## Chapter 598

1	AN	ACT

- 2 relating to grants for school-based health centers and reports
- 3 submitted by those centers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 38.063, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a), (b), (d), (e), (f), and (g) and adding
- 7 Subsections (e-1) and (e-2) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Subject to the availability of federal or state
- 9 appropriated funds, the commissioner of <a href="state">state</a> [public] health
- 10 <u>services</u> shall administer a program under which grants are awarded
- 11 to assist school districts and local health departments, hospitals,
- 12 <u>health care systems</u>, universities, or nonprofit organizations that
- 13 contract with school districts with the costs of [operating]
- 14 school-based health centers in accordance with this section.
- 15 (b) The commissioner of state [public] health services, by
- 16 rules adopted in accordance with this section, shall establish
- 17 procedures for awarding grants. The rules must provide that:
- 18 (1) grants are awarded <u>annually</u> [to school districts
- 19 on an annual basis] through a competitive process to:
- 20 (A) school districts; and
- 21 (B) local health departments, hospitals, health
- 22 care systems, universities, or nonprofit organizations that have
- 23 contracted with school districts to establish and operate
- 24 <u>school-based health centers;</u>

- 1 (2) <u>subject to the availability of federal or state</u>
- 2 appropriated funds, each grant is for a term of five years; and
- 3 (3) a preference is given to school-based health
- 4 centers in school districts that are located in rural areas or that
- 5 have low property wealth per student.
- 6 (d) A school district, local health department, hospital,
- 7 <u>health care system, university, or nonprofit organization</u> may not
- 8 receive more than \$250,000 per state fiscal biennium through grants
- 9 awarded under this section.
- 10 (e) To be eligible to receive a grant, a school district,
- 11 local health department, hospital, health care system, university,
- 12 or nonprofit organization must provide matching funds in accordance
- 13 with rules adopted under Subsection (b). The matching funds may be
- 14 obtained from any source available to the district, <u>local health</u>
- 15 department, hospital, health care system, university, or nonprofit
- 16 organization, including in-kind contributions, community or
- 17 foundation grants, individual contributions, and local
- 18 governmental agency operating funds.
- 19 (e-1) A grant under this section may not be given to a
- 20 nonprofit organization that offers reproductive services,
- 21 contraceptive services, counseling, or referrals, or any other
- 22 services that require a license under Chapter 245, Health and
- 23 Safety Code, or that is affiliated with a nonprofit organization
- 24 that is licensed under Chapter 245, Health and Safety Code.
- 25 (e-2) A school district, local health department, hospital,
- 26 health care system, university, or nonprofit organization
- 27 receiving a grant under this section may use the grant funds to:

- 1 (1) establish a new school-based health center; 2 (2) expand an existing school-based health center; or 3 (3) operate a school-based health center. 4 The commissioner of state [public] health services 5 shall adopt rules establishing standards for health care centers 6 funded through grants that place primary emphasis on delivery of 7 health services and secondary emphasis on population-based models 8 that prevent emerging health threats. The commissioner of  $\underline{\text{state}}$  [ $\underline{\text{public}}$ ] health  $\underline{\text{services}}$ 9 shall require client surveys to be conducted in school-based health 10 11 centers funded through grants awarded under this section[, and the results of those surveys must be included in the annual report 12 13 required under Section 38.064]. 14 SECTION 2. Section 38.064, Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 Sec. 38.064. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. 16 (a) Based 17 statistics obtained from every school-based health center in this state that receives funding through the Department of State Health 18 Services, the Department of State Health Services [commissioner of 19 public-health] shall issue a biennial [an annual] report to the 20 legislature about the relative efficacy of services delivered by 21 22 the [school-based health] centers during the preceding two years 23 and any increased academic success of students at campuses served by those centers, with special emphasis on any: 24 attendance, including attendance 25 (1) increased

information regarding students with chronic illnesses;

decreased drop-out rates;

- 1 (3) improved student health; [and]
- 2 <u>increased student immunization rates;</u>
- 3 (5) increased student participation in preventive
- 4 health measures, including routine physical examinations and
- 5 checkups conducted in accordance with the Texas Health Steps
- 6 program; and
- 7 (6) improved performance on student assessment
- 8 instruments administered under Subchapter B, Chapter 39.
- 9 (b) The Department of State Health Services may modify any
- 10 requirement imposed by Subsection (a) if necessary to comply with
- 11 federal law regarding confidentiality of student medical or
- 12 <u>educational</u> information, including the Health Insurance
- 13 Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (42 U.S.C. Section 1320d
- 14 et seq.) and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974
- 15 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g) [In obtaining statistics for preparation
- 16 of the report required by this section, the commissioner of public
- 17 health shall ensure that data is collected for each county and
- 18 aggregated appropriately according to geographical region].
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
