5	SECTION 1. Chapter 12, Agriculture Code, is amended by									
6	adding Section 12.0026 to read as follows:									
7	Sec. 12.0026. INTERAGENCY FARM-TO-SCHOOL COORDINATION TASK									
8	FORCE. (a) To promote a healthy diet for schoolchildren and the									
9	business of small to mid-sized local farms and ranches, the									
10	interagency farm-to-school coordination task force shall develop									
11	and implement a plan to facilitate the availability of locally									
12	grown food products in public schools.									
13	(b) The task force is composed of:									
14	(1) a representative of:									
15	(A) the department, appointed by the									
16	<pre>commissioner;</pre>									
17	(B) the Texas Education Agency, appointed by the									
18	commissioner of education; and									
19	(C) the Department of State Health Services,									
20	appointed by the commissioner of state health services; and									
21	(2) at least one representative of each of the									
22	following groups, appointed by the commissioner:									
23	(A) fruit and vegetable producer organizations;									
24	(B) school food service organizations;

1	(C) food distribution businesses;
2	(D) child nutrition and advocacy organizations;
3	(E) parent organizations;
4	(F) educational institutions that conduct
5	research in the areas of agriculture and nutrition; and
6	(G) health nutrition educators who serve school

8	(c) A member of the task force serves at the will of the
9	official who appointed the member.
10	(d) The representative of the department serves as
11	presiding officer. The task force may elect other necessary
12	officers from its members.
13	(e) The task force shall meet at the call of the presiding
14	officer.
15	(f) The agency whose commissioner appoints a member is
16	responsible for the expenses of a member's service on the task
17	force. A member of the task force is not entitled to additional
18	compensation for serving on the task force.
19	(g) Each appropriate agency or group represented on the task
20	force shall provide the personnel and resources necessary to
21	implement a task force measure under this section.
22	(h) The task force shall:
23	(1) design new education resources, or review or
24	update existing resources, on nutrition and food education that may
25	be used by schools and school districts;
26	(2) expand food-focused experiential education
27	programs;

- 3 (9) conduct any other activity considered by the task
- 4 force as necessary to achieve its goals under this section.
- 5 (i) The task force may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
- 6 donations from public and private entities to use for the purposes
- 7 of this section.
- 8 (j) The task force may use any existing program or procedure
- 9 that it determines to be useful in performing its duties under this
- 10 section.
- SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2009, the
- 12 Department of Agriculture shall establish the interagency
- 13 farm-to-school coordination task force as required by Section
- 14 12.0026, Agriculture Code, as added by this Act.
- 15 (b) Not later than February 1, 2010, the commissioners of
- 16 the Department of Agriculture, the Texas Education Agency, and the
- 17 Department of State Health Services shall appoint members of the
- 18 interagency farm-to-school coordination task force, as required by
- 19 Section 12.0026, Agriculture Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
