

AN ACT

relating to the enterprise zone program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Sections 2303.003(5-a) and (7), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

(5-a) "Office" means the Texas Economic Development and Tourism Office within the office of the governor.

(7) "Qualified employee" means a person who:

(A) works for a qualified business; and

(B) performs at least 50 percent of the person's service for the business at the qualified business site [~~in the enterprise zone~~].

SECTION 2. Section 2303.004, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2303.004. JURISDICTION OF MUNICIPALITY. (a) For the purposes of this chapter, territory in the municipal boundaries and in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality is considered to be in the jurisdiction of the municipality.

(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the governing body of a county with a population of 750,000 or more may nominate for designation as an enterprise project a project or activity of a qualified business that is located within the jurisdiction of a municipality located in the county. For purposes of this subsection, a county during any biennium may not use in any one

1 municipality more than three of the maximum number of designations  
2 the county is permitted under Section 2303.406(d)(2).

3 SECTION 3. Section 2303.052, Government Code, is amended to  
4 read as follows:

5 Sec. 2303.052. BANK [~~EVALUATION,~~] REPORT REGARDING  
6 PROGRAM. [~~(a)~~] The bank must include the following information  
7 regarding the enterprise zone program in the report required by  
8 Section 489.107 [~~shall conduct a continuing evaluation of the~~  
9 ~~enterprise zone program.~~

10 [~~(b) The bank shall develop data from available information~~  
11 ~~demonstrating the relationship between the incentives provided~~  
12 ~~under this chapter and the economy.~~

13 [~~(c) The bank biennially shall review local incentives.~~

14 [~~(d) On or before January 1 of each year the bank shall~~  
15 ~~submit to the governor, the legislature, and the Legislative Budget~~  
16 ~~Board a report that]:~~

17 (1) an evaluation of [~~evaluates~~] the effectiveness of  
18 the [~~enterprise zone~~] program;

19 (2) a description of [~~describes~~] the use of state and  
20 local incentives under this chapter and their effect on revenue;  
21 and

22 (3) suggestions for [~~suggests~~] legislation with  
23 regard to the program.

24 SECTION 4. Section 2303.401, Government Code, is amended to  
25 read as follows:

26 Sec. 2303.401. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

27 (1) "New permanent job" means a new employment

1 position that:

2           (A) is created by a qualified business as  
3 described by Section 2303.402 at the qualified business site not  
4 earlier than the 90th day before the date the business's project or  
5 activity is designated as an enterprise project under this chapter;

6           (B) will provide or has provided for the duration  
7 of the project's designation period [~~that~~;

8           [~~(A) has provided~~] at least 1,820 hours of  
9 employment a year to a qualified employee; and

10           (C) will [~~(B) is intended to~~] exist or has  
11 existed at the qualified business site for the longer of:

12                   (i) the duration of the project's  
13 designation period; or

14                   (ii) [~~at least~~] three years after the date  
15 on which a state benefit is received as authorized by this chapter.

16           (2) "Retained job" means a job that:

17           (A) existed with a qualified business on the 91st  
18 day before the date [~~designation of~~] the business's project or  
19 activity is designated as an enterprise project;

20           (B) [~~that~~;

21           [~~(A)~~] has provided and will continue to provide  
22 employment to a qualified employee of at least 1,820 hours  
23 annually; and

24           (C) will [~~(B) is intended to~~] be or has been an  
25 employment position for the longer of:

26                   (i) the duration of the project's  
27 designation period; or

1                   (ii) [~~at least~~] three years after the  
2 expiration date of the claim period for receipt of [date on which] a  
3 state benefit [~~is received as~~] authorized by this chapter.

4           SECTION 5. Section 2303.402(c), Government Code, is amended  
5 to read as follows:

6           (c) For the purposes of this section, an economically  
7 disadvantaged individual is an individual who:

8                   (1) was unemployed for at least three months before  
9 obtaining employment with the qualified business;

10                   (2) receives public assistance benefits, including  
11 welfare payments or food stamps, based on need and intended to  
12 alleviate poverty;

13                   (3) is a low-income [~~an economically disadvantaged~~]  
14 individual, as defined by Section 101, Workforce Investment Act of  
15 1998 (29 U.S.C. Section 2801(25)) [~~4(8), Job Training Partnership~~  
16 ~~Act (29 U.S.C. Section 1503(8))~~];

17                   (4) is an individual with a disability [~~handicaps~~], as  
18 defined by 29 U.S.C. Section 705(20)(A) [~~706(8)~~];

19                   (5) is an inmate, as defined by Section 498.001;

20                   (6) is entering the workplace after being confined in  
21 a facility operated by the institutional division of the Texas  
22 Department of Criminal Justice or under contract with the Texas  
23 Department of Criminal Justice;

24                   (7) has been released by the Texas Youth Commission  
25 and is on parole, if state law provides for such a person to be on  
26 parole; or

27                   (8) meets the current low income or moderate income

1 limits developed under Section 8, United States Housing Act of 1937  
2 (42 U.S.C. Section 1437f et seq.).

3 SECTION 6. Section 2303.403, Government Code, is amended to  
4 read as follows:

5 Sec. 2303.403. PROHIBITION ON QUALIFIED BUSINESS  
6 CERTIFICATION; LIMIT ON ENTERPRISE PROJECT DESIGNATIONS. If the  
7 bank determines that the governing body eligible to nominate an  
8 enterprise project is not complying with this chapter, the bank  
9 shall prohibit the certification of a qualified business until the  
10 bank determines that the governing body is complying with this  
11 chapter. The bank may not designate more than 105 [85] enterprise  
12 projects during any biennium. Any designations remaining at the  
13 end of a biennium may be carried forward to the next biennium.

14 SECTION 7. Section 2303.404(c), Government Code, is amended  
15 to read as follows:

16 (c) The designation period for an enterprise project may not  
17 be for less than one year or more than [exceed] five years from the  
18 date on which the designation is made.

19 SECTION 8. Sections 2303.405(a) and (b), Government Code,  
20 are amended to read as follows:

21 (a) If the governing body approves a request made under  
22 Section 2303.404, the governing body may apply to the bank for the  
23 designation of the project or activity of a qualified business as an  
24 enterprise project only after it submits to the bank the order or  
25 ordinance and other information that complies with the requirements  
26 of Sections 2303.4051 and 2303.4052.

27 (b) An application must contain an economic analysis of the

1 plans of the qualified business for expansion, revitalization, or  
2 other activity with regard to the enterprise project, including:

3 (1) the number of employment positions in existence at  
4 the qualified business site on the 91st day before the application  
5 deadline;

6 (1-a) the number of [~~anticipated~~] new permanent jobs  
7 the enterprise project commits to [~~will~~] create during the  
8 designation period presented in the form of a tabular listing of:

9 (A) the classification titles of those jobs; and

10 (B) the number of jobs and salary range for each  
11 classification title;

12 (2) the [~~anticipated~~] number of permanent jobs the  
13 enterprise project commits to [~~will~~] retain during the designation  
14 period presented in the form of a tabular listing of:

15 (A) the classification titles of the retained  
16 jobs; and

17 (B) the number of retained jobs and salary range  
18 for each classification title;

19 (3) the amount of investment to be made by the  
20 enterprise project;

21 (4) a complete description of the projected schedule  
22 for completion of the specific activity described by Section  
23 2303.404(b) to be undertaken by the enterprise project;

24 (5) other information the bank requires;

25 (6) a description of the local effort made by the  
26 nominating body, the qualified business, and other affected  
27 entities to develop and revitalize the jurisdiction of the

1 governmental entity nominating the project or activity; and

2 (7) if the nominating body is applying for a double or  
3 triple jumbo enterprise project, as defined by Section 2303.407, an  
4 indication of which level [~~of these types~~] of designation  
5 [~~designations~~] is being sought.

6 SECTION 9. Sections 2303.4051(a), (b), (e), (f), and (g),  
7 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

8 (a) In this section, "local incentive" means each tax  
9 incentive, grant, other financial incentive or benefit, or program  
10 to be provided by the governing body to qualified businesses  
11 participating in the enterprise zone program [~~business enterprises~~  
12 ~~in the block group~~] and any other local incentive listed in Section  
13 2303.511.

14 (b) Before nominating the project or activity of a qualified  
15 business for designation as an enterprise project, the governing  
16 body of the municipality or county in which the business is located,  
17 by ordinance or order, as appropriate, must identify and summarize  
18 briefly any local incentives available[+  
19

20 [~~(1) in each of the block groups or other areas within~~  
21 ~~its jurisdiction that qualify as an enterprise zone under Section~~  
22 ~~2303.101, if any, and~~

23 [~~(2) in any area within its jurisdiction that does not~~  
24 ~~qualify as an enterprise zone].~~

25 (e) An [~~Unless the nominating body holds a public hearing~~  
26 ~~before adopting an ordinance or order under this section, the~~  
27 ~~ordinance or order adopted under this section is not valid unless~~  
28 the nominating body holds a public hearing before adopting the

1 ordinance or order. Notice of the hearing must be published in a  
2 newspaper having general circulation in the municipality not later  
3 than the seventh calendar day before the date of the hearing. The  
4 notice must contain:

- 5           (1) the date, time, and location of the hearing;  
6           (2) the provisions for any tax or other incentives  
7 applicable to the enterprise zone program;

8           (3) the name of the qualified business whose project  
9 or activity is being nominated for enterprise project designation;  
10 and

- 11           (4) the location of the qualified business site.

12           (f) If the nominating body has previously nominated a  
13 project or activity for designation as an enterprise project, the  
14 nominating body, instead of issuing a new ordinance or order under  
15 this section for a nominated project or activity, may by resolution  
16 make a reference to a previously issued ordinance or order that met  
17 the requirements of this section if:

- 18           (1) the resolution nominates the project or activity  
19 for designation as an enterprise project and states:

20                   (A) whether the nominated project or activity is  
21 located in an area designated as an enterprise zone;

22                   (B) the level of enterprise project designation  
23 being sought; and

24                   (C) the ending date of the project's designation  
25 period;

26           (2) the local incentives described in the previously  
27 issued ordinance or order [~~for the areas described by Subsections~~



1 ~~(b)(1) and (2)~~ are [~~substantially~~] the same on the date the  
2 resolution is issued; and

3 (3) the local incentives to be made available to the  
4 nominated project or activity are the same as those made available  
5 to the project or activity that are the subject of the previously  
6 issued ordinance or order.

7 (g) This section does not prohibit a municipality or county  
8 from extending additional incentives, including tax incentives,  
9 for qualified businesses [~~business enterprises~~] in an enterprise  
10 zone by a separate order or ordinance.

11 SECTION 10. Section 2303.4052, Government Code, is amended  
12 to read as follows:

13 Sec. 2303.4052. REQUIRED INFORMATION FROM NOMINATING BODY.  
14 Before nominating the project or activity of a qualified business  
15 for designation as an enterprise project, the nominating body must  
16 submit to the bank:

17 (1) a certified copy of the ordinance or order, as  
18 appropriate, or reference to an ordinance or order as required by  
19 Section 2303.4051;

20 (2) a transcript of all public hearings conducted with  
21 respect to local incentives available to qualified businesses  
22 [~~business enterprises~~] within the jurisdiction of the governmental  
23 entity nominating the project or activity, regardless of whether  
24 those businesses [~~business enterprises~~] are located in an  
25 enterprise zone;

26 (3) the name, title, address, telephone number, and  
27 electronic mail address of the nominating body's liaison designated

1 under Section 2303.204; ~~and~~

2 (4) if the business is seeking job retention benefits,  
3 documentation showing the number of employment positions at the  
4 qualified business site; and

5 (5) any additional information the bank may require.

6 SECTION 11. Section 2303.406, Government Code, is amended  
7 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (g) and (h) to  
8 read as follows:

9 (a) The bank may designate a project or activity of a  
10 business as an enterprise project only if the bank receives all of  
11 the information required by Section 2303.4052 and determines that:

12 (1) the business is a qualified business under Section  
13 2303.402 that is located in or has made a substantial commitment to  
14 locate in an enterprise zone or at a qualified business site;

15 (2) the nominating body making the application has  
16 demonstrated that a high level of cooperation exists among public,  
17 private, and neighborhood entities within the jurisdiction of the  
18 governmental entity nominating the project or activity;

19 (3) the designation will contribute significantly to  
20 the achievement of the plans of the nominating body making the  
21 application for development and revitalization of the area in which  
22 the enterprise project will be located; and

23 (4) if the business is seeking job retention benefits,  
24 the business has clearly demonstrated that:

25 (A) the permanent employees of the business will  
26 be permanently laid off;

27 (B) the business will close down permanently;

1 (C) the business will relocate out-of-state;

2 (D) the business is able to employ individuals in  
3 accordance with Section 2303.402 [a 10 percent increase in the  
4 production capacity of the business will occur]; or

5 (E) [a 10 percent decrease in overall cost per  
6 unit produced will occur;

7 [~~P~~] the business facility has been  
8 legitimately destroyed or substantially impaired because of fire,  
9 flood, tornado, hurricane, or any other natural disaster and that  
10 at least 60 percent of the capital investment is being spent to  
11 repair damages resulting from the disaster [~~or~~

12 [~~C~~] the business facility is both adding a new  
13 business line or product and deleting or decreasing an existing  
14 business line or product, and the designation will prevent the  
15 facility's net production capacity from decreasing].

16 (g) The bank may lower the designation level of a proposed  
17 project or activity nominated for enterprise project designation:

18 (1) if there are fewer designations available than  
19 applications received; or

20 (2) to further the economic interests of the state.

21 (h) A state benefit may not be obtained under this chapter  
22 or Chapter 151, Tax Code, for jobs moved from one jurisdiction in  
23 this state to another jurisdiction in this state.

24 SECTION 12. Section 2303.406(e), Government Code, as added  
25 by Chapter 814, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session,  
26 2003, is amended to read as follows:

27 (e) The office may, during any biennium, designate multiple

1 concurrent enterprise projects to a qualified business located in  
2 an enterprise zone [~~during any biennium~~].

3 SECTION 13. Section 2303.407, Government Code, is amended  
4 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 2303.407. ALLOCATION OF JOBS ELIGIBLE FOR TAX REFUND.

6 (a) The bank shall allocate to an enterprise project the maximum  
7 number of new permanent jobs or retained jobs eligible based on the  
8 amount of capital investment made in the project, the project's  
9 designation level, and the refund per job with a maximum refund to  
10 be included in a computation of a tax refund for the project.

11 (b) A capital investment in a project of:

12 (1) \$40,000 to \$399,999 will result in a refund of up  
13 to \$2,500 per job with a maximum refund of \$25,000 for the creation  
14 or retention of 10 jobs;

15 (2) \$400,000 to \$999,999 will result in a refund of up  
16 to \$2,500 per job with a maximum refund of \$62,500 for the creation  
17 or retention of 25 jobs;

18 (3) \$1,000,000 to \$4,999,999 will result in a refund  
19 of up to \$2,500 per job with a maximum refund of \$312,500 for the  
20 creation or retention of 125 jobs;

21 (4) \$5,000,000 to \$149,999,999 will result in a refund  
22 of up to \$2,500 per job with a maximum refund of \$1,250,000 for the  
23 creation or retention of 500 jobs;

24 (5) \$150,000,000 to \$249,999,999 will result in a  
25 refund of up to \$5,000 per job with a maximum refund of \$2,500,000  
26 for the creation or retention of 500 jobs if the bank designates the  
27 project as a double jumbo enterprise project; or

1           (6) \$250,000,000 or more will result in a refund of up  
2 to \$7,500 per job with a maximum refund of \$3,750,000 for the  
3 creation or retention of at least 500 jobs if the bank designates  
4 the project as a triple jumbo enterprise project.

5           (c) An enterprise project for which a commitment for a [A]  
6 capital investment in the range amount and the creation or  
7 retention of the number of jobs specified [~~described~~] by Subsection  
8 (b)(5) is made is considered a double jumbo enterprise project if  
9 the project is so designated by the bank.

10           (d) An enterprise project for which a commitment for a [A]  
11 capital investment in the range amount and the creation or  
12 retention of the number of jobs specified [~~described~~] by Subsection  
13 (b)(6) is made is considered a triple jumbo enterprise project if  
14 the project is so designated by the bank.

15           SECTION 14. Section 2303.4072, Government Code, is amended  
16 to read as follows:

17           Sec. 2303.4072. ENTERPRISE PROJECT CLAIM FOR STATE BENEFIT.  
18 A person must make a claim to the comptroller for a state benefit as  
19 prescribed under this chapter and Chapter [~~Chapters~~] 151 [~~and 171~~],  
20 Tax Code, not later than 18 months after the date on which the term  
21 of the enterprise project designation expires as provided by  
22 Section 2303.404.

23           SECTION 15. Section 2303.502(c), Government Code, is  
24 amended to read as follows:

25           (c) The bank shall disseminate the reports to the governing  
26 bodies of the entities that nominated the enterprise projects  
27 [~~enterprise zones~~] and others as necessary to advance the purposes

1 of this chapter.

2 SECTION 16. (a) Section 2303.504, Government Code, is  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 2303.504. STATE TAX REFUNDS AND CREDITS; REPORT. (a)  
5 Subject to Section 2303.516, an enterprise project is entitled to:

6 (1) a refund of state taxes under Section 151.429, Tax  
7 Code; and

8 (2) a franchise tax credit under Subchapter Q-1,  
9 Chapter 171, Tax Code.

10 (b) At the time of receipt of any tax benefit available as a  
11 result of participating in the enterprise zone program, including a  
12 state sales and use tax refund or franchise tax credit, three  
13 percent of the amount of the tax benefit shall be transferred to the  
14 Texas economic development bank fund under Subchapter B, Chapter  
15 489, to defray the cost of administering this chapter.

16 (c) Not later than the 60th day after the last day of each  
17 fiscal year, the comptroller shall report to the bank the statewide  
18 total of actual jobs created, actual jobs retained, and the tax  
19 refunds and credits made under this section during that fiscal  
20 year.

21 (b) Chapter 171, Tax Code, is amended by adding Subchapter  
22 Q-1 to read as follows:

23 SUBCHAPTER Q-1. TAX CREDITS FOR ENTERPRISE PROJECTS FOR CERTAIN  
24 CAPITAL INVESTMENTS

25 Sec. 171.815. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

26 (1) "Enterprise project" means:

27 (A) a person designated by the Texas Department

1 of Economic Development as an enterprise project under Chapter  
2 2303, Government Code, on or after September 1, 2001, but before  
3 September 1, 2003; and

4 (B) a person designated by the Texas Economic  
5 Development Bank as an enterprise project under Chapter 2303,  
6 Government Code, on or after September 1, 2003, but before January  
7 1, 2005.

8 (2) "Enterprise zone" has the meaning assigned by  
9 Section 2303.003, Government Code.

10 (3) "Qualified business" means a person certified as a  
11 qualified business under Section 2303.402, Government Code.

12 (4) "Qualified capital investment" means tangible  
13 personal property that is first placed in service in an enterprise  
14 zone by a qualified business that has been designated as an  
15 enterprise project and that is described in Section 1245(a),  
16 Internal Revenue Code, such as engines, machinery, tools, and  
17 implements used in a trade or business or held for investment and  
18 subject to an allowance for depreciation, cost recovery under the  
19 accelerated cost recovery system, or amortization. The term does  
20 not include real property or buildings and their structural  
21 components. Property that is leased under a capitalized lease is  
22 considered a qualified capital investment, but property that is  
23 leased under an operating lease is not considered a qualified  
24 capital investment. Property expensed under Section 179, Internal  
25 Revenue Code, is not considered a qualified capital investment.

26 Sec. 171.816. TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY FIRST PLACED IN  
27 SERVICE IN AN ENTERPRISE ZONE. For purposes of determining whether

1 an investment is a qualified capital investment under Section  
2 171.815, "tangible personal property first placed in service in an  
3 enterprise zone" includes tangible personal property:

4 (1) purchased by an enterprise project for placement  
5 in an improvement that was under active construction or other  
6 physical preparation;

7 (2) identified by a purchase order, invoice, billing,  
8 sales slip, or contract; and

9 (3) physically present at the enterprise project's  
10 qualified business site, as defined by Section 2303.003, Government  
11 Code, and in use by the enterprise project on the original due date  
12 of the report on which the credit is taken.

13 Sec. 171.817. ELIGIBILITY. (a) Subject to Subsection (b),  
14 an enterprise project is eligible for a credit against the tax  
15 imposed under this chapter in the amount and under the conditions  
16 and limitations provided by this subchapter if the enterprise  
17 project is a qualified business.

18 (b) An enterprise project is not eligible for a credit under  
19 this subchapter if the enterprise project claimed a credit under  
20 Subchapter Q before the repeal of that subchapter on January 1,  
21 2008.

22 (c) An enterprise project that is eligible for a credit  
23 under this subchapter may claim a credit or take a carryforward  
24 credit without regard to whether the enterprise zone in which it  
25 made the qualified capital investment subsequently loses its  
26 designation as an enterprise zone.

27 (d) A taxable entity, other than a combined group, may not



1 claim the credit under this subchapter unless the taxable entity  
2 was, on May 1, 2006, subject to the tax imposed by this chapter as  
3 this chapter existed on that date. A taxable entity that is a  
4 combined group may claim the credit for each member entity that was,  
5 on May 1, 2006, subject to the tax imposed by this chapter as this  
6 chapter existed on that date and shall compute the amount of the  
7 credit for that member as provided by this subchapter.

8 Sec. 171.818. CALCULATION OF CREDIT. (a) An enterprise  
9 project that is eligible for a credit under this subchapter may, on  
10 or after the later of January 1, 2008, or the date the project was  
11 designated, establish a credit equal to 7.5 percent of the  
12 qualified capital investment made on or after January 1, 2005, and  
13 before January 1, 2007.

14 (b) The enterprise project may claim the entire credit  
15 earned on a report originally due on or after January 1, 2008, and  
16 before January 1, 2009, subject to Section 171.819.

17 Sec. 171.819. LIMITATIONS. The total credit claimed under  
18 this subchapter for a report, including the amount of any  
19 carryforward credit under Section 171.820, may not exceed 50  
20 percent of the amount of franchise tax due for the report before any  
21 other applicable tax credits.

22 Sec. 171.820. CARRYFORWARD. If an enterprise project is  
23 eligible for a credit that exceeds the limitation under Section  
24 171.819, the enterprise project may carry the unused credit forward  
25 for not more than five consecutive reports.

26 Sec. 171.821. CERTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY. (a) For the  
27 initial and each succeeding report in which a credit is claimed

1 under this subchapter, the enterprise project shall file with its  
2 report, on a form provided by the comptroller, information that  
3 sufficiently demonstrates that the enterprise project is eligible  
4 for the credit.

5 (b) The burden of establishing entitlement to and the value  
6 of the credit is on the enterprise project.

7 Sec. 171.822. ASSIGNMENT PROHIBITED. An enterprise project  
8 may not convey, assign, or transfer the credit allowed under this  
9 subchapter to another entity unless all of the assets of the  
10 enterprise project are conveyed, assigned, or transferred in the  
11 same transaction.

12 Sec. 171.823. BIENNIAL REPORT BY COMPTROLLER. (a) Before  
13 the beginning of each regular session of the legislature, the  
14 comptroller shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor,  
15 and the speaker of the house of representatives a report that  
16 states:

17 (1) the total amount of qualified capital investments  
18 made by enterprise projects that claim a credit under this  
19 subchapter and the average and median wages paid by those  
20 enterprise projects;

21 (2) the total amount of credits applied against the  
22 tax under this chapter and the amount of unused credits, including:

23 (A) the total amount of franchise tax due by  
24 enterprise projects claiming a credit under this subchapter before  
25 and after the application of the credit;

26 (B) the average percentage reduction in  
27 franchise tax due by enterprise projects claiming a credit under

1 this subchapter;

2 (C) the percentage of tax credits that were  
3 awarded to enterprise projects with fewer than 100 employees; and

4 (D) the two-digit standard industrial  
5 classification of enterprise projects claiming a credit under this  
6 subchapter;

7 (3) the geographical distribution of the qualified  
8 capital investments on which tax credit claims are made under this  
9 subchapter; and

10 (4) the impact of the credit provided under this  
11 subchapter on employment, capital investment, personal income, and  
12 state tax revenues.

24 SECTION 22. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter  
25 2303, Government Code, apply only to an application for a  
26 designation under the enterprise zone program under Chapter 2303,  
27 Government Code, as amended by this Act, that is filed on or after

1 the effective date of this Act. An application for designation  
2 under the enterprise zone program that is filed before the  
3 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the  
4 date the application was filed, and the former law is continued in  
5 effect for that purpose.

6 SECTION 23. The changes in law made by this Act to Section  
7 151.429, Tax Code, apply only to an application for a tax refund
