7	Sec. 411.1406. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY INFORMATION:
8	APPELLATE COURTS. (a) In this section, "appellate court" means
9	the Supreme Court of Texas, the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, or
10	a court of appeals.
11	(b) An appellate court is entitled to obtain from the
12	department criminal history record information maintained by the
13	department that relates to a person who is an applicant for:
14	(1) employment with the court;
15	(2) a volunteer position with the court; or
16	(3) an appointment made by the court.
17	(c) Criminal history record information obtained by the
18	court under Subsection (b) may be used only to evaluate an
19	applicant.
20	(d) The court may not release or disclose information
21	obtained under Subsection (b) except on order of a district court.
22	(e) After the expiration of any probationary term of the
23	person's employment, volunteer status, or appointment, the court
24	shall destroy all criminal history record information obtained

1	under Subsection (b).
2	(f) An appellate court is entitled to obtain from the
3	department criminal history record information maintained by the
4	department that relates to a person who is a volunteer to, or an
5	employee or appointee of, the court.
6	(g) Criminal history record information obtained by the
7	court under Subsection (f) may be used only to evaluate:
8	(1) an employee's employment with the court;
9	(2) a volunteer's volunteer status with the court; or
10	(3) an appointee's appointment by the court.
11	(h) The court may not release or disclose information
12	obtained under Subsection (f) except on order of a district court.
13	(1) A court shall destroy all criminal history record
14	information obtained under Subsection (f) before January 1, 2008.
15	(j) Subsections (f)-(i) and this subsection expire January
16	1, 2008.
17	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
