

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the seizure of the circuit board of a gambling device or
3 equipment, altered gambling equipment, or gambling paraphernalia.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Chapter 18, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
6 amended by adding Article 18.095 to read as follows:

7 Art. 18.095. SEIZURE OF CIRCUIT BOARD OF GAMBLING DEVICE,
8 EQUIPMENT, OR PARAPHERNALIA. For purposes of this chapter, an
9 officer directed under a search warrant to search for and seize a
10 gambling device or equipment, altered gambling equipment, or
11 gambling paraphernalia in the discretion of the officer may:

12 (1) seize only the programmable main circuit board of
13 the device, equipment, or paraphernalia if that circuit board is
14 designed as a subassembly or essential part of the device,
15 equipment, or paraphernalia to provide the information necessary
16 for the device, equipment, or paraphernalia to operate as a
17 gambling device or equipment, altered gambling equipment, or
18 gambling paraphernalia;

19 (2) carry the circuit board before the magistrate; and

20 (3) retain custody of the circuit board as the
21 property seized pursuant to the warrant as required under this
22 chapter.

23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
