Introduction

Texas is a big State in many ways.

Texas is the second largest of the 50 states, extending 801 straightline miles from north to south and 773 miles from east to west . . . vast miles to cover for public transportation operators.

Texas has a population of almost 17 million . . . a large pool of customers for public transportation operators to market services.

The state highway system in Texas encompasses more than 76,000 miles on which more than 13.5 million Texas registered vehicles travel... a challenge for public transportation operators to lure Texans and visitors away from their cars.

In 1989, Texas public transportation operators provided almost 215 million one-way passenger trips to Texans and visitors to the state. This was accomplished through the delivery of services by the state's 21 urbanized transit systems, 37 nonurbanized transit systems and 255 private nonprofit agencies operating vehicles for the transportation of the elderly and handicapped . . . an array of services which provides extensive transportation options for many Texans but which leaves 30% of the state's urbanized areas and 33% of the state's counties without scheduled public transportation services.

Public transportation in Texas has made great progress in the past fifteen years. Ridership has continued to increase, with the 1989 ridership reaching levels that are comparable to ridership in the mid 1950's... a period of high transit ridership in Texas. Residents in all the state's major urbanized areas have approved a sales tax dedicated to the local financing of public transportation services, totalling more than half a billion dollars in 1989. These figures show an increasing awareness and commitment by Texans that public transportation is an important element in the mobility of Texans.



This report, the 1989 Texas Transit Statistics, provides a summary of data compiled from monthly and/or quarterly reports completed by public transportation providers which receive state and/or federal assistance through the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

The format of this year's report has been modified to allow easy identification and comparison of the various transit system operations by topic specific data rather than the system-by-system data sheets used in previous reports. Also, this year's report includes for the first time data relating to the operations of the state's rural transit systems and nonprofit organizations providing transportation for the elderly and handicapped.

Summary

Urbanized Transit Systems

In 1989, more than 209 million passengers were carried by Texas' urbanized public transit systems. This is a 5.7 percent increase from the 198.4 million passengers carried in 1988. Total vehicle miles increased about 8.1 percent to 117.5 million miles in 1989 as compared to 108.8 million miles in 1988.

Net operating costs decreased 15.3 percent from \$244.5 million in 1988 to \$207.1 million in 1989.

The total annual public expense of transit increased from \$291.5 million in 1988 to \$382.1 million in 1989. Total public expense includes net operating costs of \$207.1 million and capital costs of \$175.0 million for 1989.

Federal public transportation grants which have been approved in Texas decreased from \$166.0 million in 1988 to \$58.4 million in 1989.





FAREBOX RECOVERY 7 Largest Urbanized Transit Systems




Location of Transit System



Summary

Nonurbanized Transit Systems

During calendar year 1989, the number of agencies providing rural public transit services increased to thirty-seven. These agencies provided more than two and one-half million one-way passenger trips. The agencies maintained and operated more than six hundred vehicles in the delivery of transit services. Total operating expenses for CY89 totalled approximately \$13.6 million. FIGURE 8



Summary

Elderly and Handicapped Transportation Services Provided By Nonprofit Entities

During calendar year 1989, nonprofit entities operating vehicles purchased through the Urban Mass Transportation Administration's Section 16b(2) program provided almost two and one-half million one way passenger trips. The entities maintained and operated six hundred vehicles which were driven more than eight million miles. In CY89 these nonprofit entities expended almost \$6.5 million in providing transportation services for the elderly and handicapped.
