14	majority vote, appoint and set the salary of the district and county
15	courts administrator. The administrator serves at the will of
16	those judges [local administrative judge shall appoint and set the
17	salary of the administrator. The administrator serves at the
18	pleasure of the local administrative judge.
19	[(c) The administrator shall supervise the court services
20	department and shall perform the duties and functions assigned by
21	the local administrative judge.
22	(d) The administrator shall hire the employees of the court
23	services department subject to the approval of the local
24	administrative judge. The administrator may remove an employee at

- SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 152, Human Resources Code, is amended by adding Sections 152.06331 and 152.06332 to read as follows:
- Sec. 152.06331. DALLAS COUNTY DOMESTIC RELATIONS OFFICE.

  (a) The domestic relations office of Dallas County is established.

  Except to the extent of a conflict with this section, Chapter 203,

  Family Code, applies to the office, and the office has the powers

  and duties of a domestic relations office provided by that chapter.

- (b) The judges of the district courts in Dallas County that give preference to family law matters shall, on a majority vote, appoint the director of the domestic relations office. The director serves at the will of those judges, except that those judges may delegate the decision to terminate the director's appointment to the presiding judge of those judges' courts.
- (c) The judges of the district courts in Dallas County that give preference to family law matters shall, by majority vote, supervise the activities of the director and the domestic relations office, including the office's structure and budget, or those judges may delegate the supervisory duties to the presiding judge of those judges' courts.

- 1 (d) The domestic relations office shall report to the Dallas
- 2 County district and county courts administrator, and the
- 3 administrator shall report to the judges of the district courts in
- 4 Dallas County that give preference to family law matters,
- 5 <u>regarding:</u>
- 6 (1) the domestic relations office's performance of all
- 7 matters relating to family court services or successor services and
- 8 child support collection and administration; and
- 9 (2) all other functions performed by the office.
- 10 (e) The judges of the district courts in Dallas County that
- 11 give preference to family law matters have final authority over

6	ADMINISTRATOR. (a) The criminal district courts administrator is
7	the chief administrative officer of the criminal district courts in
8	Dallas County.
9	(b) The judges of the district courts in Dallas County that
10	give preference to criminal law matters shall, on a majority vote,
11	appoint the criminal district courts administrator. The
12	administrator serves at the will of a majority of those judges,
13	except that those judges may delegate the decision to terminate the
14	administrator's appointment to the presiding judge of those judges'
15	courts.
16	(c) The judges of the district courts in Dallas County that
17	give preference to criminal law matters shall, by majority vote,
18	supervise the activities of the criminal district courts
19	administrator, including the structure of the administrator's
20	office and budget for that office, or those judges may delegate the
21	supervisory duties to the presiding judge of those courts.
22	(d) The criminal district courts administrator shall report
23	to the Dallas County district and county courts administrator, and
24	the district and county courts administrator shall report to the
25	judges of the criminal district courts in Dallas County, regarding
26	all issues related to the criminal district courts.
27	(e) The judges of the district courts that give preference

- 7 prosecutor supplement fund and the fair defense account (Sec.
- 8 41.258, Government Code) . . . \$15, provided the cost does not
- 9 exceed \$30 for all bail bonds posted at that time for an individual
- 10 and the cost is not required on the posting of a personal or cash

- 12 (16) [(19)] appraiser's fee as court costs for
- 13 determining the fair value of ownership interests of owners who
- 14 have perfected their rights (Sec. 10.365, Business Organizations
- 15 Code) . . . a reasonable fee; and
- 16 (17) [(20)] to participate in a court proceeding in
- 17 this state, a nonresident attorney fee for civil legal services to
- 18 the indigent (Sec. 82.0361, Government Code) . . . \$250 except as
- 19 waived or reduced under supreme court rules for representing an
- 20 indigent person.
- SECTION 5. Sections 152.0634 and 152.0635, Human Resources
- 22 Code, are repealed.
- SECTION 6. On October 1, 2005, the Dallas County domestic
- 24 relations office is established and the Dallas County child support
- office and family court services department are abolished.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect October 1, 2005.
