- 2 life of family physician Dr. Carlos Ramon Saca, who was taken from
- 3 this world on Sunday, May 4, 1997, at the age of 43; and
- WHEREAS, Born on January 29, 1954, in Edinburg, Dr. Saca led a
- 5 life of accomplishment, compassion, generosity, and integrity that
- 6 is seldom achieved even over a much longer period of time; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Inspired by his father, the late Carlos Saca, and
- 8 his mother, Gloria Garza Saca, both of Edinburg, and motivated by
- 9 his determination to make a difference in South Texas, Dr. Saca
- 10 excelled in school at every level, from St. Joseph Catholic School
- 11 in Edinburg to Pan American University, where he graduated summa
- 12 cum laude and placed first in a graduating class of 619; and
- 13 WHEREAS, After he attended and graduated with special
- 14 recognition from The University of Texas Medical School in Houston,
- 15 Dr. Saca performed his internship in the Department of Family
- 16 Practice with The University of Texas at San Antonio Medical School
- in the Bexar County Hospital; and
- WHEREAS, He then returned to his beloved hometown of Edinburg
- 19 and became a partner and associate with Stephens, Meede, Saca, and
- 20 Associates, a busy clinical practice that averaged between 200 and
- 21 300 patient visits per week; and
- WHEREAS, His medical skills and positive interaction with the
- 23 community allowed him to quickly establish his own practice, where
- 24 he attracted some of the most skilled physicians in the area; and

WHEREAS, In addition to his professional success, Dr. Saca also was blessed with a wonderful family life with his wife, Paulette Riggio Saca, who also served as his office manager, and his children, Robert Riggio, Lauren Saca, and James Saca; and

WHEREAS, Diagnosed at age 39 with multiple myeloma, Dr. Carlos Ramon Saca battled the disease for four years; during that time, he participated in what were landmark treatments in the hopes of extending his life and to allow some of the nation's top cancer physicians in Little Rock, Arkansas, to learn more about this fatal disease so that future patients could benefit; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Saca continued treating his own patients in Edinburg despite the tremendous suffering caused by his disease, even making home visits to many of his patients who did not have the ability or resources to come to his medical office; through his own example, he motivated his patients and served as their role model and confidante; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Saca's legacy continues years after his untimely passing, and his memory continues to help many people to aspire to be the kind of man he was; and

WHEREAS, Representative Aaron Peña has paid tribute to the life of Dr. Carlos Ramon Saca by passing this resolution in his honor during the 79th Texas Legislature; now, therefore, be it
