no desire to go behind the Blount
settlement but in the settlement
we are to make that document
may be necessary for reference.

WMR & Co books must show

Isaac Lourey lived at Cincinnati
on the Trinity our claim against
his estate was placed with
George Butler who represented
the northern Creditors of the Estate
