# FOREWCRD

The <u>Inventory of the County Archives of Texas</u> is one of a number of bibliographies of historical materials prepared throughout the United States by workers on the Historical Records Survey Program of the Work Projects Administration. The publication herewith presented, an inventory of the archives of Wilson County, is number 247 of the Texas series of counties.


The Historical Records Survey Program was undertaken in the winter of 1935-36 for the purpose of providing useful employment to needy unemployed historians, lawyers, teachers, and research and clerical workers. In carrying out this objective, the project was organized to compile inventories of historical materials, particularly the unpublished government documents and records which are basic in the administration of local government, and which provide invaluable data for students of political, economic, and social history. The archival guide herewith presented is intended to meet the requirements of day-to-day administration by the officials of the county, and also the needs of lawyers, business men and other citizens who require facts from the public records for the proper conduct of their affairs. The volume is so designed that it can be used by the historian in his research in unprinted sources in the same way he uses the library card catalog for printed sources.

The inventories produced by the Historical Records Survey Frogram attempt to do more than give merely a list of records--they attempt further to sketch in the historical background of the county or other unit of government, and to describe precisely and in detail the organization and functions of the government agencies whose records they list. The county, town, and other local inventories for the entire state will, when completed, constitute an encyclopedia of local government as well as a bibliography of local archives.

The successful conclusion of the work of the Historical Records Survey Program, even in a single county, would not be possible without the support of public officials, historical and legal specialists, and many other groups in the community. Their cooperation is gratefully acknowledged.

The Survey Program was organized and has been directed by Luther H. Evans, and operates as a nation-wide series of locally sponsored projects in the Division of Professional and Service Projects, of which Mrs. Florence Kerr, Assistant Commissioner, is in charge.

The Texas Historical Records Survey is a unit of the Texas State-wide Records Project sponsored by the Bureau of Research in the Social Sciences, of The University of Texas, and operates under the Research and Records Section of the Division of Professional and Service Projects of the Work Projects Administration. It was organized on November 1, 1939, to carry on the work of the Texas unit of the Historical Records Survey, which operated as part of a Federal Project through August 31, 1939, and as a separate state-wide project from September 1 through October 31.

Early in 1936, following the establishment of the Survey in November 1935 by executive letter of President Roosevelt, Luther H. Evans, National Director, organized the Survey and extended it to every state in the Union. In Texas, it was initiated on March 14, 1936, with J. Frank Davis, State Supervisor of the Federal Writers' Project, as State Supervisor, and Ike Moore as assistant. The Survey became an independent part of Federal Project No. 1 in November, and Mr. Moore was made State Supervisor, with Charles W. Hodges as assistant; Mr. Davis continued as State Supervisor of the Writers' Project. When Mr. Moore resigned on February 1, 1939, to accept the directorship of the San Jacinto Museum of History, Mr. Hodges became State Supervisor. Mr. Hodges resigned on October 31, 1939, to become State Field Supervisor of the Texas State-wide Records Project. Paul E. Fidler has been State Supervisor of the Texas State-wide Records Project since its organization on October 16, 1939, and John W. B. Foringer became Assistant State Supervisor in charge of the Texas Historical Records Survey editorial unit on November 1, 1939.

The objective of the Survey in Texas has been the preparation of complete inventories of each county, municipality, and other local governmental unit. A complete inventory of county records includes, in addition to descriptive entries for all extant county records, a historical sketch of the county, and a map of its past and present boundaries; an essay on the governmental organization and records system, with structural charts; a discussion of the conditions under which the records are preserved, accompanied by floorplans of the courthouse; and essays detailing the legal status and functions of each county official and agency, accompanied by lists of records required by law. Three county inventories have been published--Denton, Sabine, and Guadalupe. Preparation of additional complete inventories is in progress.

The present publication contains an inventory of the records of Wilson County and a discussion of their housing, a county map, a brief statement on general information about the county, and a list of laws specifically applicable to it. Separate sections are devoted to the various officials and agencies. Within bureaus, records are arranged by subject. A condensed form of entry is used, giving information as to titles, limiting dates, labeling, and location of each records series. Brief descriptions of contents have also been included; no attempt has been made to give a full report on contents. Other county inventories of this type will be published as the listing of the archives of the county is completed, in order to make bibliographies of these important historical

source materials available. Using these entry drafts as a basis, the Survey plans to publish full studies as soon as possible.

Under the direction of Perry Davis, supervisor of the San Antonio district, the records of Wilson County were inventoried by field workers M. W. Fiske, Thomas Ragsdale, and Thomas E. Willis during August 1937.

A recheck of workers' forms was made in the state editorial office by Aartje Van Beekum, Stanley Holm, and Mary Rebecca Chaffin, under the supervision of Virginia Newton, editor-in-chief. Mr. Davis and Mr. Holm spent three days in August 1939 in the county courthouse, at Floresville, checking the entry draft for accuracy.

Field workers and recheckers are responsible for the accuracy of the entries. The map was prepared by John M. Steinfeldt, Jr. The essays were written by Mary Lewis Jones. Louisa Aja was in charge of preparation of the indexes. Virginia Huff, supervising editor, is responsible for final editing of the volume. Blanche B. La Dura superintended stencilcutting and proofreading.

The <u>Inventory of County Archives of Texas</u> will, when completed, consist of a separate volume for each county of the state. Each unit of the series is numbered according to the particular county's respective position in the alphabetical list of the 254 counties. Thus, the volume for Wilson County, herewith presented, is No. 247. Units of the <u>Inventory</u> are issued in mimeographed form for free distribution to state and local public officials, public libraries in Texas, and to a limited number of libraries and governmental agencies outside the state. Requests for information concerning particular units should be addressed to the State Supervisor of the Texas State-wide Records Project.

The Survey appreciates the cordial support of WPA officials in all of its undertakings. Editorial criticism of Dr. Evans, Director of the WPA Historical Records Survey Program, and his assistant, Edythe Weiner, has been of real assistance. The courteous cooperation of Wilson County officials is gratefully acknowledged.

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### 1. WILSON COUNTY

Wilson County, Texas, with its seat of government at Floresville, is in the south central part of the state. The county is exceptionally well adapted to agriculture and stockraising, having a surface that varies from level prairie lands to gently rolling hills. The San Antonio and Cibolo Rivers furnish water for the county, and there is sufficient timber--pecan, hickory, blackjack, and mesquite. The soil, a light sandy loam, is very fertile.

Before the coming of white man, Wilson County territory fell within the hunting range of Comanches, Tonkawas, and Lipans.<sup>1</sup> Early Spanish explorers and travelers on their way to the East Texas missions must have been the first white men to pass through what is now Wilson County. At a little later period in the history of the region, the American filibusters Magee and Long passed that way en route to San Antonio.<sup>2</sup>

S. and J. Arocha, Francisco Flores, and Erasmo Seguin were some of the most famous of the early settlers of the region. For many years, though the country was thickly dotted with ranches, there was no settlement large enough to be called a village in the entire Wilson County region. Sutherland Springs was established by 1831, however, and other small villages sprang up nearby.<sup>3</sup>

In February 1860, Wilson County was created, and named for James C. Wilson, member of the Mier Expedition, and Texas statesman.<sup>4</sup> Dr. G. J. Houston was appointed commissioner to organize the new county.<sup>5</sup> By August 1860 the elections had been held, and the commissioners court met and listed the following county officials: William Sutherland, chief justice; Daniel Bird, John M. McAlister, Rafael Herrera, and Vicente Cantu, commissioners; A. G. Pickett, clerk; and S. W. Barker, sheriff. It was ordered by the court that a storehouse formerly occupied by John Irvin and Company be used as a courthouse pending other arrangements.<sup>6</sup>

Sutherland Springs had been designated by the act of creation as temporary county seat.<sup>7</sup> After several attempts to locate the county seat permanently,<sup>8</sup> the present courthouse was constructed in Floresville in 1885.<sup>9</sup>

Floresville, with a population of 1,850, is the largest town in the county. Other towns are Lavernia, Sutherland Springs, and Stockdale.

Agriculture and stockräising are the most important industries of the region, but there is some business connected with the oil and gas found in the county. At Saspamco there is a modern tile manufacturing plant which utilizes the abundant building clays found in the county.10

The county has shown a steady increase in population, from 2,556 in 1870 to 17,606 in 1930. A 1938 estimate gave it a population of 19,000.

Boundary Changes

The act of the legislature creating Wilson County from Bexar and Karnes Counties defined its boundaries, counter clockwise, as follows:


beginning on the west bank of the Cibolo, at the mouth of the Martinez creek, thence on a straight line to the north-east corner of Atascosa county line, thence south thirty-nine degrees east with Atascosa line to the north-west corner of Karnes county; thence same course continued four and three quarter miles along the said Karnes county line; thence north fifty-one degrees east to the south-west boundary line of Gonzales county; thence north thirty-nine degrees west with Gonzales county line to the south-east boundary line of Guadalupe county; thence south with said line to the Cibolo; thence up the Cibolo with its meanders to the place of beginning.<sup>(1)</sup>


By this act the boundary lines between Wilson County and the counties of Bexar, Atascosa, Karnes, and--with the exception of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles--Gonzales, were established as they exist today. There have been only two changes in the boundaries of the county since its creation. Both were connected with the Wilson-Guadalupe line.

On January 19, 1869, the Constitutional Convention passed a declaration which changed the name of the county from Wilson to Cibolo, in addition to ordering the first boundary change, as follows:

That all that part of the county of Guadalupe lying and being south of a direct line running from the mouth of Martinez Creek, in the Cibolo river, to the extreme western corner of Gonzales county, /be included in Wilson County./12

The effect of this declaration was to include the projecting angle of Guadalupe County within the boundaries of Wilson County, thus making it a five-sided polygon with all straight sides. The new name of the county was apparently never recognized by the inhabitants, and appears to have lapsed from non-enforcement, for in 1874, when the boundaries of the county were again changed, it was referred to as Wilson, 13

The second boundary change was authorized by act of March 13, 1874. This act, also defining the boundaries counter clockwise, established the present limits of Wilson County, as follows:

Beginning on the west bank of the Cibolo creek at the mouth of the Martinez creek, thence on a straight line to the northeast corner of Atascosa county, thence south thirty-nine degrees east with Atascosa county line to the northwest corner of Karnes county, as at this time established; thence north fifty-one degrees east to the southwest boundary line of Gonzales county; thence north thirty-nine degrees west with the line of Gonzales county to the southeast boundary line of Guadalupe county; thence with the said southeast line of Guadalupe county to the northeast line of the Austin Clement's survey; thence with the said northeast line of Clement's survey to the north corner of the same; thence on a direct line to the point where the northwest line of the Manuel Ximene's survey crosses Elm creek, thence with the said northwest line of the Ximene's survey to the Cibolo creek; thence up said Cibolo creek to the place of beginning.14

The first change in the boundaries of Wilson County, that of January 19, 1869, had the effect of increasing its territorial extent and of straightening the Guadalupe line. The second change deprived it of some of the territory added in 1869, but again added territory from Guadalupe County, a small triangular strip including the Austin Clement survey. The addition of this small amount of territory created an angle in the Wilson-Gonzales line which most maps fail to show. The net result of this second boundary change was directly opposite to that of the first: it slightly decreased the territorial extent of the county and provided the Wilson-Guadalupe line with an acute angle. Taken together, however, the two boundary changes resulted in an appreciable increase in the size of the county, since the number of square miles subtracted in 1874 was considerably smaller than the number added in 1869.

# 2. HOUSING, CARE, AND ACCESSIBILITY OF RECORDS

When Wilson County was created in 1860, Sutherland Springs was made its county seat.<sup>1</sup> In 1867 the county seat was moved to Lodi, and in March 1871 back to Sutherland Springs, only to be moved back to Lodi in July of the same year. In 1872 a contract was let for a courthouse at Floresville, and it was completed in the latter part of the year.<sup>2</sup> A large fireproof vault was bought under great protest, but when the courthouse burned in 1883, the safe proved its worth by preserving most of the valuable records and papers of the county. In the same year a contract was let for the building of a frame courthouse,<sup>3</sup> but this contract was repealed by the court which sat on August 14, 1883, and decreed

that a substantial house should be built at once. It is therefore ordered and decreed by the commissioners court of Wilson County that steps immediately /be/ taken to build a good substantial convenient and secure Court House on the public square in the town of Floresville in the county of Wilson. Said house to be built of brick or stone to be of sufficient size to afford accomodation to the District and other courts and office for all County officers of said County with suitable jury and Witness rooms. And the said house shall cost about \$20,000.00 or thereabouts. Twenty thousand dollars. . .4

This courthouse, standing on the public square in Floresville, is a twostory structure of brick, 91 feet long, 71 feet wide, and approximately 50 feet high, and has been in use since it was completed in 1885.<sup>5</sup> The building was remodeled in 1936 by WPA Project No. 136, and the old brick walls were covered with stucco and plaster. At this time a basement storeroom was constructed below the treasurer's office.<sup>6</sup>

The building is generally free of dust, soot, and dampness. Ventilation is poor, there being few doors and windows. Lighting conditions, however, are good, all the offices being provided with large, covered electric globes. The walls and floors of all the offices are in excellent condition. The flooring on the ground level is of concrete, and on the second floor of wood. All of the offices have plastered walls and wooden ceilings. On the first floor all of the offices have 12-foot ceilings, and on the second floor, 10foot-8-inch ceilings.

The courthouse faces west, but may be entered from each of the four sides. The main entrance, on the west, opens into a lobby 33 by 30 feet. An 8-foot corridor, running the full length of the building, connects this lobby with the east entrance. A similar corridor connects the north and south entrances. Two stairways lead from the lobby on the ground level to the anteroom of the district court on the second floor. The basement vault has only one entrance, a trapdoor on the outside of the building. This door, located just to the right of the south entrance to the courthouse, opens immediately on the head of the basement stairs. The vault has a dirt floor, brick walls, and concrete ceiling. Since there is no ventilation, the room has a very unpleasant atmosphere; and even though it is free of soot, it is dusty, and undoubtedly becomes damp in the rainy seasons. There are no facilities for artificial lighting in this vault, but a fair amount of natural light filters in through the open door. This basement room is used as a general storage vault, and houses obsolete records of the various county offices. There are 162 linear feet of wooden shelves along the walls, on which are stored 142 linear feet of bound volumes and 10 linear feet of . unbound, miscellaneous materials. Additional shelving could be placed in the central part of the room.

County agencies located on the first floor are the offices of the commissioners court, county judge, county clerk, sheriff, county attorney, tick inspector, county school superintendent, and those of the tax assessorcollector and county treasurer, both of which have adjoining vaults.

On the second floor are the district courtroom with two adjoining jury rooms, and the office of the district clerk.

<u>Commissioners Court</u>. The commissioners courtroom, located on the first floor, is 18 by 18. This room is separated from the county judge's office by an archway. There is no shelving in the room; all of the records of the court are kept by the county clerk in his office.

<u>County Clerk</u>. The county clerk's office, located on the first floor, is 35 by 30 feet. The clerk has custody of all of the records of the commissioners court, of the county court, and of all those which he makes and preserves as recorder for the country. All of these records are housed in the county clerk's office, which is vault-like in construction. Also housed here are one volume and three file boxes of justice court material, two file boxes of tax assessor-collector's records, two file boxes of school superintendent's records, and two volumes of records belonging to the county surveyor. There are 719 linear feet of shelving along the east and west walls and under a writing desk in the center of this office, housing 662 linear feet of bound volumes. There are also 25 linear feet of unbound material housed in a center shelf 7 by 4 feet, with 25 linear feet of shelving. There are also 415 standard size file boxes, of which 330 are in use. Two desks, five tables, and six chairs are available to anyone who wishes to consult the records.

Housing, Care, and Accessibility of Records

District Court. The district courtroom, 63 by 45 feet, two adjoining jury rooms, and the office of the district clerk occupy all the second floor. The clerk's office, in which are kept all of the records of the district court, is 15 by 12 feet. Along the north wall are 36 linear feet of steel roller shelving, housing 24 linear feet of bound volumes. The office also houses a fireproof steel safe, 42 by 72 by 28 inches; a fireproof cabinet 34 by 80 by 18 inches; a wooden cabinet, 89 by 36 inches, with 60 drawers 14 inches deep; and 112 steel file boxes, each 11 by 5 by 14 inches. The record space is ample for the present, but there is no room for expansion. One table and four chairs are in the office for the accommodation of persons using the records housed there.

<u>County Court</u>. This court has no courtroom of its own, but meets in the office of the county judge or in the district courtroom. The records of the county court are kept by the county clerk, and are discussed under that heading.

Justice of the Peace Court. The justice of the peace, precinct No. 1, has an office over the Red and White Store across from the courthouse. All of his records, except those already mentioned as being in the office of the county clerk, are kept in this office.

County Attorney. The county attorney's office, a room on the first floor, is 16 by 10 feet. There is no shelving in the room, and no records are housed there.

Sheriff. The sheriff's office, a room on the first floor, is 27 by 20 feet. The sheriff's records are housed in this office, on two tables. There are 4 tables, 4 desks, 14 chairs, and 1 bench for the use of the public.

Tax Assessor-Collector. The tax assessor-collector has a main office 26 by 20 feet. No records are housed in this office, even though there is ample space. The records of the office are kept in the vault, which is divided into two sections: the first 13 by 8 and the second  $10\frac{1}{2}$  by 10 feet. In this vault are also 12 file boxes and 1 bundle of commissioners court records, 4 volumes of district court records, 1 volume and 1 file box of county court records, and 5 file boxes from the school superintendent's office. In the vault are 92 linear feet of steel roller shelving, housing 84 linear feet of bound volumes, and 8 linear feet of miscellaneous material. There is ample room for more records without expansion of shelving. The vault is equipped with two tables and two chairs for the use of those inquiring into the records housed there. In addition to these accommodations, there are two desks, four tables, a long counter, and four chairs in the tax assessor-collector's main office.

<u>County Treasurer</u>. The county treasurer has a main office and vault on the first floor. The office is 22 by 20 feet. Along the east and west walls are 68 linear feet of wooden shelves, on which are filed 38 linear feet of miscellaneous materials. There is ample room for additional records without the installation of more shelving. Four tables and six chairs afford Abbreviations, Symbols, and Explanatory Notes

accommodations for persons using the records. The vault, 8 by 6 feet, opens off the west end of the treasurer's main office. It has 223 linear feet of steel roller and wooden shelves, housing 200 linear feet of bound volumes, and 96 file boxes, each 11 by 5 by 14 inches. In addition to records of the county treasurer, there are also housed here 33 volumes and 6 file boxes of district court records, and 370 volumes of tax assessor-collector's records. There is sufficient storage space at present. Two tables and six chairs are for the use of the general public.

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<u>County Board of School Trustees</u>. This board has no office space in the courthouse, but usually meets in the county school superintendent's office. All of its records are kept by the county school superintendent, who is its secretary.

<u>County School Superintendent</u>. The county school superintendent's office, 18 by 14 feet, is on the first floor. There are, in addition to the records of the department, six file boxes of commissioners court records housed in this office. There is ample space at present. One desk and four chairs are provided for the use of persons interested in the records of this office.

### Explanatory Notes

In the inventory proper, each record series is described in a separate entry. Although the records are shown under the office or agency of origin or final destination and are grouped by subject matter, entries are numbered consecutively throughout the inventory in one series (1-304).

Entries are of two kinds: the master entry, describing the record indicated by the title; and the artificial entry, which cannot be located in the county by title, being included with other recordings.

Entry titles shown in all capital letters are those appearing on volumes or file boxes, or, if enclosed in parentheses, the titles assigned to containers not titled. Parenthetical titles added to actual titles, and shown with initial capitals only, have been supplied to clarify titles or to correct misnomers. The current or most recent title is used as the title of the entry, with inclusive dates of the series; earlier variations of title are shown, with limiting dates.

First and last dates covered by a particular record are shown in the title-line of the entry. Continuous records are shown by a hyphen between the beginning and closing dates, as 1860-95; or by two dashes after a date, indicating the record is current, as 1915--, lapses in the record are indicated by a comma between the inclusive dates, as 1901-6, 1912-14.

Numbers or letters in parentheses after the number of volumes or file boxes indicate labeling.

Abbreviations, Symbols, and Explanatory Notes

Title-line cross-references are used to complete a series kept separately for a period of years, or to trace location of an artificial entry.

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To correlate closely related records, such as original reports, shown under the office of destination, and copies of the reports, shown under office of origin, the third-paragraph cross-reference is used. The thirdparagraph cross-reference is also used, in some instances, to show prior and subsequent records, where the purpose of the records is apparently the same, but the form is different.

"See also" cross-references placed after subject headings refer to records classified under a different grouping within the same office or under another office, but dealing with the same subject matter.

If no statement is made concerning the condition of records, it is assumed that they are in good condition.

Volume, file box, and map dimensions are given in inches. Dimensions for volumes are given in the sequence of height, width, thickness; dimensions for file boxes, in the sequence of height, width, depth.

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
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
