#### IN MEMORIAM



**Sue-Beall Blanton Shaffer** 

March 3, 1936 - December 28, 2020

Sue-Beall Blanton Shaffer, 84, of Argyle, a longtime Denton County, Texas resident, passed away at Medical City Denton, on December 28, 2020 following complications of surgery. Her husband, Bill, and son, Brian were by her side at the time.

Sue-Beall was born on March 3, 1936, in Fort Worth, TX, to parents, Jenny Louise and Matt S. Blanton, Sr., and delivered by her uncle, Dr. Albert Hooper, a neighborhood obstetrician and gynecologist, who delivered her mother 33 years

earlier. Proud to be a fifth generation Texan, born just a few days before the centennial anniversary of Texas Independence, Sue-Beall was steeped in the history of her native state, beginning in early childhood, and by her mother, a teacher, educated at nearby Texas Wesleyan College and Pennsylvania College for Women; Blanton Elementary in Arlington is named for Sue-Beall's mother, Louise.

Sue-Beall grew up in Arlington, TX, where Louise taught fourth grade and Matt based his professional sales career. She attended John A. Kooken Elementary and Arlington High School, graduating in 1954 as a varsity cheerleader and member of the National Honor Society. She attended UTA (then, Arlington State College) and later graduated from TCU in 1959 with a degree in elementary education. That same year, she and Bill Shaffer, a Dallas police officer, married in Arlington. Sue-Beall taught fifth grade in the Richardson ISD and later taught pre-school at the Dallas Health and Science Museum. Bill retired from the police force in 1976, and the couple began exploring new ventures, founding a successful financial services firm and moving to Argyle after 35 years in Dallas, where they raised two sons, Douglas and Brian.

A tireless volunteer, Sue-Beall worked for numerous institutions and civic organizations, including the Hall of State, The Science Place at Dallas Fair Park, and the Dallas County Heritage Society's Old City Park. She had also served on the Denton County Historical Commission and was a vigorous supporter of her regional chapter of The Daughters of the Republic of Texas. Sue-Beall was also an avid genealogist and a longtime member of the Collin County Genealogical Society.

Sue-Beall is preceded in death by her parents, Matthew, Sr., and Louise and by her son, Douglas. In addition to her husband, Bill Shaffer, and son, Brian Shaffer, she is survived by her brother, Matthew Blanton, Jr.; daughter-in-law Michelle Shaffer; and two granddaughters, Miss Cheryl Shaffer and Miss Sarahbeall Shaffer.

Sue-Beall was laid to rest in a private ceremony on January 4, 2021 at Sparkman Hillcrest Cemetery in Dallas.

### John B. Perkins – WWII Military History Screaming Eagles 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division

John Byron Perkins was born 23 June 1923 in Inglewood, Los Angeles, California to John Perkins and Dixie Elliott. About 1925 the family moved back to Celina, Collin County, Texas where all the family had resided since the 1850's. He attended Celina schools and was on Celina High School's Bobcats football team. He came from a long line of men who served their country via military service. At age 19 he registered for the draft on 29 June 1942.

Pvt. John B. Perkins was inducted into the Army on 28 May 1944 at Camp Wolters, Texas and then went to Camp Fannin, Texas for infantry training. On 22 October 22 1944 he was sent to Fort Benning, Georgia where he received his course in Parachute packing, ground training and jumping from airplanes in flight and was ruled as a qualified Parachutist on 17 November 1944, receiving his wings and diploma. He was in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Parachute Training Regiment, 6<sup>th</sup> Battalion.

In my possession is a military newspaper notice from Volume 43, Number 23 (name and date of newspaper is not noted) about Daddy being awarded his Parachutist Badge.





#### John Perkins Wins Paratrooper Wings, Boots

Fort Benning, GA. – Pvt. John B. Perkins, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Perkins of Celina, has won the right to wear wings and boots of the United States Army paratroopers. He has completed four weeks of jump training, during which time he made five jumps, the last a tactical jump at night involving a combat problem on landing.


Jumping at the parachute school has been steadily developed to a recognized war science. American paratroopers have been recognized throughout the world for their meritorious actions against the enemy.

In addition to producing jumpers, parachute specialist training is given to qualified men in communications, demolition, riggers and parachute maintenance, vital skills for airborne troops.

Perkins is at present on furlough visiting his parents in Celina.

He then went to Ft. Geo. G. Meade, Maryland and from there he left for overseas the latter part of January 1945. When he arrived overseas he was assigned to 101st Airborne Division. He was in France two months then went to Germany (*This information transcribed from a paper most likely written by my grandfather John Perkins*).

The following is information of my father's time in the war covering his locations and battles. I have many photos that he took of the locations where he was stationed. This brief excerpt details battles and locations which was found on several websites including <a href="https://www.ww2-airborne.us/units/506/506.html">https://www.ww2-airborne.us/units/506/506.html</a>.



#### The Ardennes - Battle of the Bulge

On 16 December 1944, The Germans had launched a major offensive at dawn on 16 December, west through the Ardennes Forest, in the lightly held sector of our VII Corps. At that time Shaef's Reserve consisted of the 101<sup>st</sup> and 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Divisions. The 101<sup>st</sup> was ordered to the vitally important town of Bastogne, which was the key to the German counter offensive. From Bastogne radiated several roads that were essential to the German juggernaut. The 101<sup>st</sup> was jammed into trucks for an overnight rush to Bastogne in Belgium on Dec. 18th.

The defense of Bastogne by the 101<sup>st</sup> presented a formidable obstacle to the surging Fifth Panzer Army of Hasso von Manteuffel. In the ensuing days the encircled Currahees and for that matter the entire 101<sup>st</sup> engaged in vicious fighting. The Screaming Eagles suffered heavy casualties including the Currahees' highly regarded 1st Battalion Commander, Lt Col James L LaPrade, as the 506<sup>th</sup> defended Bastogne on the eastern sector of the circular airhead established by General McAuliffe. Like their "brothers" in the other units the 506th fought with what they had and prayed that the C-47s would get through with the vital supplies necessary to sustain them. Finally, on December 26<sup>th</sup> Patton's 4th Armor Division broke through the encirclement and the lifting of the siege of Bastogne began.

On 15 January 1945, the 506<sup>th</sup> Parachute Infantry Regiment took the town of Noville, Belgium, a longtime Division objective. Then on the 20th of January, the 506th moved to the Alsace Province of France where Hitler's "Operation Nordwind" offensive, under the personal direction of Heinrich Himmler, was threatening a sector of the Seventh Army front. While holding the line the regiment changed positions several times while also sending out many patrols. Although the enemy continually shelled their positions, the 506th PIR did not conduct any major operations during this time.

On 23 February 1945, the men of the 506<sup>th</sup> were relieved, and returned to Mourmelon, France. Here General Eisenhower spoke to the 101st Airborne Division when the unit was awarded the Distinguished Unit Citation for its stand at Bastogne. This was the first time in the history of the United States Amy that an entire Division had been so honored.




Made in Mourmelon back in France after we left Haguenau my first place in combat. As the war in Europe was nearing its end, the 506th moved to the Ruhr Pocket on 2 April to help in mop-up operations. Here the 506th went on the line facing the Rhine River south of Dusseldorf, Germany. On the 4th and 5th of May 1945, the 506th received and carried out its final wartime mission - the capture of Berchtesgaden, Hitler's Eagles Nest.


#### CELINA SOLDIER IN AUSTRIA



On 8 May, Colonel "Bounding Bob" Sink accepted the surrender of the German LXXXII Corps, commanded by Lt General Theodor Tolsdorf. The 506th established its command post in Zell Am See, where it remained until the end of July, when it moved to Joigny, France. On 30 November 1945 the regiment was deactivated, and its few remaining members were reassigned to other units.



### His life ended tragically in a tractor mishap just off of FM 455 when he was just 50 years of age.

The progenitor of the Perkins family to arrive in Collin County from Georgia was James T. Perkins and his wife Sarah Lucebia Hall. They settled southwest of the Old Celina Cemetery. They were the great grandparents of John B. Perkins. Their son Jobe Perkins married Lucy Willock whose family arrived in the Celina area in 1854. Celina was founded on land donated by John Willock her father.

#### Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas

The "Newspaper Obituaries Collected from Celina, Texas" will include obituaries from the 1900s through 2010 and was submitted to CCGS by Gayle Maxson, author of three Collin County cemetery books:

- 1. The people of Cottage Hill Cemetery. Denton, Texas: G. Maxson (1999)
- 2. The people of Old Celina Cemetery, Celina, Texas. Decorah, IA: Anundsen Pub. (2002)
- 3. Cottage Hill Cemetery, Collin County, Texas. Decorah, IA: Anundsen Pub. (2004)

A large portion of the obituaries were clipped from old Collin County newspapers by Juanita (Francis) Maxson, Gayle's deceased mother-in-law. Jane Huddleston at the Celina Heritage Museum allowed Gayle to transcribe six scrapbooks full of old obituaries (cut out and pasted with no documentation by persons long deceased). The Celina Record newspaper began publishing weekly in 1902. Papers from 1923-1924 are missing from the collection.

The site of the crash is located directly behind Beal Aerospace's building. Martin Eugene Wright, 43, was piloting the single-engine Piper Cherokee 180 when it crashed into a railroad trestle over Stewart Creek, about four miles north of State Highway 121. His passenger was 28 year old Allen Presley Calhoun. According to previous reports, witnesses said the plane was flying at a low altitude and skimming the tops of trees until it dropped below the tree line and crashed. Calhoun's wife, Amy, also is an employee at Beal Aerospace and was working when the accident occurred. According to information from Frisco police, she was one of their main witnesses. Beal officials said the two men had left work early Friday afternoon to go on a personal flying trip. Wade Gates, director of corporate affairs at Beal Aerospace, said workers at the company were shaken up by the accident. "We're a very tight-knit organization. We are a very close group. Something like this strikes very close to home' Gates said. The Beal Aerospace building, at 8000 N. Dallas Parkway, houses the company's corporate offices and also is an assembly building. The company builds large rockets used to put commercial satellites into orbit. In a statement, Gates said Beal Aerospace conveys its deepest sympathies to the families of its two co-workers. "It's a sad day whenever you lose a good friend - it's a tragedy when you lose two. Our two friends and colleagues will be missed very, very much." On Saturday, National Transportation Safety Board officials said Wright and Calhoun had taken off from Aero Country, a private airstrip in west McKinney, Texas about 15 minutes before crashing. The accident was reported to Frisco emergency authorities at 4:54 p.m. The plane was moved off the bridge onto a nearby field by a crane on the night following the accident. Also on Saturday, officials from the Federal Aviation Administration, the NTSB, Piper and Textron Lycoming, the company that manufactured the plane's engine, attended a briefing and went to the crash site to begin the investigation.
