

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the transfer of Angelo State University to the Texas  
3 Tech University System.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subtitle F, Title 3, Education Code,  
6 is amended by adding Chapter 109A to read as follows:

7 CHAPTER 109A. ANGELO STATE UNIVERSITY

8 Sec. 109A.001. ESTABLISHMENT; SCOPE. (a) Angelo State  
9 University is a general academic teaching institution located in  
10 the city of San Angelo.

11 (b) The university is a component institution of the Texas  
12 Tech University System and is under the management and control of  
13 the board of regents of the Texas Tech University System. The board  
14 of regents has the same powers and duties concerning Angelo State  
15 University as are conferred on the board by statute concerning  
16 Texas Tech University and Texas Tech University Health Sciences  
17 Center.

18 Sec. 109A.002. COURSES AND DEGREES; RULES; AFFILIATION  
19 AGREEMENTS; JOINT APPOINTMENTS. (a) The board of regents, with the  
20 approval of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, may  
21 prescribe courses at the university leading to customary degrees as  
22 are offered at leading American educational institutions and may  
23 award those degrees, including baccalaureate, master's, and  
24 doctoral degrees and their equivalents.

1       (b) A new department, school, or degree program may not be  
2 instituted at the university without the prior approval of the  
3 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

4       (c) The board of regents shall adopt rules for the  
5 operation, control, and management of the university as may be  
6 necessary for the conduct of the university as one of the first  
7 class.

8       (d) The board may enter into an affiliation or coordination  
9 agreement with any other entity or institution in this state to  
10 further the purposes of the university.

11       (e) The board may make joint faculty appointments in Angelo  
12 State University and in other institutions under its governance.  
13 The board may make a joint faculty appointment in Angelo State  
14 University concurrently with the appointment of the faculty member  
15 by another institution of higher education in accordance with an  
16 affiliation agreement described by Subsection (d). The salary of a  
17 person who receives a joint appointment shall be apportioned to the  
18 appointing institutions on the basis of services rendered.

19       Sec. 109A.003. OBLIGATIONS AND BENEFITS OF STATE LAW. The  
20 university is subject to the obligations and entitled to the  
21 benefits of all laws of this state applicable to all other state  
22 institutions of higher education, except that this subchapter  
23 prevails to the extent of any conflict between this subchapter and  
24 any other law of this state.

25       Sec. 109A.004. MILITARY TRAINING. The university may not  
26 require a student to participate in military training as a  
27 condition for admission to or graduation from the university.

1           SECTION 2. TRANSFER OF GOVERNANCE OF UNIVERSITY. The  
2 governance, control, management, and property of Angelo State  
3 University are transferred from the board of regents of the Texas  
4 State University System to the board of regents of the Texas Tech  
5 University System. The transfer is governed by Sections 3 through 7  
6 of this Act.

7           SECTION 3. POWERS AND DUTIES; RULES AND POLICIES. (a) When  
8 the transfer takes effect, the board of regents of the Texas Tech  
9 University System shall govern, operate, manage, and control Angelo  
10 State University and all land, buildings, facilities,  
11 improvements, equipment, supplies, and property belonging to and  
12 constituting Angelo State University under the powers and duties  
13 conferred by law on the board of regents.

14           (b) Rules and policies adopted by the board of regents of  
15 the Texas State University System to govern the university that are  
16 in effect when the transfer takes effect are continued in effect  
17 until adopted, repealed, or superseded by the board of regents of  
18 the Texas Tech University System. The board of regents of the Texas  
19 Tech University System may adopt rules and policies applicable to  
20 the university in anticipation of the transfer authorized by this  
21 Act.

22           SECTION 4. CONTRACTS AND CERTAIN WRITTEN OBLIGATIONS.  
23 Contracts and written obligations of every kind and character  
24 entered into by the board of regents of the Texas State University  
25 System for and on behalf of Angelo State University, other than  
26 bonds, are considered ratified, confirmed, and validated by the  
27 board of regents of the Texas Tech University System on the

1 effective date of the transfer. In those contracts and written  
2 obligations, the board of regents of the Texas Tech University  
3 System is substituted for and stands and acts in the place of the  
4 board of regents of the Texas State University System to the extent  
5 permitted by law.

6 SECTION 5. EFFECT OF TRANSFER ON STUDENTS AND EMPLOYEES.

7 (a) The transfer of the governance of Angelo State University under  
8 this Act does not affect the status of any student of the  
9 university.

10 (b) The transfer of the governance of Angelo State  
11 University under this Act does not affect the employment status or  
12 accrued benefits of a person employed by the university when the  
13 transfer takes effect.

14 SECTION 6. CURRENT FUNDING. All funds that, on the  
15 effective date of the transfer, have been appropriated or dedicated  
16 to or are held for the use and benefit of Angelo State University  
17 under the governance of the board of regents of the Texas State  
18 University System are transferred to the board of regents of the  
19 Texas Tech University System for the use and benefit of Angelo State  
20 University.

21 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT; ROLE OF COORDINATING BOARD.

22 It is the intent of the legislature that the transfer of the  
23 governance of Angelo State University from the board of regents of  
24 the Texas State University System to the board of regents of the  
25 Texas Tech University System be made without disrupting the  
26 students, faculty, staff, or programs of the university. If those  
27 boards of regents are unable to agree as to any matter relating to

1 the transfer, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board on  
2 application of either board of regents shall resolve the  
3 disagreement consistent with the intent of this section and the  
4 provisions of this Act as the coordinating board determines is in  
5 the best interest of this state and the institutions under the  
6 governance of the boards of regents. The coordinating board may  
7 issue any orders or take any other action the coordinating board  
8 considers appropriate to enforce this section or to facilitate the  
9 transfer consistent with this Act and the intent of the  
10 legislature.

11 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 55.1724(a), Education Code,  
12 is amended to read as follows:

13 (a) In addition to the other authority granted by this  
14 subchapter, the board of regents of the Texas State University  
15 System may acquire, purchase, construct, improve, renovate,  
16 enlarge, or equip property, buildings, structures, facilities,  
17 roads, or related infrastructure for the following institutions to  
18 be financed by the issuance of bonds in accordance with this  
19 subchapter and in accordance with a systemwide revenue financing  
20 program adopted by the board in aggregate principal amounts not to  
21 exceed the following:

- 22 (1) [~~Angelo State University, \$20 million,~~  
23 [~~2~~] Lamar University--Beaumont, \$8 million;  
24 (2) [~~3~~] Lamar Institute of Technology, \$2 million;  
25 (3) [~~4~~] Lamar State College--Orange, \$3.5 million;  
26 (4) [~~5~~] Lamar State College--Port Arthur, \$2.75  
27 million;

- 1           (5) [~~(6)~~] Sam Houston State University, \$7.5 million;  
2           (6) [~~(7)~~] Texas State University--San Marcos, \$19.7  
3 million; and  
4           (7) [~~(8)~~] Sul Ross State University, \$17.5 million.

5           SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 55.1734(a), Education Code,  
6 is amended to read as follows:

7           (a) In addition to the other authority granted by this  
8 subchapter, the board of regents of the Texas State University  
9 System may issue in accordance with this subchapter and in  
10 accordance with a systemwide revenue financing program adopted by  
11 the board bonds for the following institutions not to exceed the  
12 following aggregate principal amounts to finance projects  
13 specified as follows:

14           (1) [~~Angele State University, \$16,917,550 to expand~~  
15 ~~and renovate institutional facilities,~~

16           [~~(2)~~] Lamar University--Beaumont, \$21,792,096 to  
17 renovate and repair campus buildings;

18           (2) [~~(3)~~] Lamar Institute of Technology, \$5,301,960  
19 to renovate Gentry Hall and convert it to classroom and laboratory  
20 use;

21           (3) [~~(4)~~] Lamar State College--Orange, \$2,125,000 for  
22 campus landscaping, renovation of the old library for physical  
23 plant purposes, renovation of the Main Building and Electronics  
24 Commerce Resource Center, and demolition of the old physical plant  
25 building;

26           (4) [~~(5)~~] Lamar State College--Port Arthur,  
27 \$7,650,000 to construct a performing arts and classroom building

1 and to expand the Gates Memorial Library and develop an adjacent  
2 plaza;

3 (5) [~~46~~] Sam Houston State University, \$18 million to  
4 renovate and expand the Farrington Building;

5 (6) [~~47~~] Texas State University--San Marcos,  
6 \$18,436,500 to construct a business building; and

7 (7) [~~48~~] Sul Ross State University, \$15,175,000 to  
8 renovate and expand the range animal science facility and science  
9 building annex and to carry out other building renovations.

10 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Subchapter B, Chapter 55, Education  
11 Code, is amended by adding Section 55.1769 to read as follows:

12 Sec. 55.1769. ANGELO STATE UNIVERSITY. (a) In addition to  
13 the other authority granted by this subchapter, the board of  
14 regents of the Texas Tech University System may issue bonds, in  
15 accordance with this subchapter and with a systemwide revenue  
16 financing program adopted by the board, in the aggregate principal  
17 amounts not to exceed the amounts previously authorized for Angelo  
18 State University by Sections 55.1724 and 55.1734, as those sections  
19 existed immediately before this section took effect, less any  
20 portion of those amounts for which bonds were issued under those  
21 sections for the university before the date this section took  
22 effect. Subject to Subsection (d), bonds issued under this section  
23 for an amount previously authorized by Section 55.1724 or 55.1734  
24 may be used only at Angelo State University for the purposes for  
25 which the bonds for Angelo State University were authorized to be  
26 issued under Section 55.1724 or 55.1734, as applicable.

27 (b) The board may pledge irrevocably to the payment of those

1 bonds all or any part of the revenue funds of an institution,  
2 branch, or entity of the Texas Tech University System, including  
3 student tuition charges. The amount of a pledge made under this  
4 subsection may not be reduced or abrogated while the bonds for which  
5 the pledge is made, or bonds issued to refund those bonds, are  
6 outstanding.

7 (c) If sufficient funds are not available to the board to  
8 meet its obligations under this section, the board may transfer  
9 funds among institutions, branches, and entities of the Texas Tech  
10 University System to ensure the most equitable and efficient  
11 allocation of available resources for each institution, branch, or  
12 entity to carry out its duties and purposes.

13 (d) Any portion of the proceeds of bonds authorized by this  
14 section for one or more specified projects that is not required for  
15 the specified projects may be used to renovate existing structures  
16 and facilities at the university.

17 SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 62.021(a), Education Code,  
18 is amended to read as follows:

19 (a) In each state fiscal year beginning with the state  
20 fiscal year ending August 31, 2008, an eligible institution is  
21 entitled to receive an amount allocated in accordance with this  
22 section from funds appropriated for that year by Section 17(a),  
23 Article VII, Texas Constitution. The comptroller shall distribute  
24 funds allocated under this subsection only on presentation of a  
25 claim and issuance of a warrant in accordance with Section 403.071,  
26 Government Code. The comptroller may not issue a warrant from any  
27 funds allocated under this subsection before the delivery of goods



1 or services described in Section 17, Article VII, Texas  
2 Constitution, except for the payment of principal or interest on  
3 bonds or notes or for a payment for a book or other published  
4 library material as authorized by Section 2155.386, Government  
5 Code. The allocation of funds under this subsection is made in  
6 accordance with an equitable formula consisting of the following  
7 elements: space deficit, facilities condition, institutional  
8 complexity, and a separate allocation for the Texas State Technical  
9 College System. The annual amounts allocated by the formula are as  
10 follows:

- 11 (1) \$3,434,348 to Midwestern State University;
- 12 (2) \$26,137,233 to the University of North Texas;
- 13 (3) \$8,139,391 to the University of North Texas Health  
14 Science Center at Fort Worth;
- 15 (4) \$12,882,348 to The University of Texas--Pan

- 17 (5) \$4,186,790 to The University of Texas at  
18 Brownsville;
- 19 (6) \$7,025,771 to Stephen F. Austin State University;
- 20 (7) to the following component institutions of the  
21 Texas State University System:

- 23 (B) \$1,115,048 to Lamar State College--Orange;
- 24 (C) \$1,190,119 to Lamar State College--Port  
25 Arthur;

18 (D) Texas State Technical College--Waco.

19 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 501.022, Labor Code, is  
20 amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 501.022. EMPLOYEES OF COMPONENT INSTITUTIONS OF TEXAS  
22 TECH UNIVERSITY SYSTEM [~~EMPLOYEES~~]. (a) An eligible employee of  
23 Texas Tech University, Texas Tech University Health Sciences  
24 Center, Angelo State University, or another agency under the  
25 direction and control of the board of regents of Texas Tech  
26 University System [~~and Texas Tech University Health Sciences~~  
27 ~~Center~~] is entitled to participate in the workers' compensation

1 program for state employees provided under this chapter.

2 (b) For purposes of this chapter, Texas Tech University is a  
3 state agency and shall act in the capacity of employer.

4 (c) For purposes of this chapter, Texas Tech University  
5 Health Sciences Center is a state agency and shall act in the  
6 capacity of employer.

7 (d) For purposes of this chapter, Angelo State University is  
8 a state agency and shall act in the capacity of employer.

9 SECTION 13. REPEALER. Subchapter B, Chapter 96, Education  
10 Code, is repealed.

11 SECTION 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect  
12 September 1, 2007.
