HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Lance Armstrong concluded his professional cycling 1 career in grand style, capturing his seventh consecutive Tour de 2 500,000 spectators on the of front in 3 France victory Champs-Elysees; and 4 WHEREAS, Relying on the invaluable assistance of 5 teammates, the strategic and tactical mastery of team director 6 Johan Bruyneel, and his own single-minded determination and will to 7 win, Mr. Armstrong wore the yellow jersey for 17 of the Tour's 21 8 grueling stages; overall, he wore the jersey for 82 stages during 9 his brilliant Tour career, second only to the great Belgian cyclist 10 Eddy Merckx, one of his personal heroes and biggest supporters; and 11 WHEREAS, Mr. Armstrong's climb to cycling's precipitous 12 heights has been well documented since his recovery from advanced 13 testicular cancer in the late 1990s, and his incredible success in 14 the world's most demanding sporting event has helped to bring 15 needed attention to the plight of cancer victims and survivors; 16 through the Lance Armstrong Foundation, millions of dollars have 17 been raised to help meet the needs of these individuals and their 18 families, and the establishment of the foundation is a significant 19 part of his legacy; and 20 WHEREAS, This year's Tour victory has put an indelible stamp 21 on what was already the greatest and most inspirational career in 22 professional cycling; after winning the 2004 Tour with yet another 23 and surpassing five-time winners Miquel superhuman effort, 24

- 1 Indurain, Bernard Hinault, Jacques Anquetil, and Merckx, the Texan
- 2 dominated the 2005 event with the help of his Discovery Channel
- 3 teammates; and
- WHEREAS, Opening the race with a second-place finish in the
- 5 prologue, an individual time trial, Mr. Armstrong stepped to the
- 6 podium two stages later as the general classification leader
- 7 following his team's win in the Stage 3 team time trial; over the
- 8 next two weeks, he staved off attacks from several challengers in
- 9 the demanding mountain stages and proudly watched as team members
- 10 George Hincapie and Paolo Salvodelli boosted the team's overall
- 11 ranking with stage victories of their own; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Armstrong sealed his seventh title with a
- 13 dominating performance in Stage 20, a highly technical individual
- 14 time trial that allowed him to demonstrate the breadth of his
- 15 abilities and enabled him to extend his already imposing lead over
- 16 his challengers; his victory left no doubt in the minds of his
- 17 rivals, who could only praise him for his superlative physical
- 18 ability and unparalleled mental toughness, as they look forward to
- 19 next year, when the Tour de France will have a new victor; and
- WHEREAS, With his final win in the 2005 Tour de France, Mr.
- 21 Armstrong has distanced himself from the field, establishing a
- 22 record that will likely never be broken or equaled, and this
- 23 accomplishment, as well as his continuing efforts in support of
- 24 cancer victims and survivors, has made him a hero to countless fans
- 25 throughout the world; now, therefore, be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the 79th Legislature of the State of Texas,
- 27 2nd Called Session, hereby congratulate Lance Armstrong on his

- 1 unprecedented seventh consecutive victory in the Tour de France and
- 2 honor him on his remarkable career in professional cycling; and, be
- 3 it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 5 prepared for Mr. Armstrong as an expression of high regard by the
- 6 Texas House of Representatives and Senate.
