#### Message From the TMB President: COVID-19 Response

The past months have been incredibly challenging for countless individuals across the entire globe. These unprecedented times have demanded much from the public, our patients, and fellow health care workers alike. COVID-19 has also required all of us to adapt quickly to an ever-

evolving situation.

Eight weeks ago, when Governor Abbott issued his emergency declaration, the Texas Medical Board acted swiftly to identify, seek approval for, and implement procedures to help our licensees respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency. In less than 24 hours after Governor Abbott's emergency declaration, waivers had been approved expanding the use of telemedicine, disaster licensing procedures had been implemented to aid the health care workforce, and deadlines for license renewal and completion of continuing education hours were immediately extended for our licensees.

In the weeks since, further relief was granted for chronic pain patients to continue needed treatment, to applicants seeking licensure to enter the state's health care workforce, and physicians were given greater practice flexibility for supervising and delegating to medical residents and other health care workers during the COVID-19 response. The Board also worked with the Governor's Office to help licensees navigate several mandated orders. These are just a few highlights of the Board's ongoing work during the pandemic.

TEMPORARY SUSPENSION/RESTRICTION

Butler, David Tanksley, M.D., Lic. No. K4866, Austin On April 20, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board temporarily suspended, without notice, the Texas medical license of David Tanksley Butler, M.D., after determining his continuation in the practice of medicine poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The suspension was effective immediately. The Board panel found that on April 15, 2020, Dr. Butler was arrested by the Austin Police Department and charged with possession of child pornography, a 3rd Degree Felony. A temporary suspension hearing with notice will be held as soon as practicable with 10 days' notice to Dr. Butler, unless the hearing is specifically waived by Dr. Butler. The temporary suspension remains in place until the Board takes further action.

Cordes, Brett McCormack, M.D., Lic. No. N1594, Houston On April 20, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board temporarily suspended, without notice, the Texas medical license of Brett McCormack Cordes, M.D., after determining his continuation in the practice of medicine poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The suspension was effective immediately. The Board panel found that Dr. Cordes currently suffers from a likely impairment related to the use or diversion of controlled substances that makes him a threat to patient or public safety. A temporary suspension hearing with notice will be held as soon as practicable with 10 days' notice to Dr. Cordes, unless the hearing is specifically waived by Dr. Cordes. The temporary suspension remains in place until the Board takes further action.

Garcia, Rafael Fermin, M.D., Lic. No. J3700, Corpus Christi On February 12, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board temporarily suspended, without notice, the Texas medical license of Rafael Fermin Garcia, M.D., after determining his continuation in the practice of medicine poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The suspension was effective immediately. The Board panel found that on January 5, 2020, Dr. Garcia was arrested by the Lamesa Police Department in the Medical Arts Emergency Room in Lamesa, Texas for Public Intoxication. Dr. Garcia was allegedly on call in the Emergency Room at the time of arrest. A temporary suspension hearing with notice will be

held as soon as practicable with 10 days' notice to Dr. Garcia, unless the hearing is specifically waived by Dr. Garcia. The temporary suspension remains in place until the Board takes further action.

Inbody, Steven Bryce, M.D., Lic. No. G7443, Houston On January 17, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board temporarily restricted, with notice, the Texas medical license of Steven Bryce Inbody, M.D., after determining his continuation in the unrestricted practice of medicine poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The restriction was effective immediately. Dr. Inbody is prohibited from engaging in the treatment of chronic pain as defined by Board rule; shall not possess, prescribe or distribute controlled substances in Texas; and shall not be permitted to supervise or delegate prescriptive authority to a physician assistant or advanced practice nurse or supervise a surgical assistant. The Board panel found that on or around September 18, 2019, Dr. Inbody was arrested on charges of conspiracy to unlawfully distribute and dispense controlled substances and other related charges which resulted in a temporary suspension by the Board. Dr. Inbody surrendered his DEA controlled substances registration, denies the criminal charges and has pleaded not guilty. The Court has prohibited Dr. Inbody from any employment involving the distribution of controlled substances, writing or filling of prescriptions, distributing controlled substances and pre-signing prescriptions. The temporary restriction remains in place until the Board takes further action.

Leavitt, Lewis A., III, M.D. Lic. No. F9718, Houston

On January 6, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board temporarily suspended, without notice, the Texas medical license of Lewis A. Leavitt, III, M.D., after determining his continuation in the practice of medicine poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The suspension was effective immediately. The Board panel found that Dr. Leavitt engaged in unprofessional and dishonorable conduct by having a sexual relationship with a patient and was nontherapeutically prescribing several controlled substances to the patient. Dr. Leavitt was also arrested and charged with harassment by telephone, a misdemeanor offense, on or around December 7, 2019. A temporary suspension hearing with notice will be held as soon as practicable with 10 days' notice to Dr. Leavitt, unless the hearing is specifically waived by Dr. Leavitt. The temporary suspension remains in place until the Board takes further action.

Marino, Barbara Doyle, M.D., Lic. No. H7724, Houston On February 7, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board temporarily suspended, with notice, the Texas medical license of Barbara Doyle Marino, M.D., after determining her continuation in the practice of medicine poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The suspension was effective immediately. The Board panel found that on August 23, 2019, a sealed arrest warrant was issued for Dr. Marino's arrest in connection with conspiracy to unlawfully distribute and dispense controlled substances and aiding and abetting, in violation of federal laws. The temporary suspension remains in place until the Board takes further action.

Rios-Perez, Jimmi, M.D., Lic. No. P1812, McAllen On April 2, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Medical Board temporarily suspended, without notice, the Texas medical license of Jimmi Rios-Perez, M.D., after determining his continuation in the practice of medicine poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The suspension was effective immediately. The Board panel found that Dr. Rios -Perez is the subject of several criminal complaints made to the McAllen Police Department by three patients and two employees alleging inappropriate conduct and sexual assault. Additionally, the panel found that Dr. Rios-Perez violated his 2018 Agreed Order requiring him to have a chaperone present during the examination of a patient. A temporary suspension hearing with notice will be held as soon as practicable with 10 days' notice to Dr. Rios-Perez, unless the hearing is specifically waived by Dr. Rios-Perez. The temporary suspension remains in place until the Board takes further action.

#### **QUALITY OF CARE**

Blackwell, Michael Lee, M.D., Lic. No. J3695, Tomball On March 6, 2020, the Board and Michael Lee Blackwell, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order on Formal Filing requiring him to within one year complete the medical recordkeeping course offered by the University of California San Diego Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (PACE) program; and within one year complete at least eight hours of CME in post-operative exams and recognizing complications. The Board found Dr. Blackwell did not adequately document his physical exam findings post-operatively and did not note any findings which would indicate a surgical complication. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

### Contreras, Christine Ann, M.D., Lic. No. N8176, San Antonio

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Christine Ann Contreras, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring her to have her practice monitored by another physician for eight consecutive monitoring cycles; within one year complete the medical recordkeeping course offered by the University of California San Diego Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (PACE) program; and within one year complete at least eight hours of in-person CME, divided as follows: four hours in risk management and four hours in prescribing. The Board found Dr. Contreras prescribed to a patient she should have known was using illicit drugs, did not document her rationale for continuing to prescribe, instead relying on the patient's denials. There were no clinic visits documented for another patient for eight months that Dr. Contreras was treating with controlled substances.

Donohue, Thomas A., M.D., Lic. No. P0040, Woodville On March 6, 2020, the Board and Thomas A. Donohue, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order prohibiting him from engaging in any practice of surgery, with the exception of suturing minor lacerations. The Board found Dr. Donohue failed to recognize and appropriately treat post-operative complications following an aortic valve replacement procedure for one patient. With regard to a second patient, Dr. Donohue offered surgery even though the patient was not a good candidate for surgery and suffered complications.

Dozier, Norman Jay, M.D., Lic. No. G3306, Abilene On March 6, 2020, the Board and Norman Jay Dozier, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to within one year complete the medical recordkeeping course offered by the University of California San Diego Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (PACE) program; and within one year complete at least eight hours of CME, divided as follows: four hours in ethics/risk management and four hours in recognizing and treating complications of spinal blocks. The Board found Dr. Dozier failed to appropriately evaluate and treat a patient after complications from a lumbar regional block, failed to document consents for procedures, rationale, and efficacy of treatments and medical therapy for 10 chronic pain patients, and failed to properly monitor the patients during their treatment.

### Eneli, Kenechukwu Onyechi, M.D., Lic. No. N4399, Columbus

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Kenechukwu Onyechi Eneli, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to within one year complete at least 16 hours of CME, divid-

ed as follows: eight hours in risk management and eight hours in pediatric emergencies. The Board found Dr. Eneli failed to treat a pediatric patient according to the generally accepted standard of care by sending the patient home instead of admitting the patient for observation.

Flores, Michael Dee, M.D., Lic. No. L2888, Hereford On March 6, 2020, the Board and Michael Dee Flores, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order publicly reprimanding Dr. Flores and requiring him to have his practice monitored by another physician for eight consecutive monitoring cycles; within one year complete at least 16 hours of CME in acute respiratory illness, to include diagnosis and treatment of pneumonia; and within 60 days pay an administrative penalty of \$5,000. The Board found Dr. Flores should have recognized the signs of hypoxia in a patient, which were obvious and which had been previously documented. Dr. Flores should have sent the patient to the hospital for inpatient treatment.

Inbody, Steven Bryce, M.D., Lic. No. G7443, Houston On March 6, 2020, the Board and Steven Bryce Inbody, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order on Formal Filing under the following terms until the criminal charges pending against him are finally resolved: publicly reprimanded; shall not possess, prescribe, or distribute controlled substances in Texas; may not engage in the treatment of chronic pain; and shall not be permitted to supervise or delegate prescriptive authority to a physician assistant or advanced practice nurse or supervise a surgical assistant. The Board found Dr. Inbody failed to properly treat a chronic pan patient in compliance with Board rules. Prior to the case proceeding to a hearing at the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH), Dr. Inbody was indicted and arrested for unrelated charges. As a result, his license was temporarily suspended. The issues in the indictment involve overlapping issues of nontherapeutic prescribing. Dr. Inbody denies the charges; however, the charges are serious, and if proven true, would warrant action by the Board. The order resolves the formal complaint filed at SOAH.

Rosenthal, Jon Evan, M.D., Lic. No. M4489, Bismarck, ND On March 6, 2020, the Board and Jon Evan Rosenthal, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order on Formal Filing requiring him to within 10 days complete the necessary license cancellation forms and submit them to the Registrations Department of the Board to be processed. Dr. Rosenthal was under investigation for violating the standard of care; however, he no longer practices in Texas and expressed his desire to cancel his Texas medical license rather than continue to contest the matter at the State

Office of Administrative Hearings. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at SOAH.

Stewart, Deshawn Kirk, M.D., Lic. No. P5007, Dallas On March 6, 2020, the Board and Deshawn Kirk Stewart, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to within one year and three attempts pass the Medical Jurisprudence Exam; and within one year complete at least 32 hours of CME, divided as follows: eight hours in risk management, eight hours in medical recordkeeping, eight hours in ethics and eight hours in telemedicine and law. The Board found Dr. Stewart prescribed topical pain relievers to patients he never saw nor did he maintain an adequate medical record for any of the six patients.

Stroud, Robert Lee, M.D., Lic. No. E2888, Austin
On March 6, 2020, the Board and Robert Lee Stroud, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order on Formal Filing publicly reprimanding Dr. Stroud and requiring him to within one year complete at least 21 hours of CME in the following topics: PBI Prescribing Course, Opioids, Pain Management, and Addiction; within one year and three attempts pass the Medical Jurisprudence Exam; and within 90 days pay an administrative penalty of \$5,000. The Board found Dr. Stroud failed to meet the standard of care with respect to a patient he prescribed narcotic medications to by failing to properly evaluate and monitor the patient. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

Torres, Frank, M.D., Lic. No. L1483, San Benito
On March 6, 2020, the Board and Frank Torres, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order Upon Formal Filing requiring him to within one year complete at least 16 hours of CME, divided as follows: four hours in diagnosing and treating pulmonary embolisms, four hours in risk management, four hours in ethics and four hours in differential diagnosis for shortness of breath; and within one year and three attempts pass the Medical Jurisprudence Exam. The Board found Dr. Torres did not meet the standard of care with a patient who had shortness of breath. Dr. Torres failed to obtain the patient's oxygen saturation. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

#### UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT Bishai, Emad Mikhail Tewfik, M.D., Lic. No. N7224, Conroe

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Emad Mikhail Tewfik Bishai, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order placing Dr. Bishai under the following terms: shall not treat patient for chronic pain by prescription or administration of controlled substances; within seven days modify his DEA controlled substances registration certificates to eliminate Schedule II controlled substances and shall not reregister without prior Board approval; shall not possess, administer, or prescribe Schedule II controlled substances in Texas; and Dr. Bishai's delegates are prohibited from prescribing or administering dangerous drugs or controlled substances for the treatment of chronic pain. The Board found Dr. Bishai is currently under indictment in Montgomery County, Texas for charges related to prescribing controlled substances for other than medical purposes. The criminal case remains ongoing and the Board reserves its right to take further action against Dr. Bishai's license in the event of any additional determinations of violations of the Medical Practice Act, whether related or unrelated, to the criminal investigation referenced.

#### Cordes, Brett McCormack, M.D., Lic. No. N1594, Houston

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Brett McCormack Cordes, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order under the following terms: shall not possess, administer, or prescribe controlled substances in Texas; within 30 days obtain an independent medical evaluation from a Board-approved neuropsychiatrist and follow all recommendations for care and treatment; and shall not be permitted to supervise or delegate prescriptive authority to a physician assistant or advanced practice nurse or supervise a surgical assistant. The Board found Dr. Cordes voluntarily surrendered his DEA controlled substances registration certificate at the onset of an investigation into diversion of a patient's pain medication before and after a surgery that Dr. Cordes performed.

#### Craig, Peter Baker, M.D., Lic. No. L7698, Amarillo

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Peter Baker Craig, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order publicly reprimanding Dr. Craig and revoking his license; however, the revocation is stayed and he is placed on probation under the following terms: publicly referred to the Texas Physician Health Program; within seven days surrender his DEA controlled substances registration certificate and not reregister without prior Board approval; and shall not be permitted to supervise or delegate prescriptive authority to a physician assistant or advanced practice nurse or supervise a surgical assistant. The Board found Dr. Craig pled guilty to a federal felony related to possession of controlled substances and was sentenced to probation.

#### VOLUNTARY SURRENDER/REVOCATION

Curtis, Jacqueline Geneva, M.D., Lic. No. Q8040, Dallas On March 6, 2020, the Board and Jacqueline Geneva Curtis, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender in which Dr. Curtis agreed to voluntarily surrender her Texas medical license in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings. Dr. Curtis was under investigation for violating her 2019 Agreed Order by continuing to engage in the active practice of medicine in Texas after the cease practice terms came into effect.

Lankes, Richard, M.D., Lic. No. E6464, Carrizo Springs On March 6, 2020, the Board and Richard Lankes, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender in which Dr. Lankes agreed to voluntarily surrender his Texas medical license in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings. Dr. Lankes was under investigation for a standard of care issue.

# Ngwu, Samuel C., M.D., Lic. No. K2087, Enugu, Enugu, Nigeria

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Samuel C. Ngwu, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender in which Dr. Ngwu agreed to voluntarily surrender his Texas medical license in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings. The Board alleged that Dr. Ngwu failed to comply with his 2019 Final Order.

## Pathmanathan, Sivakolunthunathan, M.D., Lic. No. G9641, Abilene

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Sivakolunthunathan Pathmanathan, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender on Formal Filing in which Dr. Pathmanathan agreed to voluntarily surrender his Texas medical license in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings. Dr. Pathmanathan reported to the Board that he has a medical condition that may preclude him from practicing medicine at this time. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

#### **REVOCATION**

#### Gillick, Roy Harry, M.D., Lic. No. E7950, Katy

On March 6, 2020, the Board entered a Default Order regarding Roy Harry Gillick, M.D., which revoked his Texas medical license. On August 28, 2019, the Board filed a Complaint with the State Office of Administrative Hearing (SOAH), alleging unprofessional conduct. Dr. Gillick failed to appear at the SOAH hearing and no responsive pleading was ever filed by Dr. Gillick. The Board granted a Determination of Default and Dr. Gillick's license was revoked by Default Order. This order resolves a formal complaint filed

at SOAH. Dr. Gillick has 25 days from the service of the order to file a motion for rehearing.

**Tedford, Dennis D., M.D., Lic. No. J3632, Brownfield**On February 21, 2020, the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, revoked Dennis D. Tedford, M.D.'s Texas medical license by operation of law following Dr. Tedford being sentenced to federal prison on December 6, 2019.

Yeleti, Venkata Rao, M.D., Lic. No. J5955, Temple
On January 16, 2020, the Executive Director on behalf of
the Board, revoked Venkata Rao Yeleti, M.D.'s Texas medical license by operation of law after Dr. Yeleti's registering
as a sex offender on or about August 12, 2019.

#### SUSPENSION

Cannon, Carrie Sue, M.D., Lic. No. H7277, Orlando, FL On March 6, 2020, the Board and Carrie Sue Cannon, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order of Voluntary Suspension on Formal Filing, suspending Dr. Cannon's Texas medical license until she requests in writing to have the suspension stayed or lifted and appears before the Board to provide evidence that she is physically, mentally, and otherwise competent to safely practice medicine. Evidence shall include, at a minimum: evidence that her Florida medical license has been fully reinstated without conditions, restrictions or limitations; compliance with treatment recommendations of her providers; compliance with any reguirements imposed by the Florida Professional Resource Network or any other professional health program she is participating in; a report from a Texas licensed board certified psychiatrist designated by the Board who has evaluated Dr. Cannon and indicates that she is safe to return to practice; evidence of a self-referral to the Texas Physician Health Program, and compliance with that program; and a return to practice plan, including information about planned practice setting and acknowledgement from any potential employer that they are aware of Dr. Cannon's licensure history in Florida and Texas. Dr. Cannon was previously temporarily suspended based on findings that her Florida license had been emergently suspended after it was determined that she suffered from an illness that precluded from safely practicing medicine. The order supersedes the Order of Temporary Suspension entered on November 18, 2019. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

Shafer, David R., M.D., Lic. No. F1993, Whitehouse On March 6, 2020, the Board and David R. Shafer, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order of Suspension, suspending Dr. Shafer's Texas medical license until he requests in writing to have the suspension stayed or lifted and appears before the Board to provide evidence that he is physically, mentally, and otherwise competent to safely practice medicine. Evidence shall include, at a minimum, the complete and final resolution of any and all criminal charges and investigations that are currently pending against him and any additional charges that may be brought related to the alleged criminal conduct; and objective evidence of compliance with any treatment program, monitoring agreement, or recommendations related to Dr. Shafer's substance use disorder. Dr. Shafer had previously been temporarily suspended due to substances use issues. The order supersedes the Order of Temporary Suspension entered on September 10, 2019.

### Thompson, Robert Leon, Jr., M.D., Lic. No. L6671, Houston

On March 9, 2020, the Executive Director on behalf of the Board, suspended Robert Leon Thompson, Jr., M.D.'s Texas medical license after a Decision and Order was issued by the State Office of Administrative Hearings due to non-payment of child support on January 27, 2020.

#### NONTHERAPEUTIC PRESCRIBING

Monroe, Matthew, M.D., Lic. No. E4903, Bellaire
On March 6, 2020, the Board and Matthew Monro

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Matthew Monroe, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to have his practice monitored by another physician for eight consecutive monitoring cycles; within one year complete the prescribing course offered by the University of California San Diego Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (PACE) program; within one year complete at least eight hours of CME in medical recordkeeping; and within 60 days pay an administrative penalty of \$3,000. The Board found Dr. Monroe violated the standard of care and Board rules related to the treatment and prescribing for chronic pain by nontherapeutically prescribing opioids and benzodiaze-pines to seven chronic pain patients.

Schultz, Mercedes, M.D., Lic. No. M4996, Port Lavaca On March 6, 2020, the Board and Mercedes Schultz, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order Upon Formal Filing publicly reprimanding Dr. Schultz and placing her under the following terms: shall not engage in the practice of treating chronic pain as defined by Board rule; limit her practice to a group or institutional setting approved in advance by the Board; within one year complete the prescribing course offered by the University of California San Diego Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (PACE) program; within one year complete at least 16 hours of CME, divided as

follows: four hours in supervising, four hours in treating chronic pain, four hours in risk management and four hours in ethics; within 90 days pay an administrative penalty of \$5,000; within one year and three attempts pass the Medical Jurisprudence Exam; and shall not be permitted to supervise or delegate prescriptive authority to physician assistants and advanced practice nurses or supervise surgical assistants outside of her pre-approved practice setting. The Board found Dr. Schultz violated the standard of care by nontherapeutically prescribing to 10 patients and failed to adequately supervise her midlevel providers. The order resolves the formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

Uwaydah, Nema Ibrahim, M.D., Lic. No. K8544, Houston On March 6, 2020, the Board and Nema Ibrahim Uwaydah, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order under the following terms: shall not treat patients for chronic pain as defined by Board rule or engage in the practice of pain management; within seven days surrender DEA controlled substances registration certificates and not reregister without prior Board approval; shall not possess, administer, or prescribe controlled substances in Texas; have her practice monitored by another physician for eight consecutive monitoring cycles; within one year and three attempts pass the Medical Jurisprudence Exam; and within one year complete at least 24 hours of CME, divided as follows: eight hours in medical recordkeeping, eight hours in risk management and eight hours in safe prescribing practices. The Board found Dr. Uwaydah nontherapeutically prescribed large amounts of controlled substances to multiple chronic pain patients, failed to create and maintain adequate medical records for the patients treated, and treated the patients at a clinic that was not licensed to operate as a pain management clinic.

# INADEQUATE SUPERVISION OR DELEGATION Le, Nhi P., M.D., Lic. No. K9105, Victoria

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Nhi P. Le, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring her to within one year complete at least 12 hours of CME, divided as follows: four hours in medical recordkeeping, four hours in supervision, and four hours in risk management; and within 60 days pay an administrative penalty of \$2,000. The Board found Dr. Le unlawfully ordered, repackaged, relabeled, and resold prescription medications, and failed to document the usages and patients receiving hormones that were ordered for in office use.

#### OTHER STATES' ACTIONS

Adler, Grit Armstrong, M.D., Lic. No. N9497, Laredo On March 6, 2020, the Board and Grit Armstrong Adler, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order prohibiting him from practicing medicine in Texas until he requests in writing and appears before the Board to provide evidence that he is physically, mentally, and otherwise competent to safely practice medicine; and Dr. Adler shall complete and comply with all terms of the Final Order entered by the Florida Board of Medicine (FBM) on July 12, 2019. The Board found Dr. Adler was issued an order by the FBM for his failure to conform to the minimal standards of care for acceptable medical practice.

Peterson, Joseph David, M.D., Lic. No. R8460, Abilene On March 6, 2020, the Board and Joseph David Peterson, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to comply with all terms of the Final Order entered by the Florida Board of Medicine (FBM) on April 30, 2019. The Board found Dr. Peterson was issued an order by the FBM for his failure to conform to the minimal standards of care for acceptable medical practice.

# Seawell, Michael Robert, M.D., Lic. No. N6989, Jackson-ville, FL

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Michael Robert Seawell, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order publicly referring Dr. Seawell to the Texas Physician Health Program and requiring him to comply with all terms of the Agreed Order entered by the Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure (KBML) on September 19, 2019. The Board found Dr. Seawell was issued an order by the KBML with restrictions which arose from Dr. Seawell's impairment.

#### VIOLATION OF PRIOR ORDER

# Andrews, William Alan, M.D., Lic. No. F6394, Friendswood

On March 6, 2020, the Board and William Alan Andrews, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order publicly reprimanding Dr. Andrews and requiring him to within one year and three attempts pass the Medical Jurisprudence Exam. The Board found Dr. Andrews violated terms of his 2011 Order when he failed to timely submit compliance reports and cooperate with Board staff. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

Barnett, John Bryan, Jr., M.D., Lic. No. D5910, Dallas On March 6, 2020, the Board and John Bryan Barnett, Jr., M.D., entered into a Modification Order, modifying Dr. Barnett's August 2018 Order, as modified in June 2019. The modification changes the required CME topic to respiratory care or respiratory failure. The Board found Dr. Barnett was not in compliance with his 2018 Order as he was unable to locate a CME course in post-operative care. All other terms of the 2018 Order as modified remain in full effect.

McCurley, Leeroy, M.D., Lic. No. H0618, Grand Prairie On March 6, 2020, the Board and Leeroy McCurley, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order publicly reprimanding Dr. McCurley and requiring him to within 60 days pay an administrative penalty of \$1,000. The Board found Dr. McCurley violated his 2017 Order's terms requiring compliance with the chart monitor's recommendations.

### Roberts, Richard Martin, M.D., Lic. No. G2467, Corpus Christi

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Richard Martin Roberts, M.D., entered into a Mediated Agreed Order under the following terms: for all patient encounters involving patients under the age of 18, including but not limited to examinations, assessments, communications, follow-ups, medication renewals, or otherwise, Dr. Roberts must ensure that a chaperone is present for each encounter; and within one year complete at least four hours of CME in physician/patient communications, to include communicating with other cultures. The Board found Dr. Roberts failed to have a chaperone present for a telephone visit he conducted with one patient who has ADHD. Dr. Roberts also did not obtain explicit, effective, unambiguous consent to examination from the parents of patients. The order shall supersede the Order of Temporary Restriction entered on November 2, 2017. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

Shelton, Kevin James, M.D., Lic. No. N1893, Celina On March 6, 2020, the Board and Kevin James Shelton, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order publicly reprimanding Dr. Shelton and requiring him to within 60 days pay an administrative penalty of \$4,500. The Board found Dr. Shelton violated his 2016 and 2017 Orders by failing to timely pay an administrative penalty and submit required medical records.

#### **INADEQUATE MEDICAL RECORDS**

Barroga, Deno Baltazar, M.D., Lic. No. M1495, Dallas
On March 6, 2020, the Board and Deno Baltazar Barroga,
M.D., entered into an Agreed Order Upon Formal Filing
requiring him to within one year complete the medical
recordkeeping course offered by the University of Califor-

nia San Diego Physician Assessment and Clinical Education (PACE) program. The Board found Dr. Barroga's medical records for two patients were inadequate. The order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

Sager, Wayne Leslie, M.D., Lic. No. N2768, Midland On March 6, 2020, the Board and Wayne Leslie Sager, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to within one year complete at least eight hours of CME in medical recordkeeping. The Board found Dr. Sager's medical records for a patient were inadequate in that they often relied on templates and at times did not indicate his responses to parents' concerns, or did not indicate that he fully addressed the parents' concerns about her failure to thrive.

#### TXPHP VIOLATION

# Ikwuagwu, Ndy Chidex Nima, M.D., Lic. No. BP10061322, Mesquite

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Ndy Chidex Nima Ikwuagwu, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to comply with all terms of his Texas Physician Health Program (TXPHP) agreement, including the worksite monitor requirement; and shall not be permitted to supervise and delegate prescriptive authority to physician assistants or advanced practice nurses. The Board found Dr. Ikwuagwu was placed on leave from his residency program after a positive urine screen for recreational drugs. Dr. Ikwuagwu self-reported to TXPHP but was not meeting all terms of the program.

### McDougall, Cameron Michael, M.D., Lic. No. Q5034, San Antonio

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Cameron Michael McDougall, M.D., entered into an Agreed Order publicly referring Dr. McDougall to the Texas Physician Health Program (TXPHP); and requiring him to within a year complete the TMB Remedial Coaching Program at the University of Texas at Dallas School of Management. The Board found Dr. McDougall engaged in disruptive behavior with colleagues, hospital staff and patients. Dr. McDougall entered into an agreement with TXPHP; however, failed to comply with the terms of the agreement. Dr. McDougall suffers from an impairment due to an illness that requires continued monitoring by TXPHP.

#### **CEASE AND DESIST**

#### McMillion, Rozen Lin, RN, No License, Richmond

On March 6, 2020, the Board and Rozen Lin McMillion, RN, entered into an Agreed Cease and Desist Order prohibiting Ms. McMillion from practicing medicine in the state of Texas without a license issued by the Texas Medical Board. The Board found Ms. McMillion on or about February 8, 2018, was observed by an officer from the Fort Bend County Sheriff's office injecting glutathione skin whitening treatment into a woman at her home without the presence of a physician and without a prescription. The patient had not been examined, evaluated, or diagnosed by a physician or midlevel provider. Ms. McMillion had not been delegated authority to perform such injections from a properly licensed individual.

#### Rainbolt, Stephen, No License, Kingsbury

On February 21, 2020, the Board directed the Executive Director to enter a Cease and Desist Order regarding Stephen Rainbolt, prohibiting him from practicing medicine in the state of Texas without a license issued by the Texas Medical Board. Ms. Beck shall not hold himself out a physician or doctor in the state of Texas. The Board found Mr. Rainbolt on his website and Facebook page, offered to treat patients with chronic pain, illnesses or stress. Mr. Rainbolt further offered free sessions to member of law enforcement, church members and football players.

# Texas Physician Assistant Board Disciplinary Actions

Gonzalez, Enrique, Jr., P.A., Lic. No. PA02877, Mission On March 27, 2020, the Texas Physician Assistant Board and Enrique Gonzalez, Jr., P.A., entered into an Agreed Order publicly reprimanding Mr. Gonzalez and requiring him to within 60 days pay an administrative penalty of \$1,000. The Board found Mr. Gonzalez engaged in unprofessional conduct when he was found guilty of lewd, indecent, or obscene acts within Special Aircraft Jurisdiction of the U.S. on June 14, 2019.

Ramsay, Lawrence, P.A., Lic. No. PA02056, Benton, AR On March 27, 2020, the Texas Physician Assistant Board and Lawrence Ramsay, P.A., entered into an Agreed Order requiring him to complete and comply with all terms of the Consent Order entered by the Arkansas State Medical Board on February 22, 2019; within one year and three attempts pass the Medical Jurisprudence Exam; and within

90 days pay an administrative penalty of \$500. The Board found Mr. Ramsay was disciplined by the Arkansas State Medical Board which alleged violations of the Arkansas Medical Practices Act.

Sauceda, Alberto, P.A., Lic. No. PA08844, Fort Stockton On March 27, 2020, the Texas Physician Assistant Board and Alberto Sauceda, P.A., entered into an Agreed Order Upon Formal Filing placing Mr. Sauceda under the following terms: he shall have a non-familial chaperone, not related to the patient or himself, directly observe anytime he performs a sensitive examination as detailed in the Order; within one year complete at least 16 hours of CME, divided as follows: four hours in ethics or risk management, four hours in informed consent, four hours in performing sensitive examinations, to include children, and four hours in physician assistant-patient communication. The Board found Mr. Sauceda failed to obtain explicit, effective, unambiguous consent to examine the child patient, failed to adequately explain what he was doing during the examination, and failed to offer another provider. Mr. Sauceda should have had another provider present during the genitalia examination of the patient. This order resolves a formal complaint filed at the State Office of Administrative Hearings. The order supersedes all prior orders of the Board, including the May 17, 2019 Order of Temporary Suspension.

#### Suarez-Jaramillo, P.A., Lic. No. PA10788, Weslaco

On March 27, 2020, a disciplinary panel of the Texas Physician Assistant Board temporarily suspended, without notice, the Texas physician assistant license of Javier Suarez-Jaramillo, P.A., after determining his continuation in the practice as a physician assistant poses a continuing threat to public welfare. The suspension was effective immediately. The Board panel found that Mr. Suarez-Jaramillo was emergently referred back to the Board due to a combination of his noncompliance with and further refusal to participate in the Texas Physician Health program testing and his third arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. A temporary suspension hearing with notice will be held as soon as practicable with 10 days' notice to Mr. Suarez-Jaramillo, unless the hearing is specifically waived by Mr. Suarez-Jaramillo. The temporary suspension remains in place until the Board takes further action.

#### Texas State Board of Acupuncture Examiners Disciplinary Actions

Dreyhaupt, Scott Y., L.Ac., Lic. No. AC00393, Conroe
On January 31, 2020, the Texas State Board of Acupuncture Examiners entered a Default Order regarding Scott Y.
Dreyhaupt, L.Ac., which revoked his Texas acupuncturist license. On June 7, 2019, the Board filed a Complaint with the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH), alleging unprofessional conduct. Mr. Dreyhaupt failed to appear at the SOAH hearing and no responsive pleading was ever filed by Mr. Dreyhaupt. The Board granted a Determination of Default and Mr. Dreyhaupt's license was revoked by Default Order. This order resolves a formal complaint filed at SOAH. Mr. Dreyhaupt has 25 days from the service of the order to file a motion for rehearing.

#### Nordmann, Tyson John, L.Ac., Lic. No. AC01704, Smithville

On January 31, 2020, the Texas State Board of Acupuncture Examiners and Tyson John Nordmann, L.Ac., entered into an Agreed Order of Voluntary Surrender in which Mr. Nordmann agreed to voluntarily surrender his Texas acupuncturist license in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings. Mr. Nordmann was under investigation for unprofessional conduct following an arrest for possession of a controlled substance on November 8, 2017.

#### Texas Board of Medical Radiologic Technology Disciplinary Actions

# Benson, Brittney M., MRT, Lic. No. GMR02003899, Pasadena

On February 7, 2020, the Texas Board of Medical Radiologic Technology and Brittney M. Benson, MRT, entered into an Agreed Order requiring her to for a minimum of three years, abstain from the consumption of prohibited substances as defined in the order; participate in the Board's drug testing program; and participate in the activities of Alcoholics Anonymous no less than one time a week for three years.
