1 WHEREAS, Residents of Panola County are gathering at the 2 State Capitol on February 22, 2005, to celebrate the indelible role 3 their county has played in the history of our great state; and WHEREAS, The First Legislature of Texas officially created 4 5 Panola County on March 30, 1846; Judge John Allison, a prominent 6 civic leader, suggested the name Panola, which is derived from the Cherokee word for cotton, "ponolo"; the region reaped the rewards 7 of its cotton-friendly soil, and it soon became the county's main 8 9 cash crop; today, Panola County enjoys a diversified economy, primarily based in oil and gas, coal, agriculture, and timber; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Located in the Timberlands region of Northeast Texas 12 bordering Louisiana, Panola County has a dense, attractive landscape that consists of more than 800 square miles of gentle 13 plains and scenic woodlands; the county is a desirable destination 14 for visitors who enjoy the splendid benefits of nature and outdoor 15 recreational activities, such as fishing in freshwater lakes; and 16 WHEREAS, The area's historic sites and cultural attractions 17 also draw many visitors to Carthage, the county seat, as well as to 18 19 other charming towns, such as Beckville, Bethany, Clayton, Gary, DeBerry, Pulaski, and Fairplay, the oldest community in the county; 20 Carthage also boasts the Texas Country Music Hall of Fame, the Tex 21 Ritter Museum, and the Jim Reeves Memorial; and 22 WHEREAS, The residents of this historic Texas county have 23 24 played an important part in preserving their region's past, and it
