Rice of the City of Houston in said State of Texas the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged do hereby grant bargain sell and convey unto said Rice his heirs and assigns a certain track or parcel of land lying and situated in the County of Walker State of Texas containing Three hundred and twenty acres of land being a part of the headright of John B. Chesen and being adjoining the land of John Smith and Polly Martin being the same track of land conveyed to W. J. Viser by S. C. & A. D. Smith of said County of Walker. It being the same track conveyed to W. M. Rice and myself by W. J. Viser by deed bearing date the twelfth day of May A.D. 1854. To have and to hold the above described premises with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging unto him the said Rice his heirs executors administrators and assigns to their use and behoof forever.
