AN ACT 1 relating to the powers and duties of, and the entities reviewed by, 2 the Sunset Advisory Commission. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 ARTICLE 1. CHANGES TO TEXAS SUNSET ACT SECTION 1.01. Sections 325.003(a), (b), (d), (e), and (j), 6 7 Government Code, are amended to read as follows: The Sunset Advisory Commission consists of five members 8 of the senate and one public member appointed by the lieutenant 9 governor and five members of the house of representatives and one 10 public member appointed by the speaker of the house. The lieutenant

may serve [designate himself] as one of the legislative appointees. 13 An individual is not eligible for appointment as a 14 public member if the individual or the individual's spouse is: 15

governor and the speaker of the house [Each appointing authority]

- regulated by a state agency that the commission 16 (1) will review during the term for which the individual would serve; 17 18 [or]
- employed by, participates in the management of, or 19 directly or indirectly has more than a 10 percent interest in a 20 business entity or other organization regulated by a state agency 21 the commission will review during the term for which the individual 22 23 would serve; or
- (3) required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 24

- 1 305 because of the person's activities for compensation on behalf
- 2 of a profession or entity related to the operation of an agency
- 3 under review.
- 4 (d) Legislative members serve four-year terms, with terms
- 5 staggered so that the terms of as near to one-half of the
- 6 legislative members appointed by the lieutenant governor as
- 7 possible and the terms of as near to one-half of the legislative
- 8 members appointed by the speaker as possible expire September 1 of
- 9 each odd-numbered year. If the lieutenant governor or the speaker
- 10 serves on the commission, service [he] continues [to-serve] until
- 11 resignation from the commission or until the individual [he] ceases
- 12 to hold the office. Public members serve two-year terms expiring
- 13 September 1 of each odd-numbered year.
- 14 (e) Members other than the lieutenant governor and the
- speaker are subject to the following restrictions:
- 16 (1) after an individual serves six years on the
- 17 commission, the individual is not eligible for appointment to
- 18 another term or part of a term;
- 19 (2) a legislative member who serves [more than half
- 20 of] a full term may not be appointed to an immediately succeeding
- 21 term; and
- 22 (3) a public member may not serve more than two
- 23 consecutive terms, and, for purposes of this prohibition, a member
- 24 is considered to have served a term only if the member has served
- 25 more than half of the term.
- 26 (j) Seven members of the commission constitute a quorum. A
- 27 final action or recommendation may not be made unless approved by a

- 1 record vote of a majority of members appointed by the lieutenant
- 2 governor and the speaker of the house [the commission's full
- 3 membership]. All other actions by the commission shall be decided
- 4 by a majority of the members present and voting.
- 5 SECTION 1.02. Section 325.007, Government Code, is amended

- 7 Sec. 325.007. AGENCY REPORT TO COMMISSION. Before
- 8 <u>September 1</u> [October 30] of the odd-numbered year before the year in

- 12 agency of the criteria in Section 325.011; and
- 13 (2) any other information that the agency considers
- 14 appropriate or that is requested by the commission.
- 15 SECTION 1.03. Section 325.008(a), Government Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) Before January [September] 1 of [the even-numbered year
- 18 before] the year in which a state agency subject to this chapter and
- 19 its advisory committees are abolished, the commission shall:
- 20 (1) review and take action necessary to verify the
- 21 reports submitted by the agency under Section 325.007;
- 22 (2) consult the Legislative Budget Board, the
- 23 Governor's Budget, Policy, and Planning Division [Office], the
- 24 State Auditor, and the comptroller of public accounts, or their
- 25 successors, on the application to the agency of the criteria
- 26 provided in Section 325.011;
- 27 (3) conduct a <u>review</u> [performance evaluation] of the

- 1 agency based on the criteria provided in Section 325.011 and
- 2 prepare a written report; and
- 3 (4) review the implementation of commission
- 4 recommendations contained in the reports presented to the
- 5 legislature during the preceding legislative session and the
- 6 resulting legislation.
- 7 SECTION 1.04. Section 325.009, Government Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 325.009. PUBLIC HEARINGS. (a) Before February
- 10 [Between September 1 and December] 1 of [the calendar year before]
- 11 the year a state agency subject to this chapter and its advisory
- 12 committees are abolished, the commission shall conduct public
- 13 hearings concerning but not limited to the application to the
- 14 agency of the criteria provided in Section 325.011.
- 15 (b) The commission may hold the public hearings <u>after</u>
- 16 [before September 1 if] the review [evaluation] of the agency
- 17 required by Section 325.008(a)(3) is complete and available to the
- 18 public.
- 19 SECTION 1.05. Section 325.010, Government Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- Sec. 325.010. COMMISSION REPORT. (a) At each regular
- 22 legislative session, the commission shall present to the
- 23 legislature and the governor a report on the agencies and advisory
- committees reviewed [scheduled to be abolished].
- 25 (b) In the report the commission shall include:
- 26 (1) its [specific] findings regarding [each of] the
- 27 criteria prescribed by Section 325.011;

- 1 (2) its recommendations based on the matters
- 2 prescribed by Section 325.012; and
- 3 (3) other information the commission considers
- 4 necessary for a complete <u>review</u> [evaluation] of the agency.
- 5 SECTION 1.06. Section 325.011, Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 325.011. CRITERIA FOR REVIEW. The commission and its
- 8 staff shall consider the following criteria in determining whether
- 9 a public need exists for the continuation of a state agency or its
- 10 advisory committees or for the performance of the functions of the

- 12 (1) the efficiency and effectiveness with which the
- 13 agency or the advisory committee operates;
- 14 (2)(A) an identification of the mission, goals, and
- objectives intended for the agency or advisory committee and of the
- 16 problem or need that the agency or advisory committee was intended
- 17 to address; and
- 18 (B) [7] the extent to which the mission, goals,
- 19 and objectives have been achieved and the problem or need has been
- 20 <u>addressed;</u>
- 21 (3)(A) an identification of[--and] any activities of
- 22 the agency in addition to those granted by statute and of the
- 23 authority for those [these] activities; and
- 24 (B) the extent to which those activities are
- 25 needed;
- 26 (4) [(3)] an assessment of authority of the agency
- 27 relating to fees, inspections, enforcement, and penalties;

- 1 (5) whether less restrictive or alternative methods of 2 performing any <u>function</u> [regulation] that the agency performs 3 [that] could adequately protect or provide service to the public;
- 4 (6) [(4) the extent to which the advisory committee is needed and is used;

- [(5)] the extent to which the jurisdiction of the agency and the programs administered by the agency overlap or duplicate those of other agencies, the extent to which the agency coordinates with those agencies, and the extent to which the programs administered by the agency can be consolidated with the programs of other state agencies;
- (7) [(6) whether the agency has recommended to the legislature statutory changes calculated to be of benefit to the public rather than to an occupation, business, or institution that the agency regulates;
- [(7)] the promptness and effectiveness with which the agency addresses [disposes of] complaints concerning entities or other persons affected by the agency, including an assessment of the agency's administrative hearings process;
- and the extent to which the agency has encouraged participation by the public in making its rules and decisions [as opposed to participation solely by those it regulates] and the extent to which the public participation has resulted in rules that benefit the public [compatible with the objectives of the agency];
- (9) the extent to which the agency has complied with [applicable requirements of]:

- 1 (A) <u>federal and state laws and applicable rules</u>
- 2 [an agency of the United States or of this state] regarding equality
- 3 of employment opportunity and the rights and privacy of
- 4 individuals; and
- 5 (B) state law and applicable rules of any state
- 6 agency regarding purchasing guidelines [goals] and programs for
- 7 historically underutilized businesses;
- 8 (10) [the extent to which changes are necessary in the
- 9 enabling statutes of the agency so that the agency can adequately
- 10 comply with the criteria listed in this section;
- 11 $\left[\frac{(11)}{11}\right]$ the extent to which the agency issues and
- 12 enforces rules relating to potential conflicts of interest of its
- 13 employees;
- (11) $[\frac{(12)}{(12)}]$ the extent to which the agency complies
- with Chapters 551 and 552 and follows records management practices
- 16 that enable the agency to respond efficiently to requests for
- 17 public information; and
- 18 $\underline{(12)}$ [(13)] the effect of federal intervention or loss
- 19 of federal funds if the agency is abolished.
- SECTION 1.07. Section 325.012, Government Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- Sec. 325.012. RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) In its report on a state
- 23 agency, the commission shall:
- 24 (1) make recommendations on the abolition,
- 25 continuation, or reorganization of each affected state agency and
- 26 its advisory committees and on the need for the performance of the
- 27 functions of the agency and its advisory committees;

- 1 (2) make recommendations on the consolidation,
- 2 transfer, or reorganization of programs within state agencies not
- 3 under review when the programs duplicate functions performed in
- 4 agencies under review; and
- 5 (3) make recommendations to improve the operations of
- 6 the agency, its policy body, and its advisory committees, including
- 7 management recommendations that do not require a change in the
- 8 <u>agency's enabling statute.</u>
- 9 (b) The commission shall include the estimated fiscal
- 10 impact of its recommendations and may recommend appropriation
- 11 levels for certain programs to improve the operations of the state
- 12 agency, to be forwarded to the Legislative <u>Budget Board</u>.
- (c) The commission shall have [recommend appropriation
- 14 levels for each state agency and advisory committee for which
- 15 abolition or reorganization is recommended under Subdivision (1) or
- 16 $\frac{(2)}{}$ and
- 17 [(4) include] drafts of legislation prepared
- 18 [necessary] to carry out the commission's recommendations under
- 19 this section [Subdivisions (1) and (2)].
- 20 (d) After the legislature acts on the report [(b) On the
- 21 date the commission presents its report to the legislature] under
- 22 Section 325.010, the commission shall present to the state auditor
- 23 the commission's recommendations that do not require a statutory
- 24 change to be put into effect. Based on a risk assessment and
- 25 subject to the legislative audit committee's approval of including
- 26 the examination in the audit plan under Section 321.013, the state
- 27 auditor may examine the recommendations and include as part of the

- 1 next approved audit of the agency a report on whether the agency has
- 2 implemented the recommendations and, if so, in what manner.
- 3 SECTION 1.08. Section 325.0125, Government Code, is amended

- 14 (c) The commission's action in exempting agencies under
- 15 this section must be done by an affirmative record vote and must be
- 16 decided by a majority of all members present and voting [of the
- 17 commission].
- 18 SECTION 1.09. Section 325.016, Government Code, is
- 19 repealed.
- SECTION 1.10. Section 325.017(e), Government Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- (e) Unless the governor designates an appropriate state
- 23 agency as prescribed by Subsection (f), property and records in the
- 24 custody of an abolished state agency or advisory committee on
- 25 September 1 of the even-numbered year after abolishment shall be
- 26 transferred to the <u>Texas Building and Procurement</u> [State Purchasing
