**KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,**

That I, *Whitfield Carral* of Galveston for the consideration of *Twenty seven hundred* Dollars to me paid by *William J. R. Henderson* of Galveston have this day sold and delivered, and by these presents do sell and deliver to the said *William J. R. Henderson*. Two negroes *Slaves for life & my property*. now in the County of Galveston viz *Caroline* a girl of Black Complexion about fifteen years of age - *Young*. a man of yellow Complexion about twenty five years of age, the Consideration paid me for said negroes by said *Henderson* being a Warranty deed to Lots 13. 14. & West half of 11. in Block 547 in Galveston with improvements I hereby pledge said property as a guarantee that the title to said *Slaves* hereby conveyed by me to said *Henderson* is perfect. and that said *Henderson* has a Lien on said Lots & improvements to secure him against all Costs damages judgments lawyers fees arising out of any Contest of my title to convey said *Slaves*

And I do warrant the said *Slaves* to be sound in mind and body, free from all hereditary disease, and Slave for life.

I also warrant the Title to the said *Slaves* to the said *William J. R. Henderson* his heirs and assigns forever, against the claims of all persons, whomsoever.
