HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life came to a close with the
- 2 death of noted religious and civic leader Dr. Raymond Armstrong of
- 3 Paris on October 29, 2003, at the age of 80; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Dr. Armstrong arrived in Paris in 1972 with his
- 5 beloved wife, Glenelle, to assume the responsibilities of minister
- 6 of First Christian Church; under his able leadership, the
- 7 congregation grew, as did its involvement in community endeavors;
- 8 Dr. Armstrong implemented a capital campaign that resulted in new
- 9 and expanded facilities; even after his retirement, this esteemed
- 10 Texan remained dedicated to the membership, and was serving in his
- 11 15th year as weekend pastor at the time of his death; and
- WHEREAS, In addition to his commitment to his church, Dr.
- 13 Armstrong was highly involved in a host of civic organizations; a
- 14 former president of the Paris Ministerial Alliance, Paris Rotary
- 15 Club, and Lamar County Chamber of Commerce, he served as a
- 16 commissioner of the Paris Housing Authority, as well as a board
- 17 member for the Paris Independent School District, Salvation Army,
- 18 Lamar County Human Resource Council, and Lamar County American
- 19 Heart Association, to name but a few; and
- WHEREAS, After 14 years at First Christian Church, Dr.
- 21 Armstrong served as director of pastoral care and development for
- 22 McCuistion Regional Medical Center, where he conducted three
- 23 capital campaigns and helped establish the McCuistion Endowment; a
- 24 former chair of the Pastoral Care Committee at St. Joseph's

- 1 Hospital, he initiated a volunteer chaplain program at Paris Junior
- 2 College that was adopted by hospitals throughout the region; in
- 3 2002, he retired from foundation duties at Christus St. Joseph's
- 4 Health System, where he had been instrumental in the creation of the
- 5 Paris Regional Health Care Endowment; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Christus St. Joseph's Hospital Foundation named
- 7 a community service award in Dr. Armstrong's honor, and in 2002 he
- 8 and his wife were recognized as "I Love Paris" honorees by the Paris
- 9 Education Foundation; the following year, he was invited to lead
- 10 the opening prayer of the 78th Legislative Session of the Texas
- 11 Senate, a true testament to his status as a respected spiritual
- 12 leader; and
- WHEREAS, Although he is deeply missed, the legacy of
- 14 religious leadership and civic contributions of Raymond Armstrong
- 15 will long resonate in the lives of the people of Paris and Lamar
- 16 County; now, therefore, be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the 79th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 18 hereby pay tribute to the life of Dr. Raymond Armstrong and extend
- 19 sincere sympathy to the members of his family; and, be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 21 prepared for the members of his family and that when the Texas House
- of Representatives and Senate adjourn this day, they do so in memory
- of Dr. Raymond Armstrong.
