Governor Appoints Jerry Pennington

Gov. Bill Clements has appointed Jerome J. (Jerry) Pennington of Clear Lake to the Board of Directors of GCWDA. He replaces Dr. Charles T. Ladoulis who resigned to take a position in another state. Pennington said he is "most interested in the quality of environment and growth in Texas, Houston and, specifically, the Clear Lake/Bay Area itself.'

Amendment Defines Operating Area

An amendment to the statute defining Gulf Coast Waste Disposal Authority was approved in the final Special Session of the Texas Legislature and has been signed by Gov. Bill Clements.

The amendment clarifies the ability of the Authority to work both within and without its primary three county jurisdiction. The need to make this section of the statute clear came about through a proposal to assist the Texas Department of

Criminal Justice in its environmental management program.

"We have signed a letter of agreement with TDCJ to evaluate areas in which GCWDA may be of assistance," said General Manager Dick Brown. "Because the TDCJ operates throughout the state, it was necessary for the Authority to have the ability to operate wherever the prison system has a facility."

"We are working with TDCJ support staff to prepare a solid

waste management plan for their southern region facilities. This will be a comprehensive study of the solid waste needs for all prisons in the southern region," said Vance Kemler, Director, Municipal Operations. "This includes agricultural operations, industrial canning operations and the more traditional municipal solid waste needs."

publications, produces and makes available microfiche copies. Agency publications are retained permanently in the Texas State Publications Collection at the Texas State Library. This collection currently numbers more than 180,000 publications.

The Board:

- adopted a Resolution authorizing the contract with Aztec Rental Center, Inc. for acceptance of portable toilet wastes.
- awarded contracts to haul and/or dispose of solid waste at five of the Authority's operating locations to the lowest bid contractors as listed below.

Bayport, BFI Waste Systems – \$526,350 Blackhawk, BFI Waste Systems – \$32,670 Bellaire Transfer Station, BFI Waste Systems – \$144,000 Bellaire Sewage Treatment Plant, Tricil/Laidlaw Environmental Service – \$36,300 Mobile Sludge Dewatering Unit, Tricil/Laidlaw Environmental Service –

\$119,280

- awarded bid to Conroe Creosoting Company in the amount of \$50,415.33 for materials required to construct a wave run-up wall at the Campbell Bayou Facility.
- awarded bid to Rebel Construction in the amount of \$41,691 for labor necessary to construct the wave run-up wall at the Campbell Bayou Facility.
- awarded contract for landfilling a compacted refuse at Galveston Transfer Station to BFI, Inc. at the estimated total annual contract cost of \$591, 894.
