5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 62.021, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows:

In each state [Each] fiscal year beginning with the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2008, an eligible institution is entitled to receive an amount allocated in accordance with this section from funds appropriated for that year by Section 17(a), Article VII, Texas Constitution. The comptroller shall distribute funds allocated under this subsection only on presentation of a claim and issuance of a warrant in accordance with Section 403.071, Government Code. The comptroller may not issue a warrant from any funds allocated under this subsection before the delivery of goods described Section services in 17, Article VII, Constitution, except for the payment of principal or interest on bonds or notes or for a payment for a book or other published library material as authorized by Section 2155.386, Government The allocation of funds under this subsection is made in accordance with an equitable formula consisting of the following elements: space deficit, facilities condition, institutional

- 15 Constitution, for each state fiscal year beginning with the state
- 16 fiscal year ending August 31, 2008, the amount of the annual
- 17 constitutional appropriation under that subsection is increased to
- 18 \$262.5 million. Before the state fiscal year ending August 31,
- 19 2008, the amount of the annual constitutional appropriation under
- 20 <u>that subsection is \$175 million.</u>
- SECTION 3. Section 62.027(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- (c) The increase provided by the amendment to Section 62.024
- 24 enacted by the 79th Legislature, Regular Session, 2005, in the
- amount of the appropriation made under Section 17(a), Article VII,
- 26 Texas Constitution, for each state fiscal year beginning with the
- 27 state fiscal year ending August 31, 2008, constitutes the increase

- 1 in accordance with Section 17(a) that the legislature considers
- 2 appropriate for the five-year period [is valid and effective]
- 3 beginning September 1, 2005 [1995].
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 62.021(e), Education Code, is repealed.
- 5 SECTION 5. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- 6 section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
- 7 (b) Sections 2 and 3 of this Act take effect only if this Act
- 8 is approved by a vote of two-thirds of the membership of each house
- 9 of the legislature as required by Section 17(a), Article VII, Texas
- 10 Constitution.
