

Rike – George William Rike was born to Robert A. Rike and Maria Seitz in 1857 in Farmersville, Collin Co, TX.

Smith – Aurora Smith was born in Alabama, but she and Leroy Latham married in 1893 in Collin Co, TX. Her mother, Sarah Margaret Gilbert, is buried in Farmersville, Collin Co, TX.

Terry – Robert Brown Terry was born in Tennessee in 1880, but the 1900 census for Collin Co, TX, Precinct 8, District 24, showed that the family had moved to Texas, with Robert Brown still living at home with parents Thomas W. Terry and Eliza Jane White.

Deep and Wide Roots in Collin County



Beverly Ann Latham Lenoir was born in Tyler, Smith Co, Texas, on August 18, 1950. In 2010, she and her husband, Kenneth Lenoir, moved to Wylie, Collin Co, Texas. During the pandemic stay-at-home weeks of 2020, she compiled the factual information about her eight great-grandparents, initially for her own daughters and grandchildren, into one document for each of the four couples. She realized that she was the fifth generation (sixth in a couple of lines) of all eight of her great-grandparent lines to live at least part of their lives in Collin County, Texas! At that point, she decided this family information

might be interesting to a wider audience in Collin County. Beverly has been a member of Collin County Genealogical Society since 2015 and has served as Recording Secretary and Vice President for Programs in CCGS.



Beverly's parents were Thelma Charlene Rike, born 8 Apr 1928 in Farmersville, Collin Co, TX, and died 2 Feb 2007 in Ben Wheeler, Van Zandt Co, TX; and Sid Latham, Jr., born 13 Jul 1926 in Farmersville, Collin Co, TX, and died 4 Dec 2010 in Longview, Gregg Co, TX. They married on 6 Apr 1947 in Farmersville, TX. They lived much of their adult lives in Tyler, Smith Co, TX.





Charlene Rike's parents were Charles Jesse Rike, born 15 Nov 1896 in Farmersville, Collin Co, TX, and died 18 Feb 1978 in McKinney, Collin Co, TX; and Sula Thelma Frazier, born 2 Sep 1901 in Pike, Collin Co, TX, and died 15 Jul 1987 in Ft. Worth, Tarrant Co, TX. They married on 25 Dec 1924 in Collin Co, TX. Charles J. Rike's parents were George William Rike and Orela Blanche Odom. Thelma Frazier's parents were John Jackson Frazier and Bettie Manning.

Sid Latham Jr's parents were Sid Latham, born 22 Jul 1899 in Collin Co, TX, and died 10 Jul 1981 in Farmersville, Collin Co, TX; and Halla V Terry, born 25 Mar 1905 in Blue Ridge, Collin Co, TX, and died 9 Aug 1974 in McKinney, Collin Co, TX. They married in 1922 in Collin Co, TX. Sid Latham Sr's parents were LeRoy Latham and Aurora Smith. Halla V Terry's parents were Robert Brown Terry and Ellen Elvira (Bird) Copeland.



Beverly Lenoir's great-grandparents – Rike, Odom, Frazier, Manning, Latham, Smith, Terry, and Copeland are discussed in detail in the following articles, along with her two sets of grandparents – Latham, Terry, Rike and Frazier. Only factual information from census data, birth and death certificates, draft registrations, etc. are included, for the most part. However, family pictures are included that should make the reading more interesting!

Sid William Latham and Halla V Terry Latham

Grandparents of Beverly Latham Lenoir

Sid Latham

b. 22 Jul 1899, Collin Co, TX

d 10 Jul 1981, Farmersville, Collin Co, TX

m. Halla V Terry, 30 Sep 1922, Collin Co, TX



Sid first appeared in the 1900 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2, District 7) which showed his parents Leroy and Aurora with two little boys – Clyde, 3, born April 1897 and Sid(ney), 10 months, born July 1899 in Texas. Moses and Lovena Latham, Leroy's parents, lived with them. Leroy was born in TN, and Aurora was born in AL.



The 1910 census (Farmersville, Collin Co, TX District 11) showed Sid Wm., age 10, along with one older brother Clyde and younger brothers Silbie, Chester, and Roy E(lliot), and one sister, Lillian L(ovena). Lovena A. Latham, the children's grandmother, 75, born in KY, also lived with them. Clyde and Sid were listed as farmers – Sid at age 10!

Sid had another younger brother in the 1920 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2, District 14): Jimmie, 7; Sid, 20, and two brothers were all listed as laborers on a home farm. Sid earned wages and was able to read and write. Lovena was no longer listed in the household.

By the time of the 1930 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2, District 43-

12), Sid had married Halla V (she was 17 when they married) and they had two children: Billie F(rances), 5 years and 6 months, and Sid Jr., 3 years and 8 months. The family lived on Maple Street in Farmersville and Sid was the proprietor of a café.



In 1940, the census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 43-15) showed that Sid was 40 and had completed 8th grade. The previous week, he had worked 50 hours. He was employed as a service man at the ice plant. He worked 52 weeks in 1939 and his income was \$1,080. Halla V was 35 and had finished 3 years of high school. The three oldest children were in school: Billie, 15, had finished 3 years of high school; Sid Jr., 13, had finished 8th grade, and Carolyn, 6, had finished 1st grade. Terry, the youngest boy, was 1.

The Collin County Marriage Index shows that Sid Latham and Halla V Terry married in 1922 in Collin County, Texas, and the Texas Select County Marriage Records, 1837-2015, indicated a marriage date of 1922.

However, their gravestone shows their marriage date as September 30, 1922. Sid's WWI draft registration was dated 12 September 1918 when he was 19. His occupation was farmer and his nearest relative was L.R. Latham. There was a mark where his middle name would have been, and it indicated he was white, native born, of medium height, with slender build, grey eyes, and light hair. His WWII draft registration showed no

middle name, age 42, telephone number 379, with Mrs. Halla V Latham

shows Sid Latham Jr. holding daughter Beverly Latham, Sid Sr. in the middle, and LeRoy Latham on the right. was employed by Community Public Service on S. Washington in Farmersville.

Sid's death certificate listed his birth as 7-22-1899 in Texas and his death on 7-10-1981 at Hinton Nursing Home in Farmersville. He was widowed, was not in the armed forces, and retired from the Ice Company. His parents were LeRoy Latham and Aurora Smith. He died of respiratory failure and cardiac arrest due to arteriosclerosis, generalized. He was buried on 7-12-1981 in the IOOF Cemetery in Farmersville, and the funeral home used was Fielder-Baker of Farmersville with J.R. Bratcher as director. The doctor who signed was Jack L. Webb, M.D., and Sid Latham, Jr. provided the information on the death certificate. [Note by Sid's granddaughter Beverly Latham Lenoir: some of the handwriting on the death certificate belonged to Charlene Latham, wife of Sid Jr. and mother of Beverly Lenoir].

An obituary in the Tyler Morning Telegraph on July 11, 1981 indicated that Sid Latham was survived by 2 sons, 2 daughters, one sister Lillian Whitaker of Austin, and one brother Elliott of Greenville, 8 granddaughters, and 5 greatgrandchildren. He was a member of First Baptist Church of Farmersville.

Halla V's parents were Robert Brown Terry and Ellen Elvira (Bird) Copeland. She was the older of two daughters. The 1910 census (Texas, Collin County, Justice Precinct 8, District 30) listed Halla V as a five-year old, and her sister Nattie (Natalie) is 3/12. Both were born in Texas. Father R.B. was born in Tennessee and mother Bird was born in Texas. In the 1920 census, Halla V was 14 and Nat was 10. At the time of the 1930 census, she was 25.

She was a housewife, in the domestic industry. Born March 25, 1905, she died August 9, 1974. Her father was Robert Brown Terry and her mother was Ellen E. Copeland. She died from a cerebral vascular accident and respiratory failure. The death certificate was signed by Sid Latham Jr. The doctor was Jack Webb, M.D. of 106 Johnson St., Farmersville. She was buried in the IOOF Cemetery in Farmersville. The funeral home was Fielder-Baker and the director was B. C. Fielder. [The cause of death was written in Charlene Latham's handwriting.]

Charles Jesse Rike and Thelma Frazier Rike

Grandparents of Beverly Latham Lenoir

Charles Jesse Rike

b. 15 Nov 1896, Farmersville, Collin Co, TX

d. 18 Feb 1978, McKinney, Collin Co, TX

m. Sula Thelma Frazier, Collin Co, TX

Charlie first appeared in the 1900 census (Farmersville, Collin Co, TX, District 10) which showed his parents George, 42 and born in Texas, and Orela B., 34 and born in Georgia, with four sons – Zeb, 14; George C., 12; Maurice O., 8; and Charles J., 3, all born in Texas. Sallie, George's sister, was 27, single, and a seamstress and lived with them. George C. and Zeb were in school, but even Charles was listed as able to read, write, and speak English. George was a druggist. His parents were born in North Carolina.



The 1910 census (Farmersville, Collin Co, TX District 13) showed George as a retail merchant in the drug industry. He owned their home (free) and lived in a house rather than on a farm. Maurice O., 18, and Charles, 13, were still at home.

The Rike family lived on Bois d'Arc St. in the 1920 census (Farmersville, Collin Co, TX, District 15). Only Charles was still at home and was listed as an assistant at the Post Office. George was the proprietor of a drug store.





By the time of the 1930 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2, District 12), Charley, now 33, had married Thelma, 28, and they lived on Hill St. Charley was a salesman at a drug store and earned a wage. Their daughter, Charlene, was 1 11/12.



In 1940, the census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 43-18) showed that Charlie, 44, and Thelma, 40, lived in the same house as in 1935. Charlie had completed a fourth year in college, was a pharmacist at Rike Drug Store, and was an employer who worked 52 weeks in 1939. His income was \$1200, and he had income from other sources. Daughter Charlene was 12 and had completed 6th grade, Zeb was 3, and Betty Blanche was 10/12.

The Collin County Marriage Index shows Chas. J. Rike and Thelma Frazier married in 1924. Their marriage license showed the date as December 25, 1924.



Charlie's WWI draft registration was dated June 5, 1918. It listed Chas. Jesse Rike as a native of the U.S., with gray eyes and brown hair, and his father's birthplace was Farmersville, Texas, USA. The form was signed by Chas. J. Rike and by Joe Aston, Registrar. Charlie's employer was the USPO, Farmersville. His nearest relative was Geo. W. Rike, father. His WWII draft registration listed Charlie's place of residence as McKinney Rd. He was 45 years old. *(Therefore, the*



date was c. 1941.) His address was PO Box 287, and his telephone was 242. He was born in Farmersville, Texas on November 15, 1896 and Mrs. Thelma Rike was listed as the person who would always know his address. He was self-employed at Rikes Drug Store. It was signed by Chas. J. Rike.

Charlie's death certificate showed that he was DOA at Collin Memorial Hospital in McKinney, Collin Co, TX. He died February 18, 1978 at age 82 *(he was actually still 81 at the time of his death)*. His usual residence was Candy Street, Farmersville, Collin Co, TX. He was a retired druggist who was born in Farmersville, Texas. His father was George William Rike, and his mother was Orela Blanch Odom. The certificate was signed by Charlene Latham, who listed his cause of death as coronary occlusion due to heart disease, arteriosclerotic, acute, for 2 years. His doctor was Jack Webb, M.D. of 106 Johnson St. He was buried February 19, 1978 in the IOOF Cemetery by Fielder-Baker Inc., J.R. Bratcher, undertaker.

Sula Thelma Frazier Rike


b. 2 Sep 1901, Blue Ridge, Collin Co, TX

d. 15 Jul 1987, Ft. Worth, Tarrant Co, TX

Thelma's parents were John Jackson Frazier and Bettie Manning. The 1910 census (Texas, Collin County, Justice Precinct 8, District 29) listed Thelma as an 8 year old, and she had an older sister Hazel, who was 14, and younger sister Ava, 3, and Harold, 1. John was a miller at a grist mill. Both John and Bettie were born in Texas, but their parents had been born in Georgia.

By the time of the 1920 census (Farmersville, Collin Co., Texas, District 15) there was a new little brother, Kenneth D, who was 4. Also at home were John, 42; Bettie, 40; Thelma, 18; Ava, 13; and Harold, 11. John was a real estate agent. Thelma was a public school teacher.





The 1930 census (Farmersville, Collin Co., Texas, District 12) listed Charlie and Thelma's home value at 15. It was not a farm. Thelma was 28 and had no occupation (?!) and daughter Charlene was almost 2 (1 11/12).

The 1940 census (Other places, Collin Co., TX, District 43-18) listed Thelma as having completed the 3rd year of college, and at 40 years old, had 2 preschoolers and 1 teenager.



Thelma's death certificate indicated that she was white, not of Spanish origin, 85, and widowed. She had not served in the armed forces. She died in Ft. Worth, Tarrant Co, Texas. Her father was John Jackson Frazier and mother was Betty Manning. The certificate was signed by Betty Robinson. Thelma was buried in the IOOF Cemetery in Farmersville on July 17, 1987. Dr. Byan Rutledge , M.D., signed as the doctor. The funeral home was Fielder-Baker and J.R. Bratcher was the funeral director.

Leroy Latham

b. 22 Sep 1870, TN

- d. 2 Feb 1956, Farmersville, Collin Co, TX
- m. Aurora Smith, 1893, Collin Co, TX







The 1900 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2, District 7) showed Leroy and Aurora with two little boys – Clyde, 3, born April 1897 and Sidney, 10 months, born July 1899.

Leroy was a farmer, his parents were born in TN and KY, and he was 29 at the time of the census. Aurora's parents were born in TN and AL (according to the census, but her father was actually born in SC), and she was 25. Both Leroy and Aurora could read, write, and speak English. Their house was rented.

The 1910 census (Farmersville, Collin Co, TX District 11) showed 6 children: Clyde, 12; Sid Wm., 10; Silbie, 7; Chester, 6; Lillian L., 3; and Roy E(lliot), newborn. Lovena A. Latham, Leroy's mother, 75, born in KY, also lived with them. Her parents were born in VA. Clyde and Sid were listed as farmers! The census indicated that Leroy was an employer and owned his home – free, not mortgaged.

The 1920 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2, District 14) listed a new child, Jimmie, 7. Clyde, 22; Sid, 20; and Silbie, 18 were all listed as laborers on a home farm. Clyde and Sid earned wages. Lovena was no longer listed in the household.

The 1930 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2, District 15) indicated Elliot, 18; Jimmie, 16; and Lillian, 21 were still at home. Leroy was not a veteran.

The 1940 census (Collin Co, TX, Precinct 2) showed:



Leroy, 69, was a farmer, widowed, finished fourth grade, and worked 25 hours the week before the census was taken.

Jimmy, 26, was constable for J.P. 2 and had \$600 in income plus income from other sources. He finished 1 year of high school.

Clyde, 42, was a farm laborer with \$100 in income. He was widowed and finished 7th grade.

Henry (Clyde), 2, was Clyde's son and grandson of Leroy.

Leroy Latham and Aurora Smith married in 1893 in Collin County, TX. Leroy died on February 2, 1956 at 85. His death certificate lists his father as Mose Latham and his mother as Lovena Ann Gibson. Son Elliot signed the death certificate. He died of pneumonia, hypostatic (7 days). Antecedent causes were cerebrovascular accident, hemorrhage (2 months). These were due to arteriosclerosis, generalized. The doctor who signed was Jack L. Webb, M.D. He was buried in the IOOF Cemetery in Farmersville, TX. B. C. Fielder was the funeral director.

These pictures show a four-generation picture with Leroy, Sid (Leroy's second son), Sid Jr., and Beverly Latham. The other picture is of Leroy holding Beverly and her cousin Dianne Dyer (Sid Jr.'s sister Billie's daughter). Beverly's mother, Charlene Rike Latham, said she was scared that he was going to drop those two babies! The children in the picture are Carla and Larry Jones, second cousins of Beverly and Dianne.





Aurora Smith Latham

b. 27 Jul 1876, TN

d. 16 Aug 1938, Farmersville, Collin Co, TX

Aurora's parents were William Smith and Margaret Gilbert Smith. She was one of four

daughters as shown in the picture. She is on the left, standing.

The 1880 census (Limestone Co AL, Beat #5, page 19) listed Aurora as the oldest daughter of the family and age 6 at the time. William 28, was born in TN and was a farmer. Margaret (Sarah M.) 25, was born in AL and was keeping house. In addition to Aurora, Ella was 3 and Cora was 3 months old. Gilbert Brooks, 24, was a black man listed as a servant who "works on farm." He was born in AL and his parents were born in SC and AL.



Aurora died 16 Aug 1938 in Collin Co TX at age 64. Her death certificate listed her as a retired housewife whose parents were W. J. Smith and Margaret Gilbert, both born in TN. Her residence was Route 2, Farmersville, TX and she had lived there for 35 years. The informant was Lillian Latham, her daughter. Cause of death was myocarditis, chronic, and hypertension. Also listed was acute pulmonary edema. She was buried in Farmersville, TX by the Farmersville Funeral Home, undertaker G. E. Bolger.

m. Orela Blanche Odom, 29 Mar 1885, Collin Co, TX

The 1860 census (Texas, Collin Co, Precinct 8, page 189) showed George, the youngest in the family at that time and one of four children to have been born in

Texas. His parents were Robert A. Reich, 38, a farmer, and Maria, 41, both born in North Carolina. Robert's real estate value was listed as \$2980 and his personal estate as \$1500 (total equivalent in purchasing power to about \$139,000 in 2020).

Maria had kept a diary on their trip from NC to TX, and the first three children travelled with them: Henry A, now 15; John S., now 13; and Lewis J., now 11; all born in NC. Born in TX were Julia S., 8; Owen A., 6; Robert E., 4; and George W., 2. H.P. Horton, 28, was a school teacher living with them. Henry down through Owen were attending school.

Robert's real estate was valued at \$12,000 and personal estate at \$1,000 (~\$254,000 in 2020) by the 1870 census (Texas, Collin Co, Precinct 2, page 29). He was then married to Martha, who was keeping house and was also born in NC. Children at home were Julia, 18; Owen, 16; Robert, 14; George, 12; and Mary, 9. John Rike, 23, is married to Elisabeth, 17, who was born in TX. Robert, John, and Henry lived in adjacent houses. Henry, 25, was married to Mary, 18, and they had a baby, 9/12, named Julia. Henry was a farmer with real estate valued at \$4,500 and personal estate of \$800. Julia, daughter of R.A. Rike, was at home. Owen, Robert, and George were at school.

By the time of the 1880 census (Texas, Collin Co, Precinct 2, Enumeration District 21, page 1) R.A. was 58 and Martha was 39. Living at home were George, 22, a farm laborer; along with Ema, 9; Sallie, 7; and Mattie, 3/12.

The 1900 census (Texas, Collin Co, Farmersville, Enumeration District 10, Sheet 5), showed that George, 42, born Dec 1857, was married to Orela B., 34, born May 1866 and they had four sons: Zeb, 14; George C., 12; Maurice O., 8; and Charles J., 3. In addition, George's sister, Sallie, 27, a seamstress, lived with them. George was a druggist whose parents were both born in NC, and Orela's parents were born in GA, as was she.

In the 1910 census (Texas, Collin Co, Part of Precinct 2, Farmersville, Enumeration District 13, sheet 17), George, 52, was a retail merchant in the drug industry and an employer. He owned his home (house) free.

The 1920 census (Texas, Collin Co., Farmersville, Enumeration District 15, sheet 16B) listed Charles, 22, an assistant at the Post Office, as the only child still at home. George was shown as proprietor of a drug store, of his "own account."





In the 1930 census (Texas, Collin Co, Farmersville, Enumeration District 43-12, sheet 13B), George, 72, had been 27 at the time of their marriage and was proprietor of a drug store and an employer, and Blanche was 53.

In the 1940 census (Texas, Collin Co, Farmersville, Precinct 2, Enumeration District 43-15, sheet 8B), George, 84, was a proprietor of a retail drug store who worked 52 weeks in 1939 and listed an income of \$0 but had income from other sources. He and Orela, 74, lived in the same house as in 1935.

The Collin County Marriage Index shows the marriage of George W. Rike and Orola [Orela] B. Odom in 1885. This pitcher on the right was a wedding gift.



George's death certificate lists him as George William Rike, who lived in Farmersville for 82 years. He was a retired druggist who died Apr 25, 1940 of heart failure following pneumonia with contributory causes, pneumonia and age.

His father was listed as John Rike, but this was incorrect. John was George's uncle, rather than his father. The death certificate also lists George's mother as unknown. It was signed by Charles J. Rike, who later studied and wrote about his own genealogy, but at the time he signed the death certificate, he either did not know much about his

grandparents or was too distraught to think straight. George was buried in the IOOF Cemetery on Apr 26, 1940. The undertaker was B.C. Fielder and the doctor was A.C. Corry.



Orela Blanche Odom

- b. 18 May 1866, Albany, Dougherty Co, GA
- d. 11 Aug 1944, Farmersville, Collin Co, TX

The 1880 census (Georgia, Dougherty Co, Albany, District 24) showed that Orela was living with J.J. Odom, 38, and his wife Elmina, 47. Miles Fields, 90, lived with them. Orela Blanche was 13 and listed as a niece. She was at school and was born in Georgia, as were her parents. J.J. Odom was born in Georgia, but his parents were born in South Carolina and

Georgia. Orela's father, G.W. Odom, 40, had moved to Texas and was shown in the 1880 census (Texas, Collin Co, Precinct 2, District 20) in Collin County, Texas. He was a boarder and was teaching school. He and his parents were from Georgia. He lived with the E.M. Glass family.









The Confederate Pension file for Alabama, Texas, and Virginia had statements from several men from Farmersville who said that they had known Blanche's father, G.W. Odom, since 1877. He served nearly 4 years in Confederate service as a non-commissioned officer, sergeant, in Co. F 51st Georgia Regiment of the Georgia infantry. Blanche's mother, Dorothy Minter Cox, died in 1868, when Blanche was two. She had a younger brother Benjamin. Dorothy may have died at his birth.

Orela's death certificate listed her as a white female who died Aug 11, 1944 at age 78. She was widowed, born May 18, 1866 in Albany, GA. She was a housewife whose father was G.W. Odom, but her mother was listed as unknown. The undertaker was B.C. Fielder. No cause of death was listed.

The funeral home memory book listed her pallbearers as Eldridge Pendleton, Ray Rike, Dr. W.F. Hayes, Burton Allison, Harold Frazier, and Guy Spruill. Many flowers were sent, including from the Junior Department of the Baptist Church. Many visitors were also listed.



Orela was an active Baptist. Several Mission Study Certificates from the 1920s exist to show Orela's involvement with the Woman's Missionary Union of the Southern Baptist Convention. In 2010, Beverly and Ken Lenoir delivered to the Baptist Building in Dallas several copies of the Baptist Standard from the early 1900s that had labels addressed to Mrs. George Rike in Farmersville.

Charles J. Rike, George's youngest son, wrote in his own memoir that:

As seems to have been customary in those days, Grandfather gave each of his 8 children farms or cash, at the time they left home on their own. Dad chose to take his in cash. With this cash, he with E.H. Pendleton and W.B. Yeary established Farmersville's first Drug Store – Pendleton, Yeary, and Rike.

The store operated as Pendleton, Yeary, and Rike until in the early 1890s when Mr. Pendleton sold his interest to Yeary and Rike, the other partners. The business continued as Yeary and Rike. In 1901 Mr. Yeary sold his part to J.R. Holloway, at which time the name was changed to Rike and Holloway. Zeb W. Rike Sr. bought Mr. Holloway's interest in 1920. The business became known as Rike Drug Store. In 1935, Chas. J. Rike bought the interest of Zeb's heirs after the death of Zeb in 1930. After my father George Rike died in 1940, I bought his interest in 1941. It has continued as Rike Drug Store since that time until now (1963).

The 1880 census for North Gibson, Gibson Co, TN shows R.B. (Robert) as a 1/12 year-old newborn with one older brother, Edgar, 1. His parents were Thomas W. Terry, 24, a farmer, and Eliza Jane, 27, who was keeping house.

By the time of the 1900 census (Collin Co, TX, Justice Precinct 8, District 0024, sheet #5), the family had moved to Texas. Thomas was a farmer on a farm that was mortgaged. They owned their house. The two oldest boys at home were Robert B., 20 and Thomas A., 18, who were farm laborers. Other sons were Luther C., 16, and Geather A., 15, both in school. John C. was 8.

The 1910 census (Collin Co, TX, Justice Precinct 8, District 0030, Sheet 17) for the Robert B. Terry, 29, family showed that he had been married to Bird, 26, for 6 years. Two children, both living, had been born to the couple: Halla V, 5, and Natalie, 3/12, both born in Texas (*shown in picture at right*). R.B.'s parents were both born in TN. Bird's parents were born in TX and GA. R.B. did general farm work and worked as "own account." He read and wrote English and rented their home.

By the time of the 1920 census (District 31) Robert and Bird (listed as Ellen), R.B. was listed as a chauffeur for a motor truck and earned a wage. Halla V was 14 and Natalie was 10.

By the census of 1930 (Farmersville, District 0012), R.B. and Bird (listed Bertie)



were 49 and 46. Their home was rented. The home value was listed as 17. (Perhaps this was the rent per month.) R.B. was a mechanic at a garage and earned a wage. Bird was a seamstress at home and worked as own account. Natalie was 20 and had no occupation. (Halla V had married and left home by this time.)

R.B. Terry and Ellen E. Copeland married in 1904 in Collin Co, TX.

R.B. died 24 Oct 1934 at age 55. His death certificate showed he died of Hodgkin's disease. His trade was listed as a filling station agent. He was born in TN to T.W. Terry and Eliza White, both born in TN. The informant was Mrs. Brown Terry (Bird). He was buried 25 Oct 1934 in the IOOF Cemetery (Find a Grave memorial #35852617). The doctor who signed the death certificate was W.O. Wright and the undertaker was Frank Tolbert, both of Farmersville.

R.B.'s WWI draft registration card, dated 9-12-1918, listed him as Robert Brown Terry, 38, date of birth May 17, 1880. He was white, native born, and a farmer whose employer was T.W. Terry. His permanent address and place of employment were "3Rout", Blue Ridge, Collin Co, TX. His nearest relative was Ellen Terry (wife), at the same address. He was of medium height and build with brown eyes and dark hair. He was not physically disqualified.

Ellen Elvira (Bird) Copeland Terry

The 1900 census for Collin Co, TX, Justice Precinct 08, District 0023, showed Ellen as a 16-year old who was born in Texas. Her father was James C. Copeland, 45, a white male, born



Aug 1854 in GA, who was married (for 21 years) to her mother, Fannie S., 37, a white female born in Dec 1862 in TX. Fannie had given birth to 7 children, 6 of whom were living: Mattie R., 20; Paul A., 18; Ellen E, 16; Janney V., 13; Sadie I., 10; and Loyd M., 5. James was a farmer who read, wrote, and spoke English. Mattie was a music teacher and Paul was a farm laborer who attended school 5 years. Ellen and other children attended school 6 years.

Ellen's (Bird's) death certificate indicated she died on 26 Apr 1967 at age 83 at Collin Memorial Hospital in McKinney. She lived at 106 Maple Street, Farmersville, TX and her occupation was housewife. She was born in Celeste, TX on 30 Jan 1884 and her father was J.C. Copeland and her mother was Sarah Frances Young. The informant was Natalie Terry (her daughter). The immediate cause of death was pneumonia, bilateral lobar, terminal (10 days) due to CVA, secondary to arteriosclerosis (4 weeks) due to heart disease, old infarction (2 years). An autopsy was performed. The signing physician was Jack L. Webb, M.D. Bird was buried 27 Apr 1967 in the IOOF Cemetery in Farmersville, TX. The funeral director was B.C. Fielder of Fielder-Baker Funeral Home.

The 1880 census (Texas, Collin Co, Precinct 8, District 8, page 28) showed John as a three-year old, but there were two younger children, Eliza, 1; and George W., 1/12. All together, the family of Charles and Mary Frazier had ten children: William, 18; James, 14; Elijah, 12; Harriet, 11; Martha E., 9; Jesse, 7; Sarah, 5; in addition to the three youngest.

By the time of the 1900 census (Texas, Collin Co, Precinct 8, District 24), John, 23, and Bettie, 21, had been married a year and had a baby daughter named Hazel who was 7 months old. John was born in Texas, but his parents were born in Tennessee and Alabama. Bettie's parents were born in Alabama, but she was a native Texan. John was in general merchandising and they rented their home. John and Bettie read, wrote, and spoke English.

At the time of the 1910 census (Texas, Collin Co, Precinct 8, District 29) John and Bettie were 33 and 31 and had four children: Hazel, 14 (probably 11, but looks like 14); Thelma, 8; Ava, 3, and Harold, 1. [John's and Bettie's parents were all listed as having been born in Georgia! Who gave that information?] In 1910, John was a miller at a gristmill.

The 1920 census (Texas, Collin Co, Farmersville, District 15) listed John as 42 with parents from Tennessee and Alabama, and Bettie was 40 with parents from Alabama. Thelma was 18, Ava was 13, Harold was 11, and Kenneth D. was 4. John was a real estate agent, on his own account.

The 1930 census (Texas, Collin Co, Farmersville, District 12) showed that Ava, 23, and Kenneth, 14, were still living at home. John was then a cotton buyer, and they lived in a home on Murchison Street that had a value of \$4,000. They did not have a radio set.



The picture at right shows the extended family with spouses and grandchildren.

John Jackson Frazier's death certificate showed that he died in McKinney at City-County Hospital after a stay of 14 days. He died on March 1, 1950. It showed his birth having been on February 10, 1877 to Charles Frazier and Mary J. Guinn in Blue Ridge, Texas. It stated that he was a salesman who died at 73 years of

By the time of the 1940 census (Texas, Collin Co, Farmersville, District 43-15), John was 63 and Bettie was 61. He worked as a retail automobile salesman and worked 40 hours the previous week and 52 weeks the previous year. Their annual income was \$900.

age. The informant was Mrs. John Jackson Frazier. The condition directly leading to death was acute coronary occlusion. There was no autopsy. J.M. Anthony, M.D., signed the certificate and B.C. Fielder was the funeral director. He was buried in the IOOF Cemetery in Farmersville. The family address was listed as General Delivery, Farmersville.

The Texas Marriage Collection listed a record for J.J. Frazier and Bettie Manning on 15 January, 1899 in Hunt Co, Texas. J.J.'s WWI draft registration card showed him as 41 in 1918 and self-employed as a cotton buyer. He had gray eyes, black hair, medium height and build, and it was witnessed by H.M. Markham on September 10, 1918 and signed by John Frazier.

Bettie Manning Frazier

b. 9 Feb 1879, Pike, Collin Co, TX

d. 1 June 1965, McKinney, Collin Co, TX

The 1880 census listed Bettie as the one-year old daughter of Bettie and Wiley Manning. There were seven older kids – from Yancy, 18, to William, 15; Lela, 10; Georgia, 8; Claude, 6; Wiley E, 3; to Bettie. Wiley, 40, was a farmer who was born in Alabama, as were his parents. Mom Bettie was born in Alabama and both her parents were from Georgia. Three servants lived with the family: Caladonia, George, and Mary E, with surnames of Manning.



The picture at right shows Bettie and her friends at college. Bettie is on the far right, seated on the floor.





Bettie's death certificate showed that Bettie M. Frazier died on June 1, 1965 at age 86 after an 8-day stay at Wysong Hospital in McKinney. She was a white female who was widowed and born on Feb. 9, 1879 in Pike, Texas. She was a housewife who lived at 100 Austin Street in Farmersville. Her father was Wylie Manning and her mother was Elizabeth Atkinson. The informant was W.H. (Harold) Frazier. The immediate cause of death was stroke. She was buried in IOOF Cemetery in Farmersville and the funeral director was B.C. Fielder.



The picture above shows Bettie Frazier about 1960 with great-granddaughters Beverly (left) and Linda (right) Latham. Beverly remembers her family (Grandmother Thelma, Mother Charlene, Beverly, and Linda) would often go by to see Bettie (Mama) when they were in Farmersville. She quilted and Mother and Grandmother talked about sewing and garden plants. Beverly remembers her Mother going out to Mama's garden to dig up starts for various plants.

A large portion of the obituaries were clipped from old Collin County newspapers by Juanita (Francis) Maxson, Gayle's deceased mother-in-law. Jane Huddleston at the Celina Heritage Museum allowed Gayle to transcribe six scrapbooks full of old obituaries (cut out and pasted with no documentation by persons long deceased). The Celina Record newspaper began publishing weekly in 1902. Papers from 1923-1924 are missing from the collection. **Thanks Gayle for preserving, consolidating, organizing and sharing this historical content!**

Who was William Davis?

Collin County was created 3 April 1846 from Fannin County which had itself been created in 1837 from Red River County. The first county seat for Collin was located at Buckner, about 4 miles northwest of downtown McKinney. First district court was held 21 October 1846. The first courthouse was located in John "Jack" McGarrah's store at Buckner. When it was discovered that the county seat was not located in the center of the new county, it was decided to relocate the county seat to what is now the City of McKinney in 1848. On 12 January 1848, the newly formed Texas State Legislature had determined that county seats needed to be located within 3 miles of the center of the county

The center of the county was located in land owned by William Davis. He had qualified for a land grant of 3,130 acres due to his service to the Republic of Texas in its war for Independence from Mexico.

But what do we know about William Davis?

Here is what the Collin County History website (*https://www.collincountyhistory.com/davis-william.html*) has for his biography:

Governor P. H. Bell, for the State of Texas, granted William Davis and wife, Margaret, two-thirds of a league and one labor of land where the town of McKinney now stands, totaling 3,130 acres. This was in support of a decree from the District Court of 1841, but was registered and patented at the Land Office in Austin August 1, 1856.

William Davis and his family had a little log cabin on the land in 1848 when the new County seat was moved to present McKinney. He and his wife gave 120 acres to the new town of McKinney to be used as a townsite. Commissioners receiving the donation were J. B. Wilmeth, James McReynolds, John Fitzhugh, and William McKinney. William Davis asked that lots 13 - 27 and 65 in Blocks 2 - 4 be reserved for his use. Neither he nor his wife could write so signed the document with the "Mark", as many other pioneers had to do. Schools were non-existent in the very early days and few could read unless they were educated before coming to Texas. Joel Stewart was then the county clerk.

Several descendants of William Davis live in Collin County and some are still here. Ida Lee married Conley Hockett, a Virginian. Her inheritance from her grandfather was a farm northwest (northeast?) of McKinney and here she reared her family. One of the Hockett children was Dewey Hockett.

What else can we find out about this man William Davis? Davis is a common last name and research has been difficult, trying to sort out Davis families in north Texas in the 1800s. There was a William David Davis, born in 1832 in Alabama, who came to Texas in 1870, and his niece married Clint Thompson, editor of the

McKinney Examiner for a number of years. He's not our man. There was also a William Davis, born around 1807 in Ohio, married to Elizabeth, lived in Collin County in 1860 and was the father of Sanford R. Davis. He's not our man either.

William Davis who owned the 3,130 acres in Collin County was born around 1818 in the state of Missouri. Further research needs to be done, but he could be the son of a John Davis who lived in Cape Girardeau County, Missouri in the early 1800s and was the builder of the first county courthouse for that county, located in the city of Cape Girardeau. The courthouse stood from 1818 until 1839, when a replacement was built. DNA research with Davis matches indicates a relationship to a Davis family originating possibly in Quaker Pennsylvania, then in New Hanover County, North Carolina (near Wilmington), then in the late 1700s to Rowan County, North Carolina. A number of the Davis family members moved to Kentucky before moving to Missouri. In a Bible record of the Davis family of North Carolina there is a John Davis born in 1794 of whom no one in several genealogy websites has further information on. There are deed records from 1818 to 1821 in Cape Girardeau County, Missouri for a John Davis, whose wife named Nancy also signed the deeds. For sure our William Davis was the son of John Davis who died in Lamar County in 1842, as he was named administrator of his estate.

At some point William Davis' parents moved to northwest Arkansas, probably around the early 1830s. There are tax records in Crawford County, Arkansas for John Davis in 1830 and 1835. I have identified Crawford County, Arkansas as the origin of several families who came to Lamar County, Texas in the late 1830s, using records of the General Land Office in Austin. Included among these are Marmaduke O'Neal, Hardin T. Chenoweth (he was sheriff in Crawford County according to a Chenoweth family history book), Samuel Edmondson (and wife Eliza Edmondson). These individuals will play a part in my family history later in this article.

William Davis' land record indicates his arrival in the Republic of Texas in late 1835 or in February 1836 (conflicting dates on land records). On 2 March 1836, independence from Mexico was declared. Of course Mexico didn't recognize this so on 18 July 1836 William signed up with Captain John Thomas Hart's company of Texans to fight against the Mexican army. It is not known why William came to Texas from Arkansas, as he would have only been 17 or 18 years old. He was the first of his family to come, his parents came two or three years later. It is possible that he saw an opportunity to acquire land for free, as the Mexican government at that time had been attempting to lure American settlers to Texas, most notably starting with Stephen F. Austin's Colony in 1821. Men need only be 17 years of age at that time.

William Davis signed up with Hart's company for a term of 3 months, which would have ended in October of 1836. Serving with him in Hart's company were Gabriel Chenoweth (possible relative of Hardin Chenoweth), Martin and Meredith Hart, ages 11 and 15 respectively (sons of 46 year old Captain Hart) and 40 year old Daniel Rowlett (Rowlett Creek was named for him). The wide age range of the soldiers is interesting, not at all like today's army. Presumably Capt. Hart was able to bring his sons with him to act as helpers or something akin to drummer boys in the Civil War. But they were definitely listed on the official rolls. Red River County was created in 1836, so William was a resident of that county until Lamar County was formed on 17 December 1840. I believe William probably lived in what is now Lamar County from his arrival in Texas until around 1843 when he moved to Collin County. A little bit about "leagues and labors" in Texas land records is in order. A league is 4,428 acres and a labor is 177 acres. The following paragraph from Wikipedia explains the use of leagues and labors in early Texas land grants:

When a league is subdivided, it is subdivided into 25 labors. Leagues can be divided or undivided (some leagues exist without labors). Labors cannot exist without leagues. A labor is one million square varas. Therefore, a league is 25 million square varas.

"A league and a labor" was a common first land grant and consisted of a league of land away from the river plus one extra labor of good riparian (river-situated) land. A headright of this much land was granted to "all persons [heads of families] except Africans and their descendants and Indians living in Texas on the day of the declaration of independence." To any single man, 17 years or older, one-third league was granted (1476 acres).

William Davis in later court records says he married in 1838 and is entitled to an "augmentation" as a married man for more acreage for his land grant from Republic of Texas. His ³/₃ league was 3,130 acres. It is unknown who his first wife was. No marriage record has been found. It is entirely possible he was not married and was trying to gain extra acreage by nefarious means.

William hired attorney John B. Denton, Texas pioneer, minister and militia captain to help him with his land grant paperwork (William could not read nor write). John B. Denton was killed 22 May 1841 in battle with Indians at Battle of Village Creek in what is now Tarrant County in the City of Arlington. Denton's children sued William Davis' heirs years later to claim title to land William signed over to Denton for his legal work.

No censuses were taken under the Republic of Texas (1836 to 1845), although tax records provide a substitute census for 1840. William Davis is listed in Fannin County.

Early 1840 My theory is that William had a relationship with "Eliza" Edmondson (born Eliza Perryman in 1810 in Virginia) and had a son Thomas Jefferson Davis born 28 Nov 1840 in Lamar Co (birthdate and place are both per his statement on his application for Confederate pension). His name doesn't appear as Davis until after 1850. In the 1850 census he is living with mother Eliza and step-father John C. Bates (listed twice...as Bates in Collin Co. and Edmondson in Milam Co.), In the 1860 census he is listed as Thomas Davis in Magnolia, Columbia County, Arkansas, as a "waggoner." Eliza also had a daughter Jane born around 1842, possibly daughter of William Davis also. Jane apparently died without marrying. Thomas Jefferson Davis is my great grandfather, he was married three times, having children by the first two wives. He moved to Sherman, Texas and my great grandmother (born Caroline Rice) divorced him in Collin County, then he moved to Gainesville, Cooke County, where he died in 1914. He served as a Confederate soldier in the Civil War and received a pension from the State of Texas.

In 1842 John Davis Sr. died and William Davis, his eldest son, was administrator of his estate in Lamar County, Texas. John Sr. had received a large land grant which was divided between his four children, William, John Jr., Nancy and James. However Nancy died, leaving an only son as her heir, by name of John W. O'Neal. After Nancy's husband Marmaduke O'Neal died, she married John C. Bates and they had one son Henry Edwin Bates, who died without issue. It seems a lot of men were dying in Lamar County Texas in the early 1840s. Widows typically remarried fairly quickly, as life on the frontier was especially tough for those living alone.

My reasoning for this theory is that I have not found any other Davis in north Texas in the time period involved other than William Davis who could have had fathered a child, plus I have numerous DNA matches to known descendants of William Davis through his daughter with Margaret Eddlemon, as well as numerous DNA matches to known descendants of William's brother John Davis, Jr. and sister Nancy Davis O'Neal.

Eliza Perryman married Samuel Edmondson in 1827 in Elbert County, Georgia and they had two children, Mary born 1829 and James born 1833 both in Georgia. Soon after the second child was born they moved to northwest Arkansas. Evidently she left Samuel Edmondson and moved to Lamar County, Texas with her daughter Mary, who was living next door to Eliza in the 1850 census in Milam County, Texas. Son James must have stayed with his father Samuel in Arkansas. Samuel was an attorney and later judge, first practicing in Crawford County then later in Van Buren, Arkansas after that county was formed. He remarried twice after Eliza. Eliza was shown living in Lamar County, Texas and on land records claimed she was a widow. However she married in early January 1844 to Hardin Thomas Chenoweth, the former sheriff of Crawford County, Arkansas, became pregnant shortly afterwards, then Hardin died about 30 days after the marriage, leaving Eliza alone. She gave birth to daughter Elizabeth Chenoweth in November 1844. Eliza later married John C. Bates in 1846 in Lamar County, giving birth to a son Amos "Richard/Dick" Bates and daughter Georgiana Bates (married William Jordan Higgins). John Bates was from Staffordshire, England and immigrated to the United States as a young man, joined the US Army, and was stationed in both Louisiana and Texas. After leaving the U.S. Army he stayed in Texas. Hardin Chenoweth qualified for a large land grant which was located east of and adjacent to William Davis' land grant. His heirs were involved in lawsuits regarding the division of the land. Many of Amos Bates' and Georgiana Higgins' descendants lived in Collin County. Elizabeth Chenoweth married Howell Lewis Jeffries and they moved to Oklahoma. I believe Eliza had known the Davis family back in Arkansas.

Early graves in Collin County were mostly not marked with tombstones. If anything, they were marked with wooden markers, which have long since disappeared. I have found very few graves for my Davis connections in Collin County but I did find a grave for Amos Bates' widow Aurora Marowski Bates at Woodlawn Cemetery, northeast of McKinney, she died in 1938. The earliest marked grave there is dated 1870 but I suspect there were earlier burials and possibly William Davis would have been buried there since he died in 1868 and lived fairly close by.

Back to William Davis' life. In 1840 Lamar County was formed, then around 1843 William moved to Collin County, according to Helen Hall's book on the history of Collin County. He was married to Lavina or Lavinia

Chenoweth in 1843 in Fannin County (no record found), the daughter of Hardin Thomas Chenoweth and Nancy Hart (they were divorced) according to records of the court in Collin County. The marriage was short, they divorced on 30 Nov 1846 without having children. Hardin, as previously mentioned, later married Eliza Perryman Edmondson.

In December 1845 Texas became a state and in April of 1846 Collin County was organized from Fannin County. On 3 January 1847 William married Margaret T. Eddlemon in Collin County. She was born in 1828 in Fentress County, Tennessee, daughter of Daniel Eddlemon and Nancy Roseberry. They both signed the deed for 120 acres for the county seat by making their marks, as neither one could read or write. By Margaret he had only one child, a daughter Mary Narcissa Davis, born about 1849, who married John William Lee (1847-1918) and they lived east of McKinney. Mary Narcissa died in 1877, having had two daughters Ida Lee (married Conley Hockett) and Rose Etta Lee (married James David Caudle).

25 Dec 1848. William's brother John Davis Jr. died at his house per Collin County court record. I think John Davis Jr. lived in Fannin Co., I can't find him in Collin at all other than him dying at his brother William's home and court records regarding daughter Malinda's guardianship. I think it was filed in Collin because John Jr. owned land in Collin or perhaps his widow Elizabeth (nee Viser) moved there after his death. Also Malinda's mother Elizabeth lived with her brother in law William Davis in 1850 (Malinda also). Why would he die at William's home? He must have been visiting him from Fannin Co. Malinda married John R. Beck and had a daughter Nancy R. Beck who figures in Collin Co. land suits regarding the estate of John Davis Jr.

1849. William leaves Texas to go on the gold rush in California. Per ex-wife's obituary in 1906. John "Jack" McGarrah also went to California and died there or on his way home in 1852. I read that a group of 150 travelled together leaving from the Ft. Worth area. Collin County court records in the early 1850s refer to William as having left the state. Perhaps he didn't leave until 1850 as he is listed in the 1850 census in Collin County. While some gold rush participants took month-long trips on ships around the tip of South American, I believe William and the others from Texas went by land, crossing what was part of Mexico and now New Mexico and Arizona to get to California. It would have been a long and arduous journey, but with expectation of getting rich. Most were disappointed. Many, if not most, returned to their homes after a year or two. William stayed a lot longer and left a wife alone to raise their daughter.

20 Nov 1850. William is listed in McKinney living with Margaret in census, age 38 born Ark. His occupation is shown as a "trader". Neither William nor Margaret can read or write. Daughter M. N. (Narcie) living with them as well as James Davis (believed to be younger brother), E. (Elizabeth Viser Davis, widow of his brother John Davis Jr.) and her daughter M. A. (Malinda Ann) who married in 1868 to John Wesley Cawthron.

There is a William Davis in the 1850 federal census in Butte County, listed as a miner, so this could be him. There is a William Davis in the 1852 state census of California, living in Placer County who could be this William. Hard to read the census but ancestry thinks he's 32, I can't read the birthplace. William returned from California around 1855 and Margaret divorced him shortly after his arrival. She went on to marry W. H. Slane (Sloane?) in 1856, then later James Richard Arnold, dying in 1906 in Bosque County, Texas, having had additional children by her other husband. William Davis married again around 1858 to Sarah "Sallie" James, daughter of neighbor Richard James and his wife Letitia Carpenter but apparently didn't obtain a license (no record found). But I did find an article in The Standard newspaper from Clarksville, Red River County in 1860 (no paper was published in McKinney at this time) referencing the state legislature legalizing their marriage. They had two sons, Nicholas (1859-1873) and Franklin (1863-1874). Dates are approximate, from information in Collin County court records. William is listed with wife "Sally" in the 1860 census in Collin County, along with son Nicholas, nephew John W. O'Neal, daughter "Narcus" (Mary Narcissa), and a neighbor boy, "Poley" (probably Paul) Gates, age 10. The Gates family lived close by and many are buried at Woodlawn Cemetery.

William died 16 June 1868, according to the website of the Daughters of the Texas Republic. William's service in the Texas War of Independence qualifies descendants for membership in that organization.

After William died lawsuits continued against Sarah "Sallie" Davis to obtain title to some of William's land. She remarried on 16 September 1872 in Collin County to Charles B. Lewis. The marriage was a short one and they separated in 1873 and she remarried 25 Jul 1874 again in Collin County to William M. Webb. I have not been able to find a record of her death or that of her later husbands. She had been born around 1836 in Kentucky. As far as I know she had no children.

No doubt some of the large amount of land that William Davis originally owned was sold off by him, then additional amounts lost to lawsuits by the Denton heirs. When one looks at a map of McKinney, a good portion was originally part of the William Davis grant. With a 3 month stint in the War for Texas Independence, multiple marriages, divorces and relationships and a sojourn as a miner in California during the Gold Rush for about 5 or 6 years, it was an interesting life for a man who could neither read nor write and only lived to be about 50 years old.



Caroline Rice who married T. J. Davis, son of William Davis.

Caroline Rice Davis Soden is the lady in the front row middle sitting next to her husband Phillip Soden with grandson Phillip Robbirds in between them. Immediately behind them are their sons Owen and Tom Soden. Standing on each side of the two brothers are Mattie Soden (later Smith) on the left and Vira Soden (later Harris) on the right. The other lady on the left sitting is Julia Davis Robbirds with her 3 children, Bessie, Phillip and Cleo. Julia was Caroline's daughter by her first husband Thomas Jefferson Davis. My grandmother Nellie Davis Addington was not in the photo; she was probably expecting a baby or had a newborn (my uncle was born April 1903), as the photo looks to be taken in 1903. I think Tom is the taller Soden brother.



This photo was probably taken in 1905 since Owen Soden is not in the photo having died in 1904. The three unmarried children at that time were Tom, Vira and Mattie Soden.
