1 AN ACT

2 relating to the confiscation of firearms and ammunition during a

3 state of disaster.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 418.003, Government Code, is amended to

6 read as follows:

7 Sec. 418.003. LIMITATIONS. This chapter does not:

- 8 (1) limit the governor's authority to apply for,
- 9 administer, or expend any grant, gift, or payment in aid of disaster
- 10 mitigation, preparedness, response, or recovery;
- 11 (2) interfere with the course or conduct of a labor
- 12 dispute, except that actions otherwise authorized by this chapter
- or other laws may be taken when necessary to forestall or mitigate
- 14 imminent or existing danger to public health or safety;
- 15 (3) interfere with dissemination of news or comment on
- 16 public affairs, but any communications facility or organization,
- 17 including radio and television stations, wire services, and
- 18 newspapers, may be required to transmit or print public service
- 19 messages furnishing information or instructions in connection with
- 20 a disaster or potential disaster;
- 21 (4) affect the jurisdiction or responsibilities of
- 22 police forces, fire-fighting forces, units of the armed forces of
- 23 the United States, or of any of their personnel when on active duty,
- 24 but state, local, and interjurisdictional emergency management

- 1 plans shall place reliance on the forces available for performance
- of functions related to disasters; [ex]
- 3 (5) except as provided by Section 418.184, authorize
- 4 the selzure or confiscation of any firearm or ammunition from an
- 5 individual who is lawfully carrying or possessing the firearm or
- 6 ammunition; or
- 7 (6) limit, modify, or abridge the authority of the
- 8 governor to proclaim martial law or exercise any other powers
- 9 vested in the governor under the constitution or laws of this state
- 10 independent of or in conjunction with any provisions of this
- 11 chapter.
- 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
- amended by adding Section 418.184 to read as follows:
- Sec. 418.184. FIREARMS. (a) A peace officer who is acting
- in the lawful execution of the officer's official duties during a
- 16 state of disaster may disarm an individual if the officer
- 17 reasonably believes it is immediately necessary for the protection
- of the officer or another individual.
- (b) The peace officer shall return a firearm and any
- 20 ammunition to an individual disarmed under Subsection (a) before
- 21 ceasing to detain the individual unless the officer:
- (1) arrests the individual for engaging in criminal
- 23 activity; or
- (2) seizes the firearm as evidence in a criminal
- 25 <u>investigation</u>.
- SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 433.002, Government
- 27 Code, is amended to read as follows:

- 1 (b) The directive may provide for:
- 2 (1) control of public and private transportation in
- 3 the affected area;
- 4 (2) designation of specific zones in the affected area
- 5 in which, if necessary, the use and occupancy of buildings and
- 6 vehicles may be controlled;
- 7 (3) control of the movement of persons;
- 8 (4) control of places of amusement or assembly;
- 9 (5) establishment of curfews;
- 10 (6) control of the sale, transportation, and use of
- 11 alcoholic beverages, weapons, and ammunition, except as provided by
- 12 <u>Section 433.0045</u>; and
- 13 (7) control of the storage, use, and transportation of
- 14 explosives or flammable materials considered dangerous to public
- 15 safety.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 433, Government Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Section 433.0045 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 433.0045. FIREARMS. (a) A directive issued under
- 19 this chapter may not authorize the seizure or confiscation of any
- 20 firearm or ammunition from an individual who is lawfully carrying
- or possessing the firearm or ammunition.
- (b) A peace officer who is acting in the lawful execution of
- 23 the officer's official duties during a state of emergency may
- 24 disarm an individual if the officer reasonably believes it is
- 25 <u>immediately</u> necessary for the protection of the officer or another
- 26 <u>individual</u>.
- (c) The peace officer shall return a firearm and any

- 1 ammunition to an individual disarmed under Subsection (b) before
- 2 ceasing to detain the individual unless the officer:
- 3 (1) arrests the individual for engaging in criminal
- 4 <u>activity; or</u>
- 5 (2) seizes the firearm as evidence in a criminal
- 6 investigation.
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 229.001, Local Government Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 9 (d) The exception provided by Subsection (b)(4) does not
- 10 authorize the seizure or confiscation of any firearm or ammunition
- 11 from an individual who is lawfully carrying or possessing the
- 12 firearm or ammunition.
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
