- 4 (c) The member institutions of the center shall work with
- 5 the local community to identify and offer courses that will meet the
- 6 educational and workforce development goals for the region served
- 7 by the center.
- 8 (d) The member institutions of the center may, under the
- 9 terms of the formal agreement, make provisions for adequate
- 10 physical facilities for use by the center.
- 11 (e) The member institutions of the center may solicit,
- 12 accept, and administer, on terms and conditions acceptable to the
- members, gifts, grants, or donations of any kind and from any source
- 14 for use by the center.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
