

AN ACT

relating to the creation of the Fulshear Municipal Utility District No. 1 of Fort Bend County; providing authority to impose a tax and issue bonds; granting the power of eminent domain.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 8207 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 8207. FULSHEAR MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

NO. 1 OF FORT BEND COUNTY

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 8207.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

(1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.

(2) "Director" means a board member.

(3) "District" means the Fulshear Municipal Utility District No. 1 of Fort Bend County.

Sec. 8207.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a municipal utility district in Fort Bend County created under and essential to accomplish the purposes of Section 52, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

Sec. 8207.003. CONFIRMATION ELECTION REQUIRED. If the creation of the district is not confirmed at a confirmation election held under Section 8207.024 before September 1, 2011:

(1) the district is dissolved September 1, 2011, except that the district shall:

- 1 (A) pay any debts incurred;
- 2 (B) transfer to Fort Bend County any assets that
- 3 remain after the payment of debts; and
- 4 (C) maintain the organization of the district
- 5 until all debts are paid and remaining assets are transferred; and
- 6 (2) this chapter expires September 1, 2014.

7 Sec. 8207.004. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The
 8 district is initially composed of the territory described by
 9 Section 2 of the Act creating this chapter.

10 (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of
 11 the Act creating this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the
 12 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process
 13 does not affect:

- 14 (1) the organization, existence, or validity of the
- 15 district;
- 16 (2) the right of the district to impose taxes;
- 17 (3) the validity of the district's bonds, notes, or
- 18 indebtedness; or
- 19 (4) the legality or operation of the district or the
- 20 board.

22 SUBCHAPTER A-1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONS

23 Sec. 8207.021. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) The temporary
 24 board consists of:

- 25 (1) Simmi Jaggi Basra;
- 26 (2) Elizabeth Clampitt;
- 27 (3) Derek Hargrove;

1 (4) William Swanson; and

2 (5) Hank Kidd.

3 (b) If a temporary director fails to qualify for office, the
4 Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall appoint a person to
5 fill the vacancy.

6 (c) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:

7 (1) the date directors are elected under Section
8 8207.024; or

9 (2) the date this chapter expires under Section
10 8207.003.

11 Sec. 8207.022. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF TEMPORARY
12 DIRECTORS. As soon as practicable after all the temporary
13 directors have qualified under Section 49.055, Water Code, the
14 temporary directors shall meet at a location in the district
15 agreeable to a majority of the directors. If a location cannot be
16 agreed upon, the directors shall meet at the Fort Bend County
17 Courthouse. At the meeting, the temporary directors shall elect
18 officers from among the temporary directors and conduct any other
19 district business.

20 Sec. 8207.023. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The
21 temporary directors may not hold an election under Section 8207.024
22 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or
23 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has adopted a
24 resolution consenting to the creation of the district.

25 Sec. 8207.024. CONFIRMATION AND INITIAL DIRECTORS'
26 ELECTION. The temporary directors shall hold an election to
27 confirm the creation of the district and to elect five directors as

1 provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.

2 Sec. 8207.025. INITIAL ELECTED DIRECTORS; TERMS. The
3 directors elected under Section 8207.024 shall draw lots to
4 determine which two shall serve until the first regularly scheduled
5 election of directors and which three shall serve until the second
6 regularly scheduled election of directors.

7 Sec. 8207.026. EXPIRATION OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
8 expires September 1, 2014.

9 [Sections 8207.027-8207.050 reserved for expansion]

10 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

11 Sec. 8207.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is
12 governed by a board of five directors.

13 (b) Directors serve staggered four-year terms.

14 [Sections 8207.052-8207.100 reserved for expansion]

15 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

16 Sec. 8207.101. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND
17 DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided by the
18 general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code,
19 applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59,
20 Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

21 Sec. 8207.102. ROAD PROJECTS. (a) To the extent
22 authorized by Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the
23 district may construct, acquire, improve, maintain, or operate
24 macadamized, graveled, or paved roads or turnpikes, or improvements
25 in aid of those roads or turnpikes, inside the district.

26 (b) A road project must meet all applicable construction
27 standards, zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of

1 each municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial
2 jurisdiction the district is located. If the district is not
3 located in the corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction of
4 a municipality, a road project must meet all applicable
5 construction standards, zoning and subdivision requirements, and
6 regulations of each county in which the district is located.

7 (c) The district may not undertake a road project unless
8 each municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial
9 jurisdiction the district is located consents by resolution.

10 Sec. 8207.103. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL ORDINANCES OR
11 RESOLUTIONS. The district shall comply with all applicable
12 requirements of any ordinance or resolution adopted by the
13 governing body of the City of Fulshear.

15 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

16 Sec. 8207.151. TAX TO REPAY BONDS. The district may impose
17 a tax to pay the principal of or interest on bonds or other
18 obligations issued under Section 8207.201.

19 [Sections 8207.152-8207.200 reserved for expansion]

20 SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS

21 Sec. 8207.201. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER
22 OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may issue bonds or other
23 obligations as provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, to
24 finance the construction, maintenance, or operation of a project
25 under Section 8207.101 or 8207.102.

26 (b) The district may not issue bonds or other obligations to
27 finance projects authorized by Section 8207.102 unless the issuance

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1 is approved by a vote of a two-thirds majority of the district
2 voters voting at an election called for that purpose.

3 (c) Bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance
4 projects authorized by Section 8207.102 may not exceed one-fourth
5 of the assessed value of the real property in the district.

6 SECTION 2. The Fulshear Municipal Utility District No. 1 of
7 Fort Bend County includes all the territory contained in the
8 following area:

9 All that certain 559.97 acres of land out of the Churchill Fulshear
10 League, A-29 and being more particularly described by metes and
11 bounds as follows, all coordinates and bearings being referred to
12 the Texas Plain Coordinate System, South Central Zone, all
13 distances shown are surface and may be converted to grid by
14 multiplying by a combined scale factor of 0.99988107.

15 BEGINNING at a found 3/4" iron pipe in the south right-of-way line
16 of F.M. 1093 (100' wide) having state plain coordinates of
17 Y=13812541.25 X=2951919.61;

18 Thence with said south right-of-way line for the following six
19 courses and distances:

21 point;

2 acre tract of land conveyed to Dan Harrison Jr. described in a deed
3 filed at Volume 557, Page 227 Fort Bend County Deed Records to a
4 found 5/8" iron rod with cap for corner;
5 Thence S 88' 39' 14" W - 2303.93', to a found 5/8" iron rod with cap
6 for corner;
7 Thence N 62° 16' 40" W - 1252.23' with the north line of a tract of
8 land conveyed to Dan J. Harrison III and Bruce Finch Harrison in a
9 deed filed at Volume 565, Page 244 Fort Bend County Deed Records;
10 Thence along the margin of Grassy Lake for the following six courses
11 and distances:
12 Thence N 31° 24' 28" E - 152.31' to an angle point;
13 Thence N 34° 24' 37" E - 154.00' to an angle point;
14 Thence N 23° 55' 37" E - 116.30' to an angle point;
15 Thence N 36° 00' 37" E - 224.00' to an angle point;

3 feet) of land for Fulshear M.U.D. No. 1 more or less.

4 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
5 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
6 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
7 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
8 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
9 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
10 Government Code.

11 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
12 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
13 Environmental Quality.

14 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
15 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
16 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
17 representatives within the required time.

18 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
19 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
20 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
21 and accomplished.

22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
