

1 AN ACT

2 relating to hunting and fishing license fee exemptions for certain  
3 members of the armed forces.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 42.012(b), Parks and Wildlife Code, is  
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (b) The commission may set a lower fee or waive the fee or  
8 license requirement for a resident who is under 17 years old, 65  
9 years old or older, or participating in an event that is sponsored  
10 or co-sponsored by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department with the  
11 approval of the executive director. The commission shall waive the  
12 fee for a qualified disabled veteran and for a resident on active  
13 duty as a member of the United States military forces, the Texas  
14 Army National Guard, the Texas Air National Guard, or the Texas  
15 State Guard.

16 SECTION 2. Section 46.004(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is  
17 amended to read as follows:

18 (c) The commission shall waive the fee for a qualified  
19 disabled veteran as defined by Section 42.012 and for a resident on  
20 active duty as a member of the United States military forces, the  
21 Texas Army National Guard, the Texas Air National Guard, or the  
22 Texas State Guard.

23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
3 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
