- 2 meaningful accomplishments remain to comfort the family and friends
- 3 of Herbert Hugh Campbell of Paris, who passed away on April 14,
- 4 2009, at the age of 69; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Mr. Campbell was a Paris native, born to Cora
- 6 Virginia and Louis Campbell on April 26, 1939; he was a member of
- 7 the 1951 state champion Little League baseball team and the 1955
- 8 District 9AA varsity state championship baseball team; he lettered
- 9 in football, basketball, and baseball at Paris High School and was a
- 10 member of the National Honor Society and the 1957
- 11 all-district/all-state football team; and
- WHEREAS, In 1957, Mr. Campbell enrolled at Texas A&M
- 13 University, where he was active in the Corps of Cadets, earning the
- 14 rank of company commander his senior year; he also joined the Ross
- 15 Volunteers, the honor guard for the governor of the State of Texas,
- 16 and was a student trainer for both the Aggie basketball and football
- 17 teams, including a year as trainer for Coach Bear Bryant; and
- WHEREAS, After graduating with a bachelor's degree in
- 19 petroleum engineering in 1961, Mr. Campbell was commissioned as a
- 20 second lieutenant in the United States Army, participating in the
- 21 rebuilding of Korea after the war; following his service, he worked
- 22 for Gulf Oil Company as a petroleum engineer and then as an
- 23 executive of Reserve Equipment Service Corporation; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Campbell returned to Paris in 1986 as the

- 1 director of city utilities; in addition to overseeing the expansion
- of both the water and sewer treatment plants for the community, he
- 3 taught water utility calculation classes throughout the state for
- 4 others in the water industry, and he created magic shows for
- 5 teaching schoolchildren about water conservation; his public
- 6 career ended with his retirement in 2004, but he continued to
- 7 contribute as a member of the Paris Water Committee; and
- 8 WHEREAS, An active volunteer and supporter of youth and adult
- 9 sports, Mr. Campbell was president of the board of the Boys Club of
- 10 Paris, receiving the group's Wall of Honor Award in 2001; he became
- involved with the Adult Special Olympics in 2005 and found great joy
- 12 working with each athlete; he also served as the head of delegation
- 13 for the Lamar County Contenders; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Campbell maintained a lifelong interest in
- 15 education, local affairs, and his alma mater; he was president of
- 16 the East Texas Regional School of Tyler and a Rotarian, and he
- 17 belonged to the Paris Noon Optimist Club, where he was co-chair of
- 18 the 1986-1987 Raymond Berry Football Classic; in addition, he
- 19 enjoyed his affiliation with the Lamar County A&M Club, serving as
- 20 its president from 1987 to 1988, and was involved in the Texas A&M
- 21 Letterman's Association and the Association of Former Students
- 22 Century Club; and
- WHEREAS, A member of First United Methodist Church, Mr.
- 24 Campbell was a loving family man who placed civic responsibility
- 25 above personal interest, and though he will be deeply missed, he
- 26 will always be remembered with great affection and admiration; now,
- 27 therefore, be it
