

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the creation of the East Williamson County
3 Multi-Institution Teaching Center.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Chapter 130, Education Code, is amended by
6 adding Subchapter F to read as follows:

7 SUBCHAPTER F. SPECIAL PROGRAMS OPERATED BY CERTAIN JUNIOR COLLEGE
8 DISTRICTS

9 Sec. 130.091. DEFINITION. In this chapter "institution of
10 higher education" has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.

11 Sec. 130.092. EAST WILLIAMSON COUNTY MULTI-INSTITUTION
12 TEACHING CENTER. (a) The Temple Junior College District may
13 establish, in conjunction with at least one of the following
14 institutions, the East Williamson County Multi-Institution
15 Teaching Center:

16 (1) Tarleton State University;

17 (2) Tarleton State University System Center--Central
18 Texas;

19 (3) Texas State Technical College--Waco; or

20 (4) another public or private institution of higher
21 education.

22 (b) The center shall provide coordinated higher education
23 opportunities to the residents of the region in which the center is
24 located by offering academic credit courses and programs from the

1 member institutions of the center. The center must be administered
2 under a formal agreement entered into by the Temple Junior College
3 District with the other member institutions.

4 (c) The member institutions of the center shall work with
5 the local community to identify and offer courses that will meet the
6 educational and workforce development goals for the region served
7 by the center.

8 (d) The member institutions of the center may, under the
9 terms of the formal agreement, make provisions for adequate
10 physical facilities for use by the center.

11 (e) The member institutions of the center may solicit,
12 accept, and administer, on terms and conditions acceptable to the
13 members, gifts, grants, or donations of any kind and from any source
14 for use by the center.

15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
19 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
