

1 AN ACT

2 relating to mileage reimbursement for soil and water conservation
3 district directors and delegates.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 201.077(a) and (c), Agriculture Code,
6 are amended to read as follows:

7 (a) A director may receive compensation in an amount not to
8 exceed \$30 for each day the director attends meetings of the board
9 of directors, plus the state mileage reimbursement rate specified
10 in the General Appropriations Act [~~18 cents a mile~~] for travel each
11 way between the residence of the director and a designated meeting
12 place within the boundaries of the conservation district.

13 (c) Two directors are entitled to receive \$30 a day for not
14 more than two days, and one director is entitled to receive the
15 state mileage reimbursement rate specified in the General
16 Appropriations Act [~~18 cents a mile~~] for travel, while attending
17 the annual statewide meeting of directors.

18 SECTION 2. Section 201.013(e), Agriculture Code, is amended
19 to read as follows:

20 (e) Each delegate to a state district convention, or an
21 alternate attending in the place of a delegate, is entitled to a per
22 diem of \$30 a day for not more than two days and the state mileage
23 reimbursement rate specified in the General Appropriations Act [~~18~~
24 cents a mile] for travel each way between the county seat of the

1 delegate's residence and the convention site. The state board
2 shall pay the per diem and travel allowance.

3 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
4 to travel that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act.
5 Travel occurring before the effective date of this Act is covered by
6 the law in effect when the travel occurs, and the former law is
7 continued in effect for that purpose.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
12 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
