

Government Publications Texas State Documer WEAT awards SEP 28 20 Plant of the Year" Depository Dallas Public Library to Bayport

The Bayport Central Wastewater Treatment Facility has been awarced one of the top awards offered annually by the Water Environment Association of Texas (WEAT): the Industrial Wastewater Treatment Plant of the Year.

Plant of the Year is presented to an industrial wastewater treatment plant in Texas that has consistently exhibited outstanding performance of daily activities beyond the normal call of duty, according to WEAT.

The WEAT Awards Committee noted efforts made by the staff at Bayport in getting the facility back in service within "only four days following Hurricane Ike, which was a significant accomplishment." Bayport has also achieved perfect compliance with its discharge permit for the last two years, "reflecting the experience and

GCA Celebrates 40th Anniversary

This year Gulf Coast Waste Disposal Authority is celebrating its 40th Anniversary. The Texas Legislature created the unique organization in 1969, modeling it somewhat after the Ruhr Valley Authority in Germany and organizing it under a statute similar to that of a Texas river authority.

In recognition of this milestone, a reception was held to honor those who helped build the organization from a concept to a reality. General Manager Charles (Charlie) Ganze welcomed the 122 guests to the event and introduced both current and former members of the GCWDA Board in attendance and several other guests. He then introduced long-time Chairman of the Board Mark Schultz.

Schultz paid special notice to the original Board and the vision that that group demonstrated in creating a new organization with the idea of providing regional solutions for waste management. He especially drew attention to two men whc are no longer with us: the first Board Chairman Gen. Royal Hatch, and the first General Manager, Jack Davis. "Without the leadership of these people, we would not be here tonight," Schultz commented. He also drew attention to the dates when the operating facilities of GCWDA were first brought online and to the Platinum Awards for excellence in wastewater treatment which have been earned by two of those facilities.

Former Board Chairman Dr. Frank Fisher was also invited to make remarks. He made a special point of explaining that regional treatment, the concept of bringing two or mcre wastewater streams together to be treated jointly, was not universally accepted back in the late 60's and early 70's. "But Gulf Coast Authority has proved that regional treatment works and works well," he said. Former Board Members present for the reception were:

Also present were current and retired Gulf Coast Authority managers and department heads and valued consultants who have supported the Authority with their expertise, some for almost the entire history of GCA. Several guests represented industries and communities which work in partnership with GCWDA.

"It was a real pleasure to have this gathering of people who are professional colleagues, and sometimes also good friends, to celebrate 40 years of protecting the waters of Texas," Ganze concluded.

GCWDA is a special district of the State of Texas and operates on revenues generated through the services it provides. The district collects no taxes.

dedication of the Bayport plant operations team." Employees also achieved a year clear of lost time accidents.

Recent improvements at the facility include air emission control for the fourstep aeration basin. This has resulted in a 70 percent reduction of emission of volatile organics. WEAT also noted GCA's long-time involvement with the annual Rivers, Lakes, Bays 'N Bayous Trash Bash, one of the state's largest volunteer efforts to preserve and protect water quality from Bastrop to Houston to Galveston.

Bayport serves the wastewater treatment needs of 63 largely petrochemical industries in the Bayport Industrial District, as well as two nearby municipalities. The facility has a treatment capacity of 25 million gallons of water per day utilizing an activated sludge process.
