FEE. (a) The annual state fee for a 17 promotional permit is \$300. 18 (b) A local fee may not be charged for the application or 19 issuance of a promotional permit. 20 Sec. 54.003. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES. The holder of a 21 promotional permit may not hold an interest, directly or indirectly, in a permit or license issued under this code other than 22 23 a contract to promote and enhance the sale of alcoholic beverages as 1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
