- 6 SECTION 1. Section 33.602, Natural Resources Code, is
- 7 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (e) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (b) The commissioner shall publish and periodically update
- 10 a coastal erosion response plan. The commissioner shall develop
- 11 the plan in coordination with state and federal agencies and local
- 12 governments and provide for public input on the plan. The plan must
- 13 identify critical coastal erosion areas designated by the
- 14 commissioner and prioritize coastal erosion response studies and
- 15 projects so that:
- 16 (1) benefits are balanced among areas throughout the
- 17 coast designated by the commissioner as critical coastal erosion
- 18 areas;
- 19 (2) federal and local financial participation is
- 20 maximized;
- 21 (3) studies and projects are scheduled to achieve
- 22 efficiencies and economies of scale; and
- 23 (4) the severity of erosion effects in each area is
- 24 taken into account.

1	(e) In order to determine which areas should be designated
2	as critical coastal erosion areas and guide the allocation of
3	resources, the commissioner may conduct a coast-wide analysis of
4	the costs and benefits of coastal erosion avoidance, remediation,
5	and planning. An analysis conducted under this subsection may
6	consider:
7	(1) historical erosion rates in an area;
8	(2) the elevation of an area adjacent to the
9	shoreline;
10	(3) the presence of critical infrastructure in an area
11	adjacent to the shoreline;
12	(4) the population density of an area adjacent to the
13	shoreline;
14	(5) the presence of economic activity conducted in an
15	area adjacent to the shoreline;
16	(6) the presence of critical natural resources in an
17	area adjacent to the shoreline;
18	(7) anthropogenic contributions to erosion; and
19	(8) any other factor identified as relevant by the
20	commissioner.
21	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
