Serving his first year as head coach of the Ponies, he was named coach of the year of the Texas Junior College Athletic Conference. Coach Defee also directs the Pony basketball and baseball teams.


SOLON HOLT

Coach Solon Holt, in addition to his task of coaching the Pony linemen, serves as "father" to the boys in the dormitory. He came to us from Henderson High School. Previous to his work at Henderson, Coach Holt received all conference honors as tackle with the TCU eleven. Coach Holt also coaches the Pony track team.


THE POWERFUL PONIES FROM PANOLA
When the '49 season began, everyone was optimistic as to the outcome of the Ponies in their second season of football competition. Both the players and the coaches worked hard, and as a result, opened the season with a well-earned victory over the Paris Dragons. After winning two more non-conference tilts, the Ponies journeyed to Athens to win their conference opener. In the two non-conference games that followed, the Ponies were perhaps at their lowest ebb of the season, tying Nottheast and losing their only game of the season to the Wharton Pioneers. However, the next few weeks, a regenerated Pony team trampled all their opponents, ending play with a win over Odessa for the State Championship. Then, topping all previous honors, the Ponies became the Champions of the first annual Gas Bowl at Carthage by defeating McNeese Junior College.

The Ponies then lost a close 40-39 game to LeTourneau Tech before winning over Texarkana 43-41. Then to top all others, these hustling Ponies handed the highly-heralded State Champion Lon Morris Bearkats a 55-45 defeat. Thus ended the season, but with the return of this year's veterans, future Pony opponents had better be prepared.
