A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment providing that marriage in
- 2 this state consists only of the union of one man and one woman.
- BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Article I, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 5 adding Section 32 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 32. (a) Marriage in this state shall consist only of
- 7 the union of one man and one woman.
- 8 (b) This state or a political subdivision of this state may
- 9 not create or recognize any legal status identical or similar to
- 10 marriage.
- 11 SECTION 2. This state recognizes that through the
- designation of guardians, the appointment of agents, and the use of
- 13 private contracts, persons may adequately and properly appoint
- 14 guardians and arrange rights relating to hospital visitation,
- 15 property, and the entitlement to proceeds of life insurance
- 16 policies without the existence of any legal status identical or
- 17 similar to marriage.
- SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 19 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2005.
- 20 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 21 proposition: "The constitutional amendment providing that
- 22 marriage in this state consists only of the union of one man and one
- 23 woman and prohibiting this state or a political subdivision of this
- 24 state from creating or recognizing any legal status identical or
