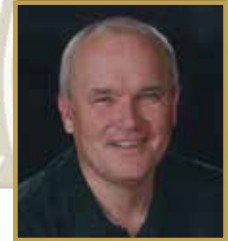

Mayor's Message

Visioning for Windcrest. If this issue of the newsletter gets to you later than normal, you can blame me. I held off writing it until we had completed the first meeting of our Strategic Planning process. This effort is designed to identify those aspects of the City of Windcrest that the City Council and staff should focus our efforts and funding on. We enlisted the services of Rose Mary Fry from “Degrees of Work” to guide us through this process. February 9th was our first meeting and the process is expected to conclude in June. The first meeting included the City Council, City Department Heads, representatives of our Economic Development Corporation and each of the appointed boards and commissions in the City of Windcrest. Because it is crucial to get Citizen input, we are including two opportunities for citizens to come to “Focus Groups” and a separate survey.

The product of this effort will be a set of “Cornerstone Areas” that outline areas we want to focus our attention on. We will also identify timelines to address these areas. I believe this process will be extremely helpful in identifying who we want to be as a City and where we should focus our efforts and funding to get us there. I look forward to hearing from our citizens as we continue this important task.

Police Force Addition: At the February 1st, 2021 meeting, the Council approved a recommendation from our Windcrest Crime Control and Protection District to hire an additional three new police officers. This is, in part, a response to the requests from citizens to improve the police efforts on curbing speeding.

COVID

March 16, 2021, marks the one-year anniversary of our decision to declare a state of emergency in the City as a result of the COVID Pandemic. I, for one, did not expect it to last this long. Hopefully, we are on the back side of this curve. We are aware that many citizens wish to receive the vaccine and continue to keep our ear to the ground to find ways to accomplish that. I’m aware of many who have been able to use the “311” phone number with the City of San Antonio to get vaccinated. I’m also aware that that process has been frustrating because of the number of people trying to participate. Rackspace has been identified as a testing location for asymptomatic persons. When I talked to the Rackspace leadership, I thanked them for offering a place to get tested and was happy that they were also volunteering to use their site for vaccinations when that is possible.

Thank you, Windcrest, for having confidence in me. I am honored to be in service to Windcrest.



Spring is here! Now if we can just get rid of COVID. We are all so sick and tired of this mess. Hopefully you are finding a place to get your vaccinations if you are wanting them. If you do happen to come down with this awful disease, we pray your symptoms will be mild.



In case you have not been keeping up with the City Council meetings, we have been approved for three additional police officers. Since I was appointed the Chief of the Windcrest Police Department the number one complaint I have received from the citizens of Windcrest is speeders. When someone lets me know about traffic issues, I forward that information to the Patrol Lieutenant who will bring that to the attention of our patrol officers. They in turn will focus on the problem area, calls willing, to attempt to resolve the issue. We currently have one officer assigned as a traffic officer but my plan for the three additional officers is to assign two of them to traffic as well. Their main focus will be on the traffic issues we have. We will be dividing the City into districts in the near future and not only the traffic officers, but patrol officers will be assigned to districts. The district women/men will work the same district every day they are scheduled to work. This will give the officers a chance to get to know their area and its citizens and problem areas better.

Windcrest Volunteer Fire Department

Beyond Basic Firefighter Certification – Rescue

In recent years, it had fallen on the fire department to handle a wider array of calls. Essentially, when no one else knew who to call, they would call the fire department. One of these added call types has been technical rescue. Technical rescue is a broad category covering many different situations that might possibly be encountered. Here in Windcrest, we consider a member to be a “Rescue Specialist” once they have completed the requirements for Rope Rescue I, Rope Rescue II, Swiftwater Rescue, Confined Space Rescue and Trench Rescue. The completion of all of these courses is approximately 200 hours of training and can take years for a member to complete. These skills, however, are very important to have in situations that may not require the “typical” approach to an emergency.

Completion of the above courses is done on a voluntary basis. Funding for these courses comes from a variety of sources, many of which are grants given to the department for training. Many members have expressed interest in completing these courses, and we hope to see the addition of more of our members attending these courses here in the near future.

Code Compliance & Enforcement

Welcome beautiful March weather. There is nothing more beautiful than someone who goes out of their way to make life beautiful for others. Please reach out a helping hand to a neighbor in need of yard work. Remember to clean up your own backyard to prevent clutter. Now is a good time to design the ultimate backyard oasis you have been wanting.

Remember, it shall be unlawful for any owner, lessee, occupant, or any person in charge of any premises occupied or used for residential, business or pleasure purposes in the City of Windcrest, Texas, to allow the same to be kept in an unsanitary condition. See Code of Ordinances, Chapter 14-Health, Section 14-6 for list of unsanitary conditions.

Also, If you are installing or have installed an alarm system in your home and/or business, please contact the permits department. Sec. 10-48 requires that all alarm systems be registered with the City of Windcrest on an annual basis.

Take it from Cheryl and safeguard your shed with these simple tips:

- Always ensure hazardous substances e.g., fuels and oils are stored securely in approved containers.
- Do not overload power outlets and make sure that the main source of power is protected by a circuit breaker.
- Never store hot power equipment right away. Let equipment cool down before placing it in a backyard shed or garage.
- Have a fire extinguisher mounted in your shed, for easy access in case of a fire in your shed.

Animal Care & Control

Can I keep a lost pet?

If you find a stray dog and take possession, your first obligation is to the health and safety of the dog. Law requires to make every attempt in finding its owner.



Although it may be tempting to keep a lost pet. We must try to reunite the owner with their family pet who may have escaped from its enclosure. First step is to see if the owner had the dog microchipped. Animal Control can help with this. If there are no tags then contact Animal Control for assistance. The Animal Control office is most likely the first place owners check when trying to locate their dog.

Some people won't call Animal Control to report a found dog because they believe it will result in the dog being euthanized. However, the Animal Control officer can improve a dog's chances of getting back home or if the owner cannot be found then the dog can be adopted.

If you are unable to temporarily place a stray dog in your house until you can get assistance with locating its owner, then a shelter may be a better option. Animal Control can assist with this as well. If a dog is not claimed within 7 business days, then Animal Control will find someone to adopt the dog. You can inquire if you are interested in adopting the dog yourself.

What to do if you lose your pet?

Contact local Animal Control agencies. File a lost pet report with every shelter within a 20-mile radius of your home and visit the nearest shelters daily, if possible. To find your local shelter, search online or check your phone book. Notify the police if you believe your pet was stolen.

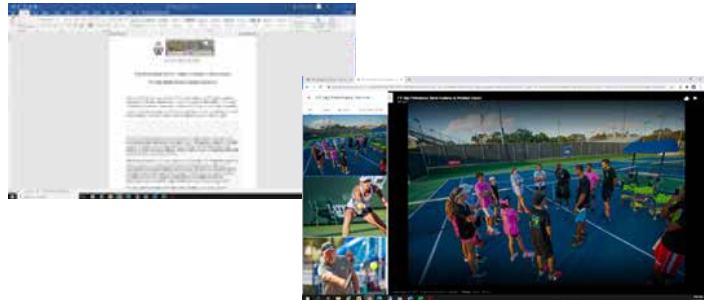

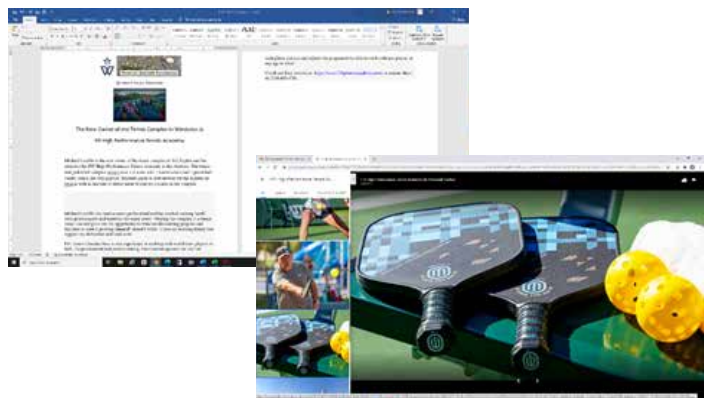


New Owner of the Tennis Complex in Windcrest is Fit High Performance Tennis Academy & Fit Pickleball Fitness Center



Pioneer Lady Mustang Baller Wilson Owns SAISD Scoring Title 42 Years

After the 2020-2021 Thomas Jefferson High School Roundballers clinched the school's first female District basketball title on February 5, 2021, the San Antonio Independent School District (SAISD) Athletic Department held a special recognition ceremony for the "pioneer" 1975-1976 Lady Mustang Basketball team. Windcrest resident Gwen Wilson was one of the players recognized at this event.

Also, during this ceremony, Wilson was honored for the outstanding Female Basketball Most Career Points Scoring Record (1975-1979) that she continues to hold in SAISD. In the first two years of Universal Interscholastic League (UIL) sanctioned Girls' Basketball, female dribblers played a 3 on 3 half court game. Wilson began her high school basketball career on the defensive end of the court. Remarkably, in only three years as an offensive player, Gwen scored **2336** points. Gwen Wilson has held the SAISD Female Basketball Most Career Points Scoring Record for 42 years.

It is the time where you might be seeing little ones appear... baby birds, baby wildlife, puppies and yes, kittens. Please do not remove kittens from an area just because you don't see mom. She is probably out there looking for food. Help her by placing some kitten food where you see the young, then call animal control and they will make every effort to try to trap the family. Usually, they try to wait until the kittens are eating the food because trapping is a lot easier. Because of the rabies shot, kittens must weigh at least three pounds so try to gauge what you think they might weigh. 3 pounds = 3 months Animal Control can help with that guess too. They can then try to trap them, try to socialize the kittens for adoption and spay mom. If you find puppies, call Animal Control and he will make every effort to trap the whole family and take them into his care.

Remember to pick up after your dog... That is the number one complaint for Animal Control in our City... really??? Yep, and you can be ticketed for it. And talking about ticketing.....you can get one of those for not having your dog on leash too. If it is not in your house or your fenced yard, the dog needs to be on the other end of a leash!
