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# Mayor's Message



June is upon us! We look forward to the warm Texas weather as a strong contrast to the freeze we experienced in February. Remember to take it easy and hydrate often as we go into this hot season. Here are a few items of interest for you.

### Strategic Planning

We are completing the Strategic Planning initiative process. The final meeting of the Strategic Planning Committee was in late May. Citizen input was provided directly during three in-person sessions and an on-line survey. As we complete the process, we will develop some goals and timelines to respond to the priorities you set forth. We anticipate using this information during our budget deliberations this summer as we build the budget for next year.

#### Windcrest Pool

Early in the strategic planning process, we heard from several respondents regarding the pool and the importance of it to them. We heard your concerns and put it on the agenda for the May 17, 2021 City Council meeting to discuss options. I am writing this prior to the meeting, so at this time, I don't know what actions will be taken - but I do know it is recorded so you can review it. As many of you know, the pool did not open last season because of COVID and some major repairs needed. The estimates for those repairs are to be reported at the May 17 meeting. As of May 1st, we were still had a mandated maximum of 25% capacity at the pool even if it were open. Review the May 17 meeting to see what the Council discussed and/or decided.

### **Audit Results**

The City Council received a very positive annual Audit Report at our April 19,2021 meeting! The year end fund balance of \$1,970,788, was an Increase from last year of \$141,579. The unassigned fund balance (sometimes referred to as the "rainy day fund) was 2,285,068 representing 30.29% of the general fund operating expenditures including capital outlay for the year. We exceeded the Charter mandated 25% number! The audit report also acknowledges our success in reducing the deficit in the Garbage Fund that was left by the previous administration. This very detailed report is available online would you wish to review it.

### TRAFFIC LIGHT

The council received a preliminary report on the cost and possible configuration of a traffic light at the corner of Crestway and Eaglecrest. After some initial comments by the Council, the City Engineer was directed to proceed with costing options and come back to the Council at a later date. If you have been through that intersection during rush hour, you will see why this might be a good idea!

#### Speeding

It is probably not a surprise to anyone that one of the top complaints we receive are speeders. You would think speeding would not be a problem in a City that is primarily 20 miles per hour, but you would be wrong. Our Police department continues to look at ways to help with the speeding. Our Police Chief briefed

the Council on considering a "zero tolerance" policy for getting pulled over and at least giving a warning. The Police Chief did some research and provided some thoughts on "Traffic Calming" techniques. Bottom line, is we hear you and continue to look for ways to stop speeding.

### American Recovery Act Funding

On April 7th, Congressman Cuellar came to Windcrest to discuss the expected funding for the City of Windcrest as a result of the passage of the American Recovery Act passage. Congressman Cuellar announced that Windcrest could expect to receive just over \$1.2 Million from the legislation. It is IMPORTANT to know that the stipulations on what that funding can (and can NOT) be used for. As soon as we become aware of the rules, we will discuss it in open session at the City Council meeting and decide on the appropriate use for the funds.

### **COVID**

By now, it seems fair to say that anyone can get a COVID vaccination who desires one. There are multiple locations providing that service. I hope that all of you will take the opportunity to get vaccinated so we can get closer to what was normal before this started. If you need help with where to go or even a ride, please reach out to me and we will support you as much as possible.

### Coffee with the Mayor

We continued Coffee with the Mayor on Saturday mornings at 8:30 at Las Palapas on Walzem. Las Palapas was gracious enough to allow us to use the back room. We have been able to meet and still maintain distancing for our safety.

Thank you, Windcrest, for having confidence in me. I am honored to be in service to Windcrest.



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## What Has Your Windcrest Fire Department Been Up To?

This past couple of months has seen many of our members prepping to make themselves better prepared. In April, 4 members attended a Ropes Technician course. This course was designed to ensure the fire department has the basic capabilities should a technical rope rescue ever be needed. This will work in conjunction with the members that were certified as Swiftwater Technicians last month. Our goal is to make sure the fire department truly encompasses all hazards and had the capability to be self-sustaining in virtually any emergency situation.

In addition, five our members attended and completed the Instructor's courses for Basic Life Support CPR, Pediatric Advanced Life Support, and Advanced Cardiac Life Support. All of the cards are



required to be carried by our members, in some instances only the Paramedics. However, with the addition of these certified CPR instructors, the Fire Department is looking to begin hosting CPR classes for the general public. Our goal will be to hold one class every month and help to make sure the citizens who want to, are able to assist in the time of need. If you have further questions about attending one of our CPR classes, please reach out to the Fire Department Administration offices. Follow the Department's social media platforms, and this newsletter to learn when the courses are starting up and how to find a class that is available on your schedule.

# Code Compliance & Enforcement

Great Job to all our Windcrest residents for keeping your properties looking beautiful. Bulk pick-up was a success and the hard work done to your properties after the snow storm has not gone unnoticed. This is a great time to reach out and help an elderly neighbor with yard work needed. Also, if you have not yet cut/ trimmed your trees obstructing the street please make the time. While trimming your trees ensure to trim around the street signs if your tree is low hanging and obstructing the street signs. As a friendly reminder oak trees can only be cut/trimmed between the months of June through November with a permit.

It is your responsibility to maintain your alley please refer to **Sec. 28-115.** - **Responsibility for alley maintenance.** The owner and the resident of property adjacent to an alley are jointly responsible for maintaining the necessary clearances of alleys and keeping alleys in a passable, slightly and sanitary condition.

Keep in mind before remolding your home please call our permits departments. The following types of construction work are specifically identified as requiring permits to be issued by the city. New residential building, including mechanical, electrical, plumbing and fence work. All types of roofing, to include replacement of shingles.

I would like to take the time to introduce myself, I'm Officer Breland the new Code Compliance Officer, I have proudly served the City of Windcrest as a patrolman for the past three years. As your new code compliance officer, I am looking forward to working with all of you to keep our city beautiful, our business safe and our residents happy. My role as your code compliance officer is to gain and maintain compliance throughout our community with open communication, education, and available resources. # San Antonio Public Library Pruitt at Roosevelt Happenings



The library is pleased to welcome back patrons for Brisk Browsing. Come in, look around, and check out materials.

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Beautiful weather is upon us. The time is here to get out and enjoy the wonderful parks in our city. Did you know within our parks system, some recreation amenities include walking trails, exercise equipment long the Takas Park walking trail, pickle ball and tennis courts, and beautiful gazebos to sit and enjoy the great outdoors.

Parks and Recreation Commission is working hard on identifying new initiatives toward enhancing our parks system and recreational amenities. One identified initiative is the development of an offleash dog park in Windcrest. The Parks and Recreation Commission was pleased with the data collected from the 2021 Dog Park Survey launched earlier this year. During the April 22 Parks and Recreation meeting, city staff reported the data collected from the survey. The results confirmed there is definitely an interest in developing an offleash dog park. A brief summary is provided below.

- Of the 233 respondents, 81% supported an off-leash dog park in Windcrest.
- 88% are homeowners reside in Windcrest, with 84% representing current dog owners and 6% considering the addition of a K-9 member into their home.
- Top 5 locations identified for a Windcrest Dog Park
  - Brook Falls Park
  - Jim Seal & Crestway
  - 5200 Crestway
  - Autumn Sunset Park
  - North Crestwind near Fourwinds
- 43% currently visit dog parks such as the City of San Antonio dog parks located in McAllister Park, Lady Bird Johnson Park, and Phil Hardberger Park (East & West Park). Others include Live Oak and Universal City.

With over 50 individuals interested in serving on the Dog Park Subcommittee, the Parks and Recreation approved hosting 2 -3 focus group meetings. Overall goals for the meeting are to create a mission and plan to present to City Council during the upcoming budget workshops.

In addition to the dog park initiative, the Commission is working on finalizing the Open Space Master Plan they have been discussing since last year. Each commissioner is working on their individual initiatives to incorporate into the plan.

Stay up to date on the Commission's efforts by attending their monthly meetings held the last Thursday of each month. The meetings begin at 6pm in City Council Chambers located at City Hall.

July is National Parks and Recreation month! What better way to celebrate then to get out and get fit in the parks! Refer to the city's website for upcoming events in the parks.


