

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the disqualification of certain temporary employees for
3 unemployment compensation benefits.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 201.091, Labor Code, is amended by
6 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

7 (f) For purposes of this subtitle, an individual who last
8 worked for a temporary help firm is not considered to be unemployed
9 until three business days have passed since the date the
10 individual's last assignment ended.

11 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
12 to eligibility for unemployment compensation benefits based on an
13 unemployment compensation claim that is filed with the Texas
14 Workforce Commission on or after the effective date of this Act. A
15 claim filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
16 law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and the former law is
17 continued in effect for that purpose.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
