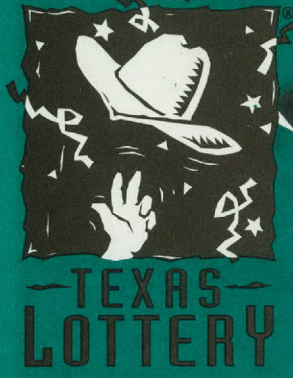

The first *Texas Million* drawing, held May 29, 1998, delivered far more than expected when four people each matched the four numbers in the top group of numbers on their tickets for a cool \$1 million each.

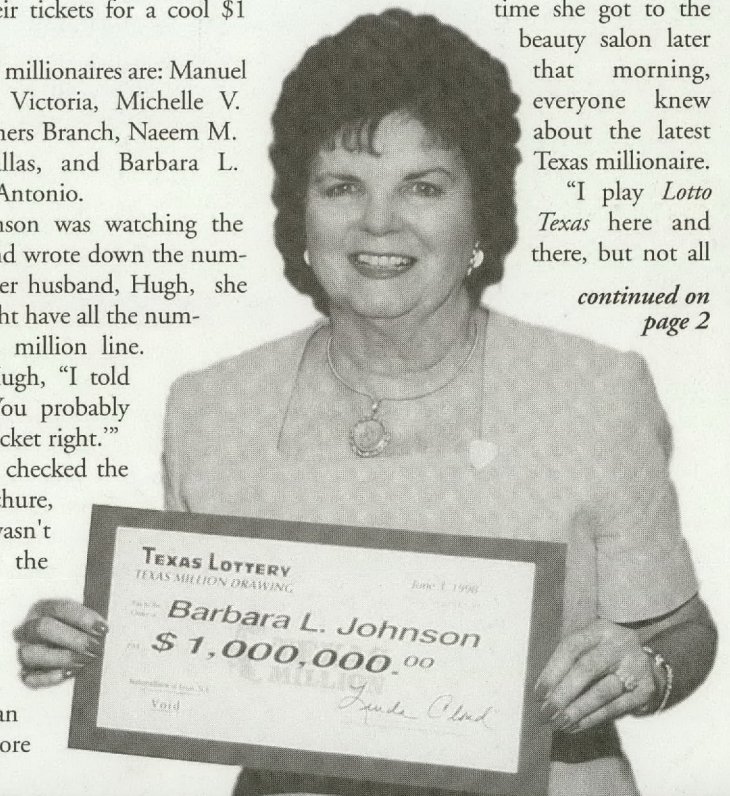
Texas' newest millionaires are: Manuel D. Magana of Victoria, Michelle V. Arguello of Farmers Branch, Naeem M. Khwaja of Dallas, and Barbara L. Johnson of San Antonio.

Barbara Johnson was watching the results on TV and wrote down the numbers. She told her husband, Hugh, she thought she might have all the numbers on the \$1 million line. According to Hugh, "I told her, 'Oh, no. You probably didn't read the ticket right.'"

Barbara then checked the *How to Play* brochure, but she still wasn't convinced. So the next morning, she called country radio station 97.3 KAJA-FM in San Antonio for more

information. Barbara and the DJ went over Barbara's numbers and even the DJ got excited! "I ended up realizing I had won right on the air!" she said. By the time she got to the beauty salon later that morning, everyone knew about the latest Texas millionaire. "I play *Lotto Texas* here and there, but not all

Teddy Holt

Teddy Holt of Neches makes his living as a truck driver. On one recent trip, Teddy says that he purchased several tickets and, as he usually does, turned the winners in for more

numbers for the \$1 million prize, or allows the Lottery terminal to select them using Quick Pick, the terminal automatically generates six more sets of numbers for the remaining prize levels. The last six sets of numbers give players two chances to win \$25,000 and four chances to win \$10,000. All seven sets of numbers give players a chance at prizes of \$300 and \$10.

In the first drawing, four tickets matched all numbers in the \$10,000 bracket, and more than 160,000 tickets matched two or three of the winning numbers for the \$10 and \$300 prizes.

Prizes up to \$599 may be claimed at any Texas Lottery retailer. Prizes over \$600 must be claimed at any of the Lottery's 24 regional claim centers. If you think you may be holding a \$1 million winner, call the toll-free phone number on the back of your ticket, or go to the nearest claim center.

One Very Big Day


June 3, 1998 was a pretty big day for the Texas Lottery and its players. The first of the *Texas Million* Millionaires came to headquarters to collect a cool \$1 million. But that was just the beginning.

June 3 was also the first day of ticket sales for one of the newest scratch-off games, *Buck\$ 'N Truck\$*. Before the day was out, Harold Turney of Houston had won the first of fifty brand new 1998 Dodge Ram 1500 Special Edition trucks that the Lottery is giving away. *Buck\$ 'N Truck\$* is the Lottery's first game to award a prize other than cash as the top prize, and it sounds like a winner.


But the winning wasn't over yet. At 9:59 pm, the *Lotto Texas* balls gave out the winning numbers 1-3-11-23-24-38 for a jackpot of \$45 million. Three 6-of-6 tickets were sold for one of the largest jackpots in recent months.

Since the beginning of this year, there have been plenty of winners in the *Lotto Texas* drawings. From January 1, 1998 through June 6, 1998, *Lotto Texas* had 21 winning jackpots out of 44 drawings.
