2 relating to the requirements for a smoke detector in multifamily
3 and other residential units.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. This bill is enacted to honor the memory of
6 Sephra Burks.

7 SECTION 2. Section 92.254, Property Code, is amended by
8 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
9 follows:

10 (a) A smoke detector must be:

11 (1) designed to detect both the visible and invisible
12 products of combustion;

13 (2) designed with an alarm audible to a person in the
14 bedrooms it serves;

15 (3) powered by battery, alternating current, or other
16 power source as required by local ordinance;

17 (4) tested and listed for use as a smoke detector by
18 Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., Factory Mutual Research
19 Corporation, or United States Testing Company, Inc.; and

20 (5) in good working order.

21 (a-1) If requested by a tenant as an accommodation for a
22 person with a hearing-impairment disability or as required by law
23 as a reasonable accommodation for a person with a
24 hearing-impairment disability, a smoke detector must, in addition

1 to complying with Subsection (a), be capable of alerting a
2 hearing-impaired person in the bedrooms it serves.

3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 2010._____
