

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the notice of a municipality's or county's intention to
3 issue certificates of obligation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 271.049(a), Local Government Code, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (a) Regardless of the sources of payment of certificates,
8 certificates may not be issued unless the issuer publishes notice
9 of its intention to issue the certificates. The notice must be
10 published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper, as
11 defined by Subchapter C, Chapter 2051, Government Code, that is of
12 general circulation in the area of the issuer, with the date of the
13 first publication to be before the 30th [~~14th~~] day before the date
14 tentatively set for the passage of the order or ordinance
15 authorizing the issuance of the certificates.

16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
20 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
