13	(b) A county may not provide assistance to an individual
14	under this section until the commissioners court of the county:
15	(1) has implemented policies and procedures to ensure
16	that money granted under this section is used for the public purpose
17	of providing disaster relief for emergency food, shelter,
18	transportation, or other items or services necessary for public
19	health and safety; and
20	(2) has determined that financial assistance from
21	other sources, including this state and the federal government, is
22	unavailable or inadequate.
23	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
24	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
