22	that state based on conduct of the business that occurs in whole or

24	(c) A business described by Subsection (b)(1) is entitled to

- 2 another state that the business collect and remit sales or use taxes
- 3 to that state constitutes an undue burden on interstate commerce
- 4 under Section 8, Article I, United States Constitution.
- 5 (d) In determining whether to grant declaratory relief to a
 6 business under this section, a court shall consider:
- 7 (1) the factual circumstances of the business's
- 8 operations that give rise to the demand by the other state; and
- 9 (2) the decisions of other courts interpreting Section
 10 8, Article I, United States Constitution.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 37.0055, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 12 Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that
- 13 accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of
- 14 action that accrues before the effective date of this Act is
- 15 governed by the law in effect at the time the action accrued, and
- 16 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
