2 suffered an immeasurable loss with the death of this beloved young  
3 man in Iraq, on November 7, 2004, at the age of 27; and

4           WHEREAS, A dedicated member of Bravo Company, 2nd Battalion,  
5 14th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade, 10th Mountain Division,  
6 Sergeant Baker was killed while working to keep the peace in a  
7 foreign land; and

8           WHEREAS, This courageous soldier was born September 6, 1977,  
9 in Springville, New York, and graduated from Springville  
10 Griffith-Institute High School in 1996; in his leisure time,  
11 Sergeant Baker enjoyed fishing, playing cards with his friends, and  
12 riding motorcycles; and

13           WHEREAS, Above all else, he was devoted to his wife, Amy, and  
14 children, Coletin, Cadence, and Emily; and

15           WHEREAS, Brian Baker's warm and ever-present smile, his  
16 easygoing nature, and his zest for life endeared him to his family  
17 and to a host of friends, and his thoughtfulness and concern for  
18 others touched many hearts; and

19           WHEREAS, Notwithstanding the hardships that he faced in a war  
20 zone, Sergeant Baker performed his work with pride and  
21 professionalism, his steadfast commitment to his mission made all  
22 the more firm by a strongly felt desire to help the Iraqi people;

24           WHEREAS, Through his unwavering dedication to duty, honor,

1 and this country, Brian Baker embodied the highest ideals of the  
2 armed services, and the blessing of his life will be forever  
3 treasured by those who were privileged to share in the warmth of his  
4 love and friendship; now, therefore, be it

5         RESOLVED, That the 79th Legislature of the State of Texas  
6 hereby honor the life of U.S. Army Sergeant Brian Baker and extend  
7 deepest sympathy to the members of his family: to his wife, Amy  
8 Baker; to his son, Coletin; to his daughters, Cadence and Emily; to  
9 his parents, Greg and Holly Baker; to his brothers, Greg and Jesse  
10 Baker; to his sisters, Jenni and Michelle Baker; to his  
11 father-in-law and mother-in-law, Dusty and Barbie Roach; to his  
12 sister-in-law, Sommer Strong; to his brother-in-law, Ross Roach; to  
13 his grandparents, Evelyn Baker and John and Helen Spengler; and to  
14 his other relatives and many friends; and, be it further
