5	SECTION 1. Section 39.907, Utilities Code, is amended by			
6	amending Subsections (b), (e), and (h) and adding Subsections (1),			
7	(j), and (k) to read as follows:			
8	(b) The committee is composed of six members as follows:			
9	(1) the chair of the House Committee on Regulated			
10	Industries;			
11	(2) the chair of the Senate Committee on Business and			
12	Commerce;			
13	(3) the chair of the Senate Committee on Natural			
14	Resources;			
15	(4) a member [three members] of the senate appointed			
16	by the lieutenant governor; and			
17	(5) [(3)] two members of the house of representatives			
18	appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.			
19	(e) The committee shall:			
20	(1) meet at least annually with the commission;			
21	(2) receive information about rules relating to			
22	electric utility restructuring proposed by the commission and may			
23	submit comments to the commission on those proposed rules;			
24	(3) review recommendations for legislation proposed			

- by the commission; [and]
- 2 (4) monitor the effectiveness of electric utility
- 3 restructuring, including the fairness of rates, the reliability of
- 4 service, and the effect of stranded costs, market power, and
- 5 regulation on the normal forces of competition; and
- 6 (5) study and seek policies to ensure that fuel
- 7 resources available to the state are used in a balanced and
- 8 efficient manner and consider the reliability, economic viability,
- 9 and environmental impact of new fuels and generation technologies.
- 10 (h) The chair of the House Committee on Regulated Industries
- and the chair of the Senate Committee on Business and Commerce [one
- 12 of the members of the senate-serving on the committee, designated by
- 13 the lieutenant governor, shall serve as joint chairs of the
- 14 committee.
- (1) In addition to the duties under Subsection (e), the
- 16 committee shall meet at least twice annually to encourage
- 17 cooperation and coordination with the following entities:
- 18 (1) the commission;
- 19 (2) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality;
- 20 (3) the Railroad Commission of Texas;
- 21 (4) the Electric Reliability Council of Texas; and
- 22 (5) the office of the comptroller of public accounts.
- (j) The committee shall consider and discuss policies and
- 24 <u>strategies to ensure that fuel resources available to the state are</u>
- 25 <u>used in a balanced and efficient manner while taking into</u>
- 26 consideration the reliability, economic viability, and
- 27 environmental impact of fuels and technologies, including, but not

2	(1) strategies which protect and preserve the			
3	environment of the state while allowing for access to safe,			
4	economical, and reliable sources of energy;			
5	(2) strategies to ensure that customers of this state			
6	have access to reliable energy;			
7	(3) transmission, congestion, and transportation			
8	constraints and cost, and study strategies to alleviate or prevent			
9	those constraints, for the following sources of energy:			
10	(A) oil and natural gas;			
11	(B) coal and lignite; and			
12	(C) electricity;			
13	(4) capacity needs, reserve margins, market impact,			
14	environmental impact, and reliability of generation, and recommend			
15	strategies to ensure continued investment in generation;			
16	(5) cost-effective, renewable energy, conservation,			
17	and energy-efficient technologies;			
18	(6) policies to ensure that fuel resources available			
19	to the state are used in a balanced and efficient manner; and			
20	(7) the reliability, economic viability, and			
21	environmental impact of new fuels and technologies.			
22	(k) Not later than November 15 of each even-numbered year,			
23	the committee shall report to the governor, the lieutenant			
24	governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives on the			
25	committee's activities under Subsection (j).			
26	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives			

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
