MESSAGE

House Bill No. 3736 requires a study by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) of parole officer caseloads. This study was previously conducted by the Legislature. The bill sets out specific caseloads for each form of supervision that TDCJ must review for fiscal impact to show why they are not hitting the target caseload numbers. The Legislature should now determine whether they are willing to fund the target caseloads.
