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## INTRODUCTION

This is the fourth Texas Research League report to list assessment ratios for school districts based upon market-value data collected by a state agency. While the legislature has prohibited the use of an assessment ratio other than 100%, property appraisals in many jurisdictions fall far short of market value.

There is only one way in which to determine the equity of a property tax levy, and that is to compare the appraised level of a particular parcel of property with the appraisal level of other property in the same taxing jurisdiction. If a given property is assessed at 100 percent of its market value when the average of all property is only 50 percent of market value, then the owner of that property is going to pay twice the tax he would pay with an equitable appraisal.

The purpose of this report is to provide taxpayers with information which will assist them in determining the equity of the assessment of the property they own. It also will be helpful to local officials in evaluating the equity of their taxing system.

For the most part this is a statistical report. Those using the report do need to know something about the definitions of terms and the limitations of the data. These are set forth in the brief text that precedes the tables and it is important that this material be understood before attempting to use the statistical information.

APPRAISAL PRACTICES OF TEXAS SCHOOL DISTRICTS  
AND COUNTIES, 1981

Beginning with the 1981 tax rolls, the Texas legislature prohibited the use of an "assessment ratio" other than 100%. Previously, the prevailing practice was to appraise property for local tax purposes and to apply some ratio to the appraised value to determine the assessed value upon which the tax rate was applied.

The new property tax code provides that all property is supposed to be appraised at its market value on January 1st. Few taxing jurisdictions had achieved that goal in 1981. As detailed in the Appendix, the average ratio of appraisals to market value was only 7% in Brewster County ranging up to 99.4% in Reagan County. Among the school districts, appraisal ratios ranged from 6.4% in San Vicente ISD up to 99.2% in Lazbuddie ISD. Of more significance, the level of appraisals compared to market value varied significantly among different types of property.

Determining the ratio of appraisal to current market value is a problem (1) for the state in determining an equitable distribution of state school aid and (2) for taxpayers in determining the relative equity of appraisals and as a guide in rendering property for taxation.

For the state's purpose, the State Property Tax Board (SPTB) has been created to determine the market value of property in each of the 1,070 school districts in the state every other year. SPTB studies resulted in a preliminary determination of property values as of January 1, 1981. Each school district was provided an opportunity to appeal those valuations to an administrative review panel with further review to the Board itself. More than 300 school districts were heard by the review panels and 61 school districts appealed to the Board.<sup>1</sup> The school district ratios in this report are based on the final determination of market value after all administrative appeals.

SCHOOL DISTRICT  
RATIOS

SPTB determined market values for each of 13 categories of property in each school district. In most instances a ratio of appraisals to market value for a sample of properties in that category was determined.

In a few categories, the total market value was determined without reference to the tax roll and without the determination of a ratio of appraisal. In these instances, the ratio shown was calculated by dividing the appraised value of property in that category by the market value determined by SPTB.

#### ALTERNATIVE RATIO

The "Actual Ratio" shown for school districts includes motor vehicles, farm personal property and other personal property which often are not taxed. An "Alternative Ratio" is shown for school districts consisting of the average ratio for the other ten categories of property. In some jurisdictions this "Alternative Ratio" may be more typical than the "Actual Ratio" which includes the SPTB-estimated market value of property not actually appraised and taxed.

#### BEFORE EXEMPTIONS

School tax assessors were instructed to report appraised valuations before exemptions for the elderly and for disabled veterans and acreage appraisals before any reduction for agricultural use under Article VIII (1) d or d-1 of the Texas Constitution. Ratios of appraised to market value, therefore, represent appraisals before exemptions and before any reduction for agricultural valuation.

#### COUNTY RATIOS

In 36 counties, school and county boundaries are coterminous, but in 400 districts that cross county lines the market value for the school district was apportioned to each county in which the district lies.

The portion of the assessed value of taxing jurisdictions overlapping other taxing jurisdictions is recorded by the Texas Municipal Advisory Council. This data is used to determine the indebtedness incurred by all overlapping jurisdictions, and is important in evaluating the ability of a governmental jurisdiction to repay existing debt and leeway to incur additional debt. Such overlapping assessed valuations also are used to apportion existing indebtedness if territory is annexed.

For school districts overlapping two or more counties, the percentage of overlap was applied to the market value of the school district to determine the valuations lying within the geographical boundaries of each county.

The county appraised values exclude values that are not taxed by school districts and were not in the SPTB estimates of market values. These include rolling stock, intangible values of certain transportation companies, and university land.

In addition, the appraised values and market values shown for counties in the Appendix exclude vehicles, agricultural personal property, and other personal property. Privately-owned vehicles are taxable on a local-option basis and agricultural personal property subsequently has been exempted from property taxation.

It is very important that those using this report recognize that county ratios shown are based on allocations described above. Any allocations of this type are subject to error and taxpayers with access to other information in particular counties may have a better basis for determining the level of appraisal than that provided in this report.

#### CENTRAL APPRAISAL DISTRICTS

The 1981 tax year was the end of an era in which each taxing jurisdiction had its own tax office to appraise property. Except for Harris County, which delayed implementation until 1984, property in 1983 will be appraised by countywide central appraisal districts. More than one-half reported reappraisals of property last year (1982). Consequently, the ratios shown herein may have changed. Nevertheless, the 1981 market value figures for each county may be useful in evaluating the current level of appraisals. Local taxpayers can obtain information from the central appraisal district as to 1982 appraised values and the amount of new property added to the roll since 1981. To compare with the market values shown in this report, appraisals of rolling stock, intangibles of certain transportation companies, university land, vehicles, agricultural personal property, and other personal property should be excluded.

## CATEGORIES OF PROPERTY

The following definitions of the 13 categories of property is reproduced from instructions to school district tax assessors.

**Total Market Value.** Section 11.82 of the Texas Education Code requires each office assessing property for school district taxes to report to the State Property Tax Board the total market value of taxable property in the district each year. Accordingly Column (2) of Section II is to reflect total market or appraised value. The values shown here and in Section 1-A must be **before all** homestead and disabled veterans' exemptions (if any) and **all** reductions due to the productive valuation of agricultural lands (if any).

- II. A. Real Property. Residential. Single-Family.** All types of single-family houses including detached houses; single-family parts of semidetached and row or town houses if separately assessed; rural and suburban residences, and single-family units of a condominium. Mobile homes located on land owned by the resident should be reported in this category. No distinction will be made between rural and urban housing as long as the principal use category is residential. **Houses on 5 acres or less should be included in this category.** A house located on a piece of land over 5 acres should be classified in Category E: Farm and Ranch Improvements, even if less than 5 acres has been separated with the improvement to form a residence homestead. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the actual number of housing units on the roll.
- B. Real Property. Residential. Multifamily.** All types of residences containing two or more living units and not on farms, including duplexes and apartment houses. This group includes apartment houses with street level stores and offices. This category does not include motels or hotels (see II.-F.). In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the actual number of duplexes and apartment houses on the tax roll.
- C. Real Property. Vacant Platted Lots and Tracts.** Parcels which usually are described in terms other than acreage, commonly by means of lot and block numbers plus subdivision name. They are usually located either within municipalities or in adjacent or otherwise proximate territory. This category includes platted lots and/or subdivided tracts. **All vacant tracts of land consisting of 5 acres or less should be reported in this category.** Any tract over 5 acres should not be placed here but rather in the Acreage Category (II.-D.) The total number of lots and tracts should be entered in the Units/Accounts Column of Page 1.
- D. Real Property. Farms and Acreage.** This category includes timberland, ranches, recreational acreage, idle land and waste land. Major criteria are rural location and description in terms of acreage. However, it is possible for farms to be located within city limits. **Only tracts over 5 acres should be included here;** those 5 acres or less go in category II.-C. The value of acreage (over 5 acres) owned by commercial, industrial, or utility taxpayers, but not used by them for commercial, industrial, or utility purposes should be reported in this category. Example: If a company owns a 1000-acre tract of land and has a plant located on only 40 acres of that land, the remaining 960 acres should be reported in this category. Indicate in the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1 **the total number of acres** classified in this category.
- E. Real Property. Farm and Ranch Improvements.** Property value of residences, barns, silos, and all other items normally classified as real property improvements, located on tracts of land over 5 acres in size, usually on farm and ranch acreage. A residence located on a tract of land which is over 5 acres in size, but which has less than 5 acres separated with it to form a residence homestead should be reported here, not in Category A, and should include only that land value included in the homestead. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1 enter the number of parcels on the tax roll in this category. **Do not** report any land value in this category other than that which is included in residence homesteads.
- F. Real Property. Commercial and Industrial.** Stores, stores with living quarters, office buildings, hotels and motels, gasoline service stations, commercial garages, parking lots, warehouses, theater buildings, financial institutions (other than banks), credit unions, savings and loan associations, finance companies and insurance companies, clinics and nursing homes, and all other commercial and industrial enterprises excluding banks and utilities. This category also includes real property of factories, bakeries, dairy plants, other food processing plants, mills, and all manufacturing organizations. Specifically excluded from this category is the real property value of banks and utilities in subsequent categories.
- This category only includes real property and specifically excludes personal property such as inventories, machinery and equipment, business automobiles, etc. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the number of parcels on the tax roll in this category.

- G. Real Property. Oil, Gas, and Other Mineral Reserves.** Producing oil and gas wells, and all other minerals being mined including coal, ores, metals, etc. The value here is the value of the reserves in the ground after giving consideration to the length of time required in years to obtain the total reserve and the cost of obtaining the reserve. The equipment used to bring the product to the surface should be included in this category. The value of the surface land is excluded from this category and should be in the "Acreage" Category. The value of non-producing wells and non-mined minerals (including mineral rights) should be shown in this category. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the number of parcels on the tax roll in this category.
- H. Tangible Personal Property. Vehicles.** This category includes privately owned and business automobiles, motorcycles, pick-ups, and other light trucks **under 1 ton capacity.** Automobiles normally classified as business and under 1 ton capacity must be shown in this category and not some other personal property use category. Vehicles 1 ton capacity and over should be reported in either Category L: Business Personal Property or Category K: Farm and Ranch Personal Property, depending on use. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the number of vehicles in this category.
- I. Real and Intangible Personal Property. Banks.** This category is specifically for the real estate and the intangibles included in the stock value of banks, both state and national, as covered by Article 7166 VTCS. Indicate in the Units/Accounts Column the number of banks on the tax roll.
- J. Real and Tangible Personal Property. Utilities.** This category includes the real property and the machinery, fixtures, and equipment of all types for railroads, electric and gas companies, telephone companies, water systems, T.V. and cable companies, cooperatives and others commonly classified as utilities. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the number of parcels on the tax roll in this category.
- K. Tangible Personal Property. Farm and Ranch Equipment, Machinery, and Livestock.** This category includes the value of machinery, equipment, livestock, etc., of all tangible personal property commonly used for, or residing on, farms and ranches of all types. Privately owned vehicles **1 ton capacity and over** used in farming and ranching operations should be included in this category. In Column (1) on Page 1 enter the number of tax roll accounts within the category.
- L. Tangible Personal Property. Business.** This category includes machinery and equipment, inventories, fixtures, and all other tangible personal property of commercial and industrial businesses other than that included in banks, utilities, and farms. Specifically **excluded** from this category is the real property (land and buildings) of commercial and industrial businesses (which should be reported in Category F). Only business vehicles 1 ton capacity and over **not used** in farming and ranching operations should be included in this category. Indicate in the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1 the number of business personal property accounts on the tax roll.
- M. Other Tangible Personal Property.** This category includes privately owned aircraft, watercraft, travel trailers, motor homes, and all other tangible personal property not otherwise shown in the above categories. Mobile homes located on land rented or leased by the resident should be included in this category. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the number of parcels and/or accounts on the tax roll in the category.
- N. Intangible Personal Property.** All taxable intangible personal property not otherwise classified.  
Examples include the intangible value of insurance companies and savings and loan associations. **Only** property of a representative nature should be included in this category. The value of mineral rights should not be included here, but in Category G. In the Units/Accounts Column on Page 1, enter the number of accounts on the tax roll in this category. All real and tangible personal property should be reported in other property categories.
