- 7 Sec. 42.003. ADMINISTRATION. (a) Members of the council 8 serve staggered six-year terms, with as near as possible to one-third of the members' terms expiring on February 1 of each 9 10 odd-numbered year. [Each member of the commission shall serve a 11 two-year term as chairman, rotating the service in the order in which the members are listed in Section 42.002. A person may not 12 serve as a member of the commission or act as the general counsel to 13 the commission if the person is required to register as a lobbyist 14 15 under Chapter 305, Government Code, because of the person's 16 activities for compensation on behalf of a profession related to 17 the operation of the commission.
- 18 (b) The commissioner or the commissioner's designee serves
  19 as presiding officer of the council.
- 20 <u>(c)</u> The <u>council</u> [<del>commission</del>] shall meet at least once each year at a time designated by the presiding officer [<del>chairman</del>].
  - [(c) Each member of the commission shall designate a person on his or her staff as a liaison officer to work with commission committees, commission staff, and agencies contracting or consulting with the commission.]
  - (d) Members of the council are not entitled to compensation for service on the council or reimbursement for travel expenses

- incurred by the member while conducting council business. [The
  executive director of the commission shall coordinate the
  operations of the committees and staff personnel and shall oversee
- 4 the work done for the commission by contracting or consulting
- 5 <del>agencies.</del>]

- 6 (e) The <u>commissioner shall provide the council with</u>
  7 <u>necessary staff and resources to administer the program, as</u>
  8 <u>determined by the commissioner. The commissioner may also appoint</u>
  9 <u>or employ consultants or other agents as necessary for the business</u>
  10 <u>of the program.</u>
- 11 (f) The commissioner may [commission shall] adopt rules
  12 necessary to administer this chapter [for commission and committee
  13 proceedings, including rules that prescribe the policies and
  14 procedures to be followed in awarding contracts].
- Sec. 42.004. POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The <u>council</u> [commission] shall <u>administer the program to provide funding for</u> [conduct] surveys, research, and investigations relating to the use of cotton fiber, cottonseed, oilseed products, other products of the cotton plant, wool, mohair, and other textile products.
  - The department [Rules adopted by the commission must require the submission of summaries of research being conducted or previously conducted at institutions of The Texas A & M University System or at The University of Texas at Austin, Texas Tech University, or Texas Woman's University that are similar to proposals submitted to the commission for research funding. The rules must also require the submission of reports of marketing activities of the departments of agriculture and commerce that are

- 1 related to proposals submitted to the commission for research
- 2 funding. To improve coordination and prevent duplication of
- 3 research, the commission shall consider the summaries and reports
- 4 before awarding a contract for research.
- 5 [<del>(c)</del> In performing its functions, the commission] may
- 6 contract with any state [educational] institution of higher
- 7 <u>education</u>, state agency, or federal agricultural agency to perform
- 8 services for the council [commission] or for the use of the
- 9 facilities of the agency. [The commission may compensate the
- 10 contracting agency from money appropriated for the purposes of this
- 11 chapter.
- 12 (c) [(d)] The awarding of program grant funds under this
- 13 chapter [contracts by the commission] is restricted to [contracts
- 14 for surveys, research, or investigations of cotton, cottonseed oil
- or other related oilseed products, wool, mohair, or other related

- 18 [(e) The commission shall give priority in the awarding of

- Sec. 42.008. FINANCES. (a) The council and the department

- 1 [commission] may solicit and accept, for the purposes of this
- 2 chapter, gifts, donations, and grants from public [the United
- 3 States] and [from] private sources, subject only to limitations
- 4 contained in the gift, donation, or grant.
- 5 (b) [The commission shall prepare annually a complete and
- 6 detailed written report accounting for all funds received and
- 7 disbursed by the commission during the preceding fiscal year. The
- 8 annual report must meet the reporting requirements applicable to
- 9 financial reporting provided in the Ceneral Appropriations Act.
- 10 [<del>(c)</del>] Funds appropriated for the purposes of this chapter
- 11 shall be expended at the direction of the council [commission] on
- 12 claims approved by the council [a majority of the commission].
- 13 (c) (d) The total amount of appropriations, exclusive of
- 14 legislative appropriations of gifts from private sources, expended
- or encumbered by the <u>council</u> [commission] for purposes of research
- during a fiscal biennium may not exceed the amount of private gifts,
- 17 donations, or grants to the council [commission] expended or
- 18 encumbered for research during the same period.
- 19 <u>(d)</u> [<del>(e)</del>] All money paid to the <u>council</u> [<del>commission</del>] under
- 20 this chapter is subject to Subchapter F, Chapter 404, Government
- 21 Code.
- 22 SECTION 5. Sections 42.005-42.007 and 42.009-42.011,
- 23 Agriculture Code, are repealed.
- 24 SECTION 6. (a) The Texas Food and Fibers Commission is
- abolished on January 1, 2006. On that date, all contracts, records,
- 26 employees, property, and unspent and unobligated appropriations
- 27 and other funds of the Texas Food and Fibers Commission are

- 1 transferred to the Department of Agriculture for administration of
- 2 the food and fibers research grant program.
- 3 (b) The abolishment of the Texas Food and Fibers Commission
- 4 does not affect the validity of a right, privilege, or obligation
- 5 accrued, a contract or acquisition made, a liability incurred, or
- 6 other action taken by or in connection with the Texas Food and
- 7 Fibers Commission.
- 8 SECTION 7. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 9 of this Act, the commissioner of agriculture shall appoint the
- 10 initial members of the Food and Fibers Research Council, as
- 11 required by Section 42.002, Agriculture Code, as amended by this
- 12 Act. At the first meeting of the initial members of the council,
- 13 the members shall draw lots to determine which four members will
- 14 serve initial two-year terms expiring February 1, 2007, which four
- 15 members will serve initial four-year terms expiring February 1,
- 16 2009, and which four members will serve initial six-year terms
- 17 expiring February 1, 2011.
- SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
