


THE POWERFUL PONIES FROM PANOLA

When the '49 season began, everyone was optimistic as to the outcome of the Ponies in their second season of football competition. Both the players and the coaches worked hard, and as a result, opened the season with a well-earned victory over the Paris Dragons. After winning two more non-conference tilts, the Ponies journeyed to Athens to win their conference opener. In the two non-conference games that followed, the Ponies were perhaps at their lowest ebb of the season, tying Northeast and losing their only game of the season to the Wharton Pioneers. However, the next few weeks, a regenerated Pony team trampled all their opponents, ending play with a win over Odessa for the State Championship. Then, topping all previous honors, the Ponies became the Champions of the first annual Gas Bowl at Carthage by defeating McNeese Junior College.



PONY BASKETBALL TEAM




