4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 76, Agriculture Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 76.119 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 76.119. DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION RELATING TO PRIVATE
8	PESTICIDE APPLICATOR LICENSE HOLDERS. (a) In this section,
9	"predator control device" means a device that incorporates an
10	active ingredient and is used for the control of livestock
11	predators.
12	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a governmental
13	entity in this state may not disclose:
14	(1) the name, address, or telephone number of a person
15	who holds a private pesticide applicator license issued under this
16	subchapter and is authorized to use a predator control device if
17	disclosure of the person's name, address, or telephone number would
18	reveal that the person:
19	(A) is authorized to use a predator control
20	device;
21	(B) has used a predator control device; or
22	(C) has the intent to use a predator control
23	device;
24	(2) the name, address, or telephone number of the

- 1 owner or operator of land on which a predator control device has
- been used, is being used, or is intended to be used, if disclosure
- 3 of the information would reveal that use or intended use; or
- 4 (3) information identifying the land on which a
- 5 predator control device has been used, is being used, or is intended
- 6 to be used, if disclosure of the information would reveal the name,
- 7 <u>address</u>, or telephone number of the owner or operator of the land.
- 8 (c) A governmental entity may disclose to the following the
- 9 name, address, or telephone number of a person who holds a private
- 10 pesticide applicator license issued under this subchapter, who is
- 11 <u>authorized to use a predator control device</u>, and who either has used
- 12 a predator control device or has the intent to use a predator
- 13 control device:
- 14 (1) a person who holds a pesticide dealer license
- 15 under Section 76.071 and is authorized to distribute predator
- 16 <u>control devices;</u>
- (2) another governmental entity in this state in
- 18 connection with official business;
- 19 (3) the United States Environmental Protection Agency
- 20 under a cooperative agreement entered into with that agency;
- 21 (4) any other agency of the United States that
- 22 provides the governmental entity with an administrative or judicial
- 23 subpoena for the information; or
- 24 (5) the appropriate agency or court in an
- 25 administrative or judicial proceeding in which the private
- 26 <u>pesticide applicator license holder is a defendant.</u>
- 27 (d) A governmental entity and the officers and employees of

- 1 the governmental entity are immune from civil or criminal liability
- 2 for an unintentional violation of this section.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
