

Mayor's Message



Budget

The City Council held Budget workshops in July as we considered the 2021-2022 Budget. These workshops were open to the public. As we continue toward completing the budget for next year, all of our Council meetings will include an agenda item regarding the Budget so citizens can make their voices heard regarding their priorities at Citizens to be Heard.

Strategic Planning

The Council completed work on the Strategic Plan during July. The Council is using this planning document to prioritize funding for the City of Windcrest. The Plan and the results of the Survey are available on our web site (www.windcrest-tx.gov) Please take the time to look it over. We will develop an article for the next newsletter (September) to cover the results.

Windcrest Neighborhood Block Program

Per previous newsletters, we are developing a community response tool to help quickly identify the needs of our neighbors. The City was divided into "blocks" with the intent to have one person in each "block" to communicate with their neighbors in time of need so that the City might respond more efficiently. Here are the duties

By volunteering to be a "Block Coordinator", we would like you to perform the following tasks:

- Attempt to make contact with each home in your Block and get the following information:
 - Names of the people in each home
 - Best phone number to contact them
 - Any special needs the home occupants might have, particularly in the case of loss of utilities.
 - We fully understand that some home occupants may not want to provide this information. THIS IS STRICTLY VOLUNTARY!
- Keep a record of the information you have collected.
- Make sure that our Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) (Fire Chief) has the best phone number for the Block Coordinator.
- In the case of emergency or loss of utilities, you might be asked to poll your "Block" to provide status information to the EMC for purposes of identifying areas within the City that need special attention.

Elections

This November, you will have both a "regular" election and a "special election. The regular election will be to determine office holders for Mayor and Council positions 4 and 5. The "special election" will determine if the citizens want to **continue** to use a portion of our sales tax to cover road improvements. There **may** also be some Bond Election items for consideration. If there are Bond Election items, the city will ensure citizens know exactly what they are voting on prior to voting. October 4 is the last day to register to vote. Filing information and instructions are available at our city offices, contact our City Secretary.

CITY CODE HIGHLIGHTS

Half of 2021 has passed and your City Council has been busy approving various ordinances and resolutions towards a more efficient city government. One ordinance to make note of is Ordinance 2021-007(O), passed on July 12, 2021, an ordinance amending Chapter 1 of the City of Windcrest Code of Ordinances by adopting Section 1-11. This ordinance enables the city to withhold permits and licenses in an effort to aid in the collection of debt owed to the city. Section 1-11 reads as follows:

Sec. 1-11.-Witholding of Permits and Licenses

Any person, business, corporation, partnership, or real property owing any debt to the city, including, but not limited to abatement fees, delinquent property taxes, liens, re-inspection fees, garbage fees, license fees, and any fees listed in the City's master fee schedule shall not be issued any license or permit and may not be appointed to any board, commission, or committee of the City.

Additionally, on November 2, 2020, City Council approved Ordinance 2020-032(O), an ordinance creating Article III-Waste Disposal and Franchises of Chapter 14 of the Windcrest Code of Ordinances, and providing for services, programs, enforcement and penalties for solid waste management. List below are a few key points to make note of:

• The adoption of Ordinance 2020-032(O) is to protect public health, safety and wellbeing of all citizens, for the general health and safety of the public, including eliminating possible germ breeding materials and conditions which may contribute to the spreading of diseases and infections to humans and animals, and to provide a means for the controlled and safe handling, collection, transporting and disposal of municipal solid waste within the City.

Sec. 14-151 Services

- Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Services Required. Every occupied residential or commercial structure within the city, and every service address for purposes of water and/or sewer services within the city must be served by a solid waste management service. The owner of the property is responsible for compliance with this requirement.
- Mandatory Participation. All persons who own or occupy property within the city and who generate any form of municipal solid waste shall register and receive services from the city under one or more services. Each property which generates any form of solid waste must be separately registered and shall receive separate services.

Section 14-170 Methods of Enforcement: It is a violation of this article for any person to fail to comply with any requirement of this article. The city may enforce this article through any means authorized by law including but not limited to administrative enforcement, civil enforcement, or criminal enforcement. These enforcement methods are in addition to any legally authorized process to enforce the requirements and prohibitions of this article.

PERMITS DEPARTMENT

Is your handyman registered to do work in Windcrest?

The City of Windcrest requires that **all contractors**, from general to plumbers, register their company and employees annually. This protects **YOU** from potential fraud and theft when they perform work at your home. **DO NOT** let them begin work without first obtaining a permit, thereby confirming that they have registered with the city. This permit must be displayed in a front window or door, where it can be seen from the street.

(Sec. 103-220) **"Contractor"** means any person or entity who enters into an oral or written contract with the owner or occupant of real property within the City limits to construct, repair, replace, remodel, add to, alter, convert, or modernize a structure.

If your contractor is not registered, send them our way and we can help them register while they pull a permit. Alternatively, they can fill out the Contractor Registration Application online. All permit and contractor applications can be found on our Permit Requirements page. Go to windcrest-tx.gov, go to the "I Want to..." tab in the top right corner, and then "Get a Building Permit." Applications can be submitted through email at permits@windcrest-tx.gov or in-person at City Hall between 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Mondays, Wednesday-Friday and 8 a.m.-2 p.m. on Tuesdays.





Code Compliance & Enforcement

Despite all the rain we have been getting, I want to thank all the residents who have been keeping up with their property maintenance. As you continue to maintain your properties remember to take time to hydrate, wear protective clothing and take breaks under the shade. I would like to inform all our residents that the alley area behind your fence is also part of your responsibility to maintain. You can find this in Chapter 28 of our ordinances. Please cut the weeds, grass and bushes back away from the main alley roadway, this will allow for easier access to the alley way for weekly trash pickup. As we get blessed with rain, make sure you patrol your property and empty any container holding water. Mosquitos are not only a threat to your neighbors, but to you and your family as well. Pool maintenance is extremely important during this time of year and with some residences opting not to fill their pools just a friendly reminder to please empty the stagnant water accumulating in your pools due to the rainfall. Also, with the temperatures reaching possible record highs, snakes, rodents and other critters will be looking for places to take shelter from the heat, clean the clutter on your property to maintain your hard-earned investment. Please help your community by informing your neighbor about potential maintenance issues that I have mentioned. If within your means or ability, lend a helping hand. Don't forget your backyards, I check those as well.

TCFP Fire Department Inspection

There are two different governing bodies for the fire service in Texas: Texas Commission on Fire Protection (TCFP) and the State Fireman's and Fire Marshal's Association (SFFMA). TCFP is geared more toward the career fire departments, while the SFFMA is more of a volunteer fire department organization. Being a combination department, we follow the guidance of both.

In the state of Texas, if a firefighter wants to get paid to be a firefighter, they must hold a Basic Structural Firefighter certification from the Texas Commission on Fire Protection. Here at the Windcrest Fire Department, we have several volunteer firefighters who have gained their TCFP certification, with the hopes of obtaining a position with a career department someday. Because of the paid firefighters, the volunteers who hold their TCFP certification with us, and the Fire Chief and Assistant Chief holding TCFP certifications, we are required to undergo an inspection every two years. This inspection helps to ensure our agency is meeting the required training requirements, personal protective clothing requirements, and record-keeping requirements found in state law.

I am happy to report, that this June, we not only had our inspection from the state, but we also passed the inspection on the first try with zero deficiencies. This is something that is not easily accomplished, and takes a lot of dedication from the members of the department to achieve. As the Fire Chief, I could not be prouder of this agency and what is has achieved over the last two years. I hope to see us grow even more in the coming years and I look forward to the next TCFP inspection, where we will be sure to pass with no deficiencies again!

A Message From Fire Marshal Zelenak

Hotel and Motel Safety

Vacations and business travel make hotels and motels our home away from home. It is just as important to be prepared and know what you would do in a hotel/motel emergency as it is in your own home.

BE SAFE WHEN TRAVELING!

- Choose a hotel/motel that is protected by both smoke alarms and a fire sprinkler system.
- When you enter your room, review the escape plan posted in your room.
- Take the time to find the exits and count the number of doors between your room and the exit.
- If the fire alarm sounds, leave right away, closing all doors behind you. Use the stairs-never use elevators during a fire.
- If you must escape through smoke, get low and go under the smoke to your exit.

IF YOU CAN'T ESCAPE...

SHUT off fans and air conditioners.

STUFF wet towels in the cracks around the doors.

CALL the Fire Department and let them know your location.

WAIT at the window and signal with a flashlight or light-colored cloth.



With scorching days heading our way, please remember if you have your pets outside, give them fresh water and food every day and that they have shade so they don't suffer from heat exhaustion. When your pools are being serviced and cleaned, remember to have them close the gates after they leave. This way your pets remain in the yard. Also, if your fence has any damage from the rain or it's just time to replace the boards, remember to secure any gaps to secure your pets. While walking the dogs, remember we have a city ordinance that requires the owner to pick up the dog's waste from public or private property.



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



Windcrest Women's Club

fun day out at a parade. This parade is held annually to help support disABILITYsa, which helps children and adults with physical, cognitive and developmental differences and the family and friends who love them.



OH, NO, MY DOG IS MISSING!!!!!!

Now what do I do? Here are the steps that you can follow here in Windcrest.


- Call Police Dispatch at 655-2666 and let them know your dog is loose. Give a good description of your dog and if possible, provide a photo. That way dispatch can let the animal control officer know exactly what kind of dog he is looking for. The Windcrest police officers will also keep an eye open for your dog.
- If you want your neighbors to know about your missing dog, you can go to City Hall and get a free permit allowing you to put out 6 stand-alone signs for two weeks letting everyone know you are looking for your dog. You can get another two-week extension if needed.
- 3. You can even put your dog's photo up at the entrance to the City Hall Post Office in the enclosed bulletin boards. The TxWeACT will be glad to post those photos on their Facebook page.
- 4. A dog can travel as far as seven miles while loose so call all the local cities around us to see if they have picked up your dog or at least seen it.
- Look for your dog on Petfinder, Adopt-a-Pet, Lost dogs San Antonio, Animal Defense League, San Antonio Animal Care Services, and the Humane Society websites or even Craig's List.
